

From the desk of the Chief Operating Officer

Ever since I have taken up a central leadership role in Child Help Foundation, it has been a wonderful journey of learning and strengthening the principles and core values that is the essence of what we do to help underprivileged children and empower communities through the power of education. In these two years, there has been a remarkable change in the dynamics of the social sector, and we at Child Help Foundation have had to continuously update our skill sets to adapt to these changes.

Since its inception, Child Help Foundation through its various grassroots level initiatives has impacted the lives of young children from underprivileged backgrounds on a pan-India level. Under our emergency medical programme, we have saved the lives of 210 children afflicted with congenital heart disease and cancer. We have upgraded sanitation facilities in 11 schools across India, benefiting approximately five thousand children, and our advocacy programmes on school sanitation have benefited at least twenty five thousand individuals.

Due to our intervention and support extended to 11 orphanages across India, 630 children have been benefitted and their basic needs like education and primary health care have been addressed. Similarly, our scholarship and individual educational support programmes across all the schools and orphanages we support has positively impacted the lives of approximate thirty thousand children across India and the number keeps growing. The village of Nagosali that CHF adopted is a true model of village development. With inputs from the forestry and agricultural department of the

Maharashtra Government, modern agricultural practices were introduced thus increasing crop yield, simultaneously microfinancing schemes were facilitated and self-help groups with a thrust on skill development and women empowerment were set up to make the villagers self-reliant.

When any natural calamity occurs in any part of India, CHF is among the first NGOs to respond and we have facilitated the distribution of relief materials during the floods and subsequent devastation in the states of Jammu and Kashmir, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Chennai and recently in Assam.

By the year 2020, we hope to work collectively towards our mission to be an equal opportunity provider for the upliftment of underprivileged children by providing them timely education, shelter, food, care & happiness. We thus hope to emerge as the most significant change initiator in the Indian social sector.

We are exceptionally grateful to our individual donors and corporate partners who helped Child Help Foundation usher in positivity in the lives of underprivileged children and collectively spread the message of hope and love to ensure better prospects for their future. Together we have touched the lives of over a hundred thousand children, and the number will keep growing.

Child Help Foundation provided emergency medical support to over 210 children (both boys and girls from underprivileged families)


Child Help Foundation provided scholarships and educational support to 670 boys and girls at various shelter homes across India.



Child Help Foundation imparted coaching in basic computer skills and English language training to over 375 children in 2 Zilla Parishad schools in Tiwri and Rajawali villages in Naigaon East. In addition, we also facilitated English language training courses for 20 children at Phoolwadi and IT village Centre at Rewari in Haryana.



Child Help Foundation facilitated the construction of toilet complexes in various schools across India to improve sanitation and hygiene and increase the enrollment and attendance rates.





Child Help Foundation conducted 24 training sessions for volunteering and fund-raising campaigns in 2015-2016 and trained 200 volunteers for campaign activities.

Child Help Foundation provided calamity relief support to over 2000 families in regions affected by natural calamities in India.

CHF's Emergency Medical Support Programme

There is nothing more precious in this world than a child's smile; however, there are many children in India who suffer constant pain and anxiety due to congenital heart diseases and cancer.

Unfortunately approximately 70% of these children are from BPL families, for whom the cost of treating their child is an impossible dream. Child Help Foundation tries to address this problem by raising funds through our online fund raising campaigns, tele-calling teams and media advertisements. In numerous cases, we have managed to save the precious lives of India's future doyens through our intervention.

However, our intervention does not end here, once the patient is in the recuperation stage we take regular updates about the patient's medical status and the family's financial status. We also examine if our intervention has helped the family stabilise itself financially after their child has been cured. The child's behavioural patterns are also observed, in case he or she needs counselling.

Many children who receive medical support from CHF (especially those afflicted by cancer), take many months and sometimes even years to recover; during this treatment phase many of them are unable to attend school. Due to the extended periods of absence from school and the lack of motivation or financial backing, many of them end up as dropouts. And that is how the entire premise of our Swastha Se Shiksha Programme was born. The idea was to create a model that would provide sustained support to these children. Through our intervention, we ensure that these children are counselled and encouraged to return to school at the earliest in the post-recovery stage.

