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Preface

2017-2018 has proved to be a milestone in our commitment to be recognised internationally as an organisation that is renowned for its commitment to children, their needs and their fundamental rights. It has simultaneously served as a stepping stone for larger interventions in the social sector.

This is our eighth year of existence, and we have grown exponentially thanks to our team, our partners and our volunteers, the latter unquestionably being our greatest strength. The journey has been tumultuous, but we had faith in our abilities to design programmes that could benefit children from underprivileged communities, who did not have access to acceptable standards of education, healthcare, sanitation, hygiene and potable water.

Measuring and defining success is not easy in the social sector; our ultimate aim is to create self-sufficient communities that can prosper without external aid in the long run. Education is the key to this transformation, followed by sanitation.

In 2017-2018 we have also extended our Health and Nutrition Programme to cater to the reproductive health of adolescent girls in schools that we support.

This programme was launched with the blessings of Mrs. Amruta Devendra Fadnavis in the predominantly tribal intermediate-level panchayat of Jawhar in Palghar District. The aim was to increase awareness of correct menstrual hygiene practices and simultaneously facilitate the distribution of free sanitary napkins to underprivileged tribal girls studying in the various government schools in the area. We have extended the area of impact to include all the Zilla Parishad schools that we support in Maharashtra.

We derive great satisfaction from the fact that we have successfully managed to positively transform the lives of thousands of children from these communities in India; however, we also realise that a lot more needs to be done and by 2020, we hope to be emerge as the most credible non-profit organisation in the child welfare sector.

Our core focus areas are education support, critical medical care support for children from underprivileged families, orphanage support, village development programmes, health and nutrition programmes, WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) programmes, impact assessments and surveys, skill development programmes, emergency calamity relief, and campaign and volunteer programmes.

As we grow we will certainly be able to support more programmes and positively impact a larger number of children. Our dream is to erase the scourge of child illiteracy and ensure that every child in India has access to quality healthcare, basic sanitation and potable water.

Trustees Point of View:

Since the year 2010 Child Help Foundation has provided emergency medical support to 406 children (both boys and girls from underprivileged families)

Child Help Foundation provided scholarships and educational support to 792 boys and girls at various shelter homes across India.

Child Help Foundation imparted coaching in basic computer skills and spoken and written English to over 375 children in 2 Zilla Parishad schools in Tiwri and Rajawali villages in Naigaon East. We also facilitated English language training courses for 20 children at Phoolwadi and IT village Centre at Rewari in Haryana.

The Lords Academy in Mysore Karnataka is a rural school with student strength of 50. This school caters to underprivileged children and is funded and run by Child Help Foundation.

Child Help Foundation conducted 30 training sessions for volunteering and fund-raising campaigns in 2017-2018 and trained 300 volunteers for campaign activities.

Child Help Foundation provided humanitarian relief support to over 15000 families in regions affected by natural calamities like floods in India.

Child Help Foundation participated in various events, exhibitions, conferences, marathons, cyclothons, campaigns and other important social meets to take CHF to the next level in serving and caring for underprivileged children throughout India.

There is nothing more precious in this world than a child's smile; however, there are many children in India who suffer constant pain and anxiety due to congenital heart diseases and cancer.

Unfortunately approximately 70% of these children are from BPL families, for whom the cost of treating their child is an impossible dream. Child Help Foundation addresses this by raising funds and sponsoring the treatment of these children.

However, our intervention does not end here, many of these children, especially those afflicted by cancer, take many months and sometimes even years to recover; and during this treatment phase, many of them are unable to attend school.

Due to the extended periods of absence from school and the lack of motivation or financial backing, many of them end up as dropouts.

Through our intervention we ensure that once they recover, they are counselled and encouraged to return to school. In addition, their school admission is secured in our affiliate schools and they are provided with scholarships. This ensures that their future prospects do not suffer and they can be successfully integrated with mainstream society.

By 2020, CHF will strive to fund the treatment of 200 underprivileged children who require heart surgery and 500 underprivileged children who need cancer treatment in addition to other critical cases like kidney transplants, respiratory defects, NICU/PICU cases and Cochlear implants. There are many children in India who suffer constant pain and anxiety due to congenital heart diseases and cancer. Approximately 70% of these children are from disadvantaged families, In numerous cases, Child Help Foundation has managed to save precious lives through its intervention.

With no alternative source of income, raising money for a surgery which would cost Rs. 3,10,000 was an impossible dream. The case was referred to Child Help Foundation by the Medical Social Cell of Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, New Delhi. Considering the urgency of the case, as any delay would have resulted in acute complications that could result in mortality, CHF intervened and raised the requisite amount. Mater Amit Kumar has been successfully

operated upon and is expected to make a complete recovery.

Baby Yogita Sonawane



Ever since her birth, two month old baby Yogita suffered from acute palpations and swelling of the chest. A local physician in their hometown in Jalgaon, Maharashtra

recommended a routine echocardiography, which revealed a heart abnormality. Fortunately the congenital heart disease was detected early and the chances of baby Yogita's complete recovery were very high. However, the Large VSD closure surgery that was estimated to cost Rs. 3, 25,000/- was prohibitively high for the family to afford.

The baby's father Bhagwat is a farmer and the income from selling agricultural produce was barely sufficient to support a family of five. Desperate to save their child, the family tried their very best to raise the requisite funds, but were unable to do so, and hope turned into anguish.

A good Samaritan advised them to approach Child Help Foundation. Realising the urgency of the case and the fact that this young child had her entire life ahead of her, **CHF** immediately intervened and raised the requisite funds for the surgery. The

baby was successfully operated upon in Wockhardt Hospital Mumbai by Dr. Suresh Joshi and his team and is expected to make a complete recovery in a few months.

Baby Kavya Raut

Seven month old Kavya Raut suffered from a congenital liver disease due to Biliary Artesia; to correct the defect, a Kasai surgery was performed which was unsuccessful and only an immediate liver transplant could save the young child's life. The mother readily agreed to donate a part of her liver; however, the cost of the liver transplant surgery, which was scheduled to be performed at Wockhardt Hospital in Mumbai was Rs.



19,50,000/ which the family was unable to raise.

Kavya's father Vivek works as a painter in an idol making workshop and his mother is a house wife. With his meager income, Vivek is barely able to support his family of four; it was thus impossible for him to afford the transplant

surgery. The social cell of Wockhardt Hospital, Mumbai approached Child Help

Foundation for help and the required funds were raised through online and offline campaigns. Kavya was successfully operated upon and is expected to recover completely over the next few months.



Education Support Programme

Education is a fundamental human right enshrined in several international and national protocols, conventions and treaties and needs to be observed and exercised with the utmost commitment. The efforts being made by the government of India to ensure universal basic education are praiseworthy, but a lot more still needs to be done to ensure inclusive education for all in order to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals with regard to Education.

Enhancing elementary education is the key to initiating reform in rural communities. The mere presence of a school is not enough; the focus has to shift from infrastructure building and capacity building to improving retention rates and enrollment rates and improving the quality of instruction.

Child Help Foundation aspires that no child should be compelled to dropout of school due to financial problems and that every child should have access to holistic education.

The idea is to inspire the community by advocating the importance of education and how it can make a significant positive impact in the lives of the villagers in the long run. This will encourage the villagers to send their children to school

and a lot of students who have dropped out can thus be encouraged to return to formal education.

In tribal communities there is a reluctance to send girls to school. There are many reasons for this, while rural poverty has a major role to play, inherent biases in Indian society are partially to blame. Social factors such as early marriage and preference of boys over girls have largely limited girls' access to education. Traditional gender norms push girls into helping with household chores and sibling care. Other factors that have compounded the problem include outmoded customs, lack of schools in some rural areas, and a high level of ignorance on the importance of girl child education.

Due to the vernacular nature of the village schools, both teachers and students often converse only in the local language, making teaching English a challenge. Therefore the intention is to provide trained English teachers and community mobilizers (from the community) to improve the standards of written and spoken English. This will also include basic computer training for the students.