Some of the young lives that we have successfully saved through our intervention.

Within a year, we hope to raise funds for at least 100 underprivileged children in urgent need of Heart Surgery and 500 underprivileged who need urgent cancer treatment.

CHF's Emergency Medical Support Programme



Mr. Rajendra Pathak, Managing Trustee of Child Help Foundation gave a memento to Mr. Ompraksh Shete, Chief - in Chief Minister's Medical Assistance Cell (Chief Minister Secretariat - Maharashtra) to show CHF's appreciation for his continuous support for our Medical Support Programme.

Nasra Suhail Kuwari, a young widow residing in Maharashtra's power loom capital of Bhiwandi is a caring mother to two daughters. Her younger daughter Alam was diagnosed with a congenital heart disease and had to undergo an emergency open heart surgery. Nasra barely manages to support her family by selling plastic household articles in her locality. Due to an acute paucity of funds and as she had no other means to fund the operation, she approached Child Help Foundation. CHF immediately raised 3,80,000/- for the operation. Alam was successfully operated upon in Seven Hills Hospital Mumbai and has made a complete recovery. Alam is currently studying in the 8th standard and her education has been sponsored under CHF's Swastha Se Shiksha Programme.

Govind Tukaram Chim from Buldhana is a farmer, in the year 2016 his daughter Vaishnavi was diagnosed with a congenital heart defect and required emergency surgical intervention. Govind has to support his family which comprises of 5 members through the proceeds of his very small farm. The subsidised cost of the operation as quoted by our partner hospital HN Reliance (Mumbai) was 300,000/-. CHF raised funds for the surgical procedure and after she made a complete recovery her education was also sponsored under our Swastha Se Shiksha programme. Vaishnavi is currently studying in the 9th standard.

Idayat Phansopkar a court typist from Ratnagiri has two daughters; his elder daughter Heeba was diagnosed with cancer in 2016. The suggested course of treatment was chemotherapy and the total cost of the sessions at Saifee Hospital was Rs 400,000/- It was impossible for Mr. Idayat to raise the funds, CHF funded the cost of her treatment and she has now made a complete recovery.

Children with cancer form a small percentage (<5%) of total cancer patients seen at Tata Memorial Hospital. However they are a very precious lot since, more than 80% of these are completely curable. Additionally, a child cured of cancer can contribute a lot back to the society since she/he has many additional years to live! However, the treatment of childhood cancers is quite intense, prolonged and expensive. Aryan's parents come from disadvantaged family and it was very difficult for them to meet the surgery cost. D M Hospital recommended this family to CHF for help. CHF has released full amount in support of Aryan's surgery.

Current Status: Aryan was operated on 16th Jan 2016 and his health is improving, he has joined school. His parents are grateful to CHF.



It was very difficult for them to meet the surgery cost and so he approached CHF for help. Rohan's surgery was done on 8th Aug 2015 after receiving the full amount from Child Help Foundation.

Current Status:

Rohan's first and healthy birthday was celebrated in February 2016. His parents are happy to have a healthy and active baby.



Education Support Programme:



In India, the quality of education in most government schools has always been deficient. Lack of qualified teachers is another major problem as there has never been a conscious effort to ensure adequate training and refreshers courses for teaching and non-teaching staff.

Children, who study in government schools, are from poor backgrounds; the compulsion to start earning at a young age is a major cause of dropouts, especially in the secondary section; adding to the problem is a complete disregard for sanitation and this makes it a recipe for disaster, most teenage girls prefer to dropout of school due to lack of toilets.

Topics Covered: Self-awareness, Self Esteem, Coping with emotions, Empathy skills, Peer resistance, Critical thinking, Creative Thinking, Decision making, Problem solving, Effective communication skills.

Due to the vernacular nature of the setting, both teachers and students often converse only in the local language, making teaching English a challenge.