The objective of this programme is to ensure the development of each and every student's intellectual, emotional, social, physical, artistic, creative and spiritual potential. Through this programme, we aspire to provide a framework that will enable schools to function more efficiently. The focus is on facilitating holistic education for children studying in Government schools.

Through our advocacy programmes, we spread awareness among communities, so that the enrolment and attendance of children (especially of female students) increases. Through this project, we create equal opportunities for both male and female students by imparting holistic education, life-skills, and vocational training.

Since 2013 our Education Support and Scholarship Support Programme has benefitted 104670 underprivileged students. We support 8 schools across India.

School Advocacy and Awareness Programme

Child Help Foundation launched a child-for-child programme in 2017. Through this programme we create a bridge between privileged children and disadvantaged children in our society.

CHF teams approach school principals and teachers and with their permission, we conduct awareness and motivation sessions during the morning assembly, where we inculcate the values of compassion towards disadvantaged children in these young minds.

We have conducted these sessions in the following states: West Bengal, Bihar, Orissa, Chhattisgarh, Sikkim, Assam, Nagaland, Manipur, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and the Andaman Islands.

In the Eastern Region we have reached out to 1774 schools, sensitized 187 schools till date with a total student strength 2,68,300. Through our various volunteering efforts we have reached out to 32,19,600 individuals in Eastern India.





Water Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH):

Water, sanitation, and hygiene are the key indicators of a nation's development. Open defecation and lack of potable water are the biggest threats to public health in India. While most developing countries are struggling to achieve zeropercent open rural defecation, providing access to clean water is another major challenge as there is a corelation between sanitation and potable water.

In the Indian context, the biggest challenge is the rapid explosion of population. As per the most recent Swachhta Status Report of the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) in 2015, more than half of the rural population (52.1%) in India still defecates in open. In the rare case where toilets exist, especially in rural communities, toilets are rarely maintained. Excreta leeches into the groundwater and water bodies are polluted. In fact, faecal matter is the biggest biological contaminant in developing countries. In India, more than ninety percent of wastewater is discharged into rivers, either due to lack of toilets, damaged toilets or lack of effective water treatment plants.

Access to improved sanitation and potable water can save thousands of lives in India every year. Child Help Foundation's WASH initiatives are aligned with the UN's Sustainable Development Goals and the National "Swacha Bharat Abiyan." By 2020 we aim to construct 10,000 toilets in schools

Through our Sanitation Support Programmes we have facilitated the construction of separate toilets for boys and girls in government schools across India and we have noticed a significant increase in enrolment rates and a drastic reduction in dropout rates among teenage school girls.

Improved sanitation and clean drinking water can improve the health of millions of Indians living in rural India, and we hope to do our bit with assistance from our corporate partners.

Menstrual Hygiene Programme

The menstrual cycle which is an inevitable biological process is unfortunately still considered taboo in Indian society and this prevents many young girls on the threshold of puberty from learning about their bodies and discussing issues related to it. Due to this mindset, which is inculcated in them from their childhood, hygiene management during menstruation is misunderstood and the standard practices which are ignored, sometimes result in adverse health outcomes. If menstrual hygiene is not given importance, it raises the risk of reproductive tract infections and also affects fertility in the future. Motivation plays a very important role in the adoption of hygienic practices during the menstrual cycle.

Even today, in many parts of our country, girls are not allowed into kitchens, temples, etc. Through advocacy sessions on

menstrual hygiene, Child Help Foundation curbs the myths and misconceptions regarding the menstrual cycle and spreads the correct message of hygiene among communities. This ensures that prepubescent girls have the right answers to all their intimate questions and thus they do not have to suffer the consequences of poor menstrual hygiene. CHF's ongoing Menstrual Hygiene Programme has benefitted 3000 girls in 13 schools in Palghar District of Maharashtra.