There is an urgent need to introduce holistic education in schools. While academics has to be stressed upon, overall development of children is equally important, to ensure that they have the right life-skills to tackle the challenges of life and be a success. Holistic education at the primary school level leads to better self-governance, higher self-esteem, and overall emotional development.

Other than teaching English, which has almost become a pre-requisite for success in any sphere, teaching basic computing and vocational skills is also necessary. Youth in rural India find it very difficult to compete with their urban counterparts in the job market, and learning vocational skills can help them gain employment.

After comprehensive research on a needs assessment (of both industry as well as learners) CHF has created end-to-end solution models for imparting vocational skill training. This fosters employability enhancement for youth in rural areas and fulfills the growing need for skilled manpower across industry sectors in India.


Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Programme:

Water, sanitation, and hygiene are the key indicators of a nation's development. Although India through the years has managed to introduce initiatives at the grassroots level in this regard, a lot more needs to be achieved. Open defecation and lack of clean water are the biggest threats to public health; the former is rampant while the latter is scarce. While most developing countries are struggling to achieve zero-percent open defecation, providing access to clean water is another major challenge.

Almost one billion people do not have access to a toilet at all. In Asia, almost 40% of the population defecates in the open.

In cases where toilets exist, especially in rural communities, toilets are rarely maintained. Excreta leeches into the groundwater and water bodies are thus polluted. In fact, faecal matter is the biggest biological contaminant in poorer countries. In developing countries like India, more than ninety percent of waste water is discharged into rivers, either due to lack of toilets, damaged toilets or lack of effective water treatment plants.

Access to clean toilets, soap, clean water, and a simple washbasin and tap can save 300,000 lives across the world every year. Most schools in rural India, lack separate washroom facilities for girls, thereby deterring attendance among adolescent girls.

More than 60 % of India's population lives in rural India. Ironically, even in villages where sources of water exist, the water is largely polluted and methods for purifying the water are non-existent.

Child Help Foundation facilitates the constructing of school sanitation facilities in government schools and helps in providing clean drinking water to school children.

Health & Nutrition Programme:

in rural India, maternal malnutrition is the primary reason for infant mortality and malnutrition among young children below the age of five due to greater susceptibility to infections. This correlation is most visible in rural communities and BPL families. Scientific evidence has clearly proved that the chronic effects of malnutrition can be reversed by providing nutritional supplements in the first few years of a child's life.

Therefore, to stem the transmission of inter-generational malnutrition, children who are at risk must be attended to with urgency on a pan-India level, as a majority of Indians still live in rural and semi-urban areas.

Children who suffer from malnutrition are always underweight and seldom reach their optimum height;

in addition, it also affects their brains, resulting in lower IQs, delayed enrolment, higher absenteeism and more class repetition.

Through its advocacy and awareness programmes, Child Help Foundations hopes to raise the level of awareness and with the help of institutional providers, donors, and the general public, we hope to intervene and help children suffering from malnutrition on a pan-India level

We also facilitate the provision of health kits and nutritional supplements for HIV+ afflicted children of Desire Society Shelter Home (Pan-India).

Village Development Programme:

A majority of Indians live in the numerous villages scattered across India; however, this very segment of our population that can be the most productive (considering the sheer volume of available manpower) are deprived of the opportunity to enhance the nation's productivity.

Despite the juggernaut of Industrialisation and the fact that India is one of the fastest growing economies, it is primarily an agrarian nation.

Our villages should be symbols of empowerment; progress should originate from these rural Xanadus and then proliferate through the country. Unfortunately, only the trickle-down effect of India's economic robustness makes inroads into these villages.

The prerequisites to change this situation are objectivity, transparency, conviction, commitment and funding.

Child Help Foundation conducts baseline surveys to identify those villages where our intervention is required on an urgent basis.

We convene community meetings in villages that are identified, and ascertain their needs through Participatory rural appraisals. We then depute our volunteers to these villages to categorize the available resources as well as identify the lacking infrastructure that can be upgraded through our intervention. We then create a working strategy before sharing the Development Plan (DP). We encourage the villagers to create a committee for monitoring the developmental plan; this ensures the participation of prominent members of the village in the decision making process.