Health, Hygiene and Nutrition Programme

In India, infant mortality and malnutrition among young children below the age of five is due to greater susceptibility to infections. This correlation is most visible in rural communities and BPL families. Scientific evidence has clearly proved that the chronic effects of malnutrition can be reversed by providing nutritional supplements in the first few years of a child's life. Therefore, to stem the transmission of intergenerational malnutrition, children who are at risk must be attended to with urgency and on a pan-India level, as a majority of Indians still live in rural and semi-urban areas. However, we have to remember that healthy mothers give birth to healthy children, and thus maternal malnutrition has to be tackled on a war footing to ensure that the next generation does not suffer malnutrition.

Children who suffer from malnutrition are always underweight and seldom reach their optimum height; in addition, it also affects their brains, resulting in lower IQs, delayed enrollment, higher absenteeism and more class repetition.

Our ongoing programme to reduce child malnutrition is currently run from two centres in Jawhar Taluka in

Sawarpada and Handipada villages. Jawhar is just 107 km from Mumbai - Maharashtra's capital city and economic powerhouse. It is rather surprising that despite this proximity, over 600 children have died due to malnutrition this year; and this number keeps rising. The talukas of Jawhar and Mokhada in Palghar district are the worst affected with almost 900 malnourished children. In 2016, a RTI document revealed that 17,000 women and children have died due to malnutrition in the tribal districts across Maharashtra.

In Jawhar and Mokhada talukas the underlying cause of maternal malnutrition is child marriage. Due to archaic cultural practices girls as young as 13 get married. The healthcare facilities in Jawhar are either non-existent or skeletal. Specialist doctors do not want to practise in rural areas, and this only adds to the problem.

The main hurdle in improving the living conditions for women in children in these areas is increasing the level of awareness in a community that is largely uneducated and thus resistant to change.

Village & Skill Development Programme:

A majority of Indians live in the numerous villages scattered across India; however, only the trickledown effect of India's economic robustness makes inroads into these villages and that too happens only occasionally. Usually, women and youth in India's villages are never provided with adequate job skills training to make them self-reliant.

Child Help Foundation has adopted Nagosali village near Nashik District and has successfully managed to create a model village. Through our advocacy programmes, we have managed to create an equitable society in Nagosli. We have facilitated the creation of Self Help Groups for women in Nagosli, which has made them financially independent. Child Help Foundation also organised health check up and eye check up camps in Nagosali.

In rural communities, micro-finance is necessary to usher in prosperity, both for agricultural development and to support the introduction of small-scale industries. We helped the villagers secure documentation and became the intermediaries between them and the Union Bank (Ghoti Branch) so that they could open accounts and avail loans. We also set up a tailoring school for women in the village and are now in the process of introducing many more skill development courses for both males and females. We have recently collaborated with Nashik Run Foundation and have installed an RO plant in Nagosali.

> Our aim is to create selfsustaianble villages across India. Our intervention in Nagosali has benefitted 1067 individuals.

The Need for Skill Development/ Vocational Skill Training:

While there has been a significant increase in the population of Indian youth between the ages of 15 and 24, the opportunities for employment have reduced drastically. The World Development Indicators of the World Bank imply that in India, only one in three youth are employed. Compared to 1991, when economic reforms were initiated in India, there has been a decline of almost 15% in youth employment rates. India's youth employment rate is also far lower than the 41% global average.

This project is aimed at providing the targeted youth in rural India with overall emotional and financial support both in their need to develop and refine their skill sets with qualitative education, and to reduce the percentage of school dropouts. This will pave their path for a bright future and help them make a correct career choice. Ensuring that the students become computer literate is also a part of this process, as is the necessity of making them competent and eligible candidates in the society at large.

Ensuring the employability of unprivileged school dropouts (especially among the youth) is an important concern and challenge both for our Government as well as civil society. After comprehensive research on a needs assessment (of both industry as well as learners), an end-to-end solution model can be created for imparting such vocational skill training.

The project will foster employability enhancement and vocational skills to children in rural areas and work towards their holistic development. In the process, this will also contribute towards fulfilling the growing need for skilled manpower across industry sectors in India.

Calamity Relief Programme:

Whenever any natural calamity strikes, children and women are the worst affected as they are the most vulnerable. During calamities Child Help Foundation intervenes and through crowd funding raises both in-kind support and funds for flood relief, the former is distributed in the affected areas by our dedicated volunteers.

The focus in the response phase is keeping people safe and meeting their basic needs like food, potable water and shelter until more permanent and sustainable solutions can be found. Although the main responsibility to address these needs and respond to a disaster lies with the government in whose territory the disaster has occurred, humanitarian organizations have a major role to play and work alongside emergency response teams.

In the past, Child Help Foundation has distributed emergency relief material during the following natural calamities: The Assam floods that occurred in 2017 – 2018 and the Uttarakhand Floods in 2014-2015. In lieu of the current devastation in Kerala in July-August 2018, Child Help Foundation has opened 8 temporary flood relief camps to distribute flood relief material to people affected by the large scale devastation. After the rescue and relief work is completed, we will start the process of facilitating the rehabilitation of flood affected families through corporate partnerships.

Our Calamity Relief Programme has directly benefitted a total of 14000 people in Kerala, Uttarakhand and Assam.



संस्थेचे उद्दिष्टच पुळी लहान मुले असून त्यांच्या अन्न, वस्त्र, निवास, शिक्षण, आरोग्य या मूलभूत गरजा भागवणे आणि त्यांचा भावनिक तसेच सर्वांगीण विकास साधत त्यांच्या जीवनात जगण्यासाठीचा आशेचा किरण निर्माण करणे हे असून त्या दिशेनेच संस्थेची वाटचाल सुरू आहे.

शिक्षणाशिवाय सर्वेच व्यर्थ आहे. त्यामुळे मुलांग किमान प्राथमिक शिक्षण तरी मिळेल यासाठी संस्थेचा प्रयत्न असतो. यासाठी गरजू मुलांना शिक्षणासाठी आर्थिक मदत संस्थेक डून केली जाते. मुलांना शिक्षण देणाऱ्या अनेक सेवाभावी संस्था काम करत असतात, परंतु या संस्थांना कमतरता असते ती निधीची. चाईल्ड हेल्प फाऊंडे शन ही कमतरता भरून काढते. अशा संस्थांमधील मुलांचा शैक्षणिक शुल्काचा भार ही संस्था उचलते. आतापर्यंत ४६५० मुलांना या संस्थेचा बेट लाभ मिळाला आहे. याशिबाय मुलांनी शिक्षण घ्यावे यासाठी त्यांना आणि विशेषकरून मुलींना प्रोत्साहन देण्याचे काम संख्या करत आहे.

पालघर जिल्ह्यातील जिल्हा परिपदेव्या अनेक शाळांशी ही संस्था जोडली मेली आहे, तसेच जवतर भाषातील आदिवासी मुलांच्या कुपोपणावरही संस्था काम करत आहे. या ठिकाणी संस्थेने स्वतत्त्व कुपोषित मुलांसाठी केंद्र स्थापन केले आहे, तसेच या भागातील ३० आश्रमशाळांना संस्था आपल्या परीने मदत देत आहे.

वंचित मुलांचा आधारवड

मुलांच्या आरोम्य क्षेत्रातही संस्थेचे भरीव योगदान आहे. हृदयाशी संबंधित आजार, कर्करोग, तसेच विविध गंभीर आजार असलेल्या मुलांना वैद्यकीय सेवा मिळवून देण्याची संस्थेची घडपड असते. राज्य सरकारने सुरू केलेल्या मुख्यंमंत्री बैद्यकीय सेवा निधी योजनेत्ता भोठी मदत संस्थेला मिळत आहे. या योजनेतून अनेक रुण्यदेखील संस्थेकडे पाठवण्यात येत असतात. संस्थेने आतापर्यंत हृदयरोगाशी संबंधित ७५ आणि २४९ कर्करोगाशी संबंधित मुलांना वैद्यकीय आधार मिळवून दिला आहे.


