Preface

Child Help Foundation (CHF) is a pan-India non-profit organization dedicated to empowering marginalized and underprivileged communities, with a steadfast focus on children's health, education, gender equality, and holistic well-being.

For over 14 years, CHF has been a beacon of hope for vulnerable families across India-delivering humanitarian aid, healthcare, nutrition, and education through a compassionate, integrated approach. Each initiative is driven by one vision: to create a world where every child thrives with dignity, opportunity, and hope.

In the field of education, CHF has transformed learning by establishing Mini Science Centres (MSCs) in Ashram Schools across Maharashtra's Palghar district. These centers make science and mathematics engaging and accessible through interactive models, nurturing curiosity and strengthening STEM learning.

Expanding its digital reach, CHF has also set up computer labs in schools such as the Central Primary School (Marathi Medium) in Amboli, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, and Tailika Balika Vidyalaya in Barbigha, Bihar. These labs equip students with essential digital skills, helping bridge the technology divide and prepare them for a rapidly evolving world.

Beyond academics, CHF is deeply committed to children's health and safety. Through free school health screenings, health camps, nutrition drives, and awareness programs, CHF ensures early detection, timely intervention, and holistic care-so no child's learning journey is hindered by illness.

Promoting gender equality and child protection is another cornerstone of CHF's mission. The foundation regularly conducts gender sensitization sessions, along with POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) and POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) awareness programs across India. These sessions empower children, teachers, and communities to build safer, more inclusive spaces that uphold dignity and respect for all.

To date, CHF has positively impacted the lives of over 51 lakh people across India-uplifting communities, restoring hope, and paving the way for a more equitable future. Guided by the belief that every child deserves the chance to realize their full potential, Child Help Foundation continues to stand as a symbol of compassion, change, and resilience.

Restoring Childhood, Rebuilding Futures

The year 2024–25 marked a significant milestone in Child Help Foundation's unwavering journey towards building a nation where every child is assured of a protected, empowered, and dignified childhood. Anchored in the belief that every child deserves a life of opportunity and hope, this year's theme, "Restoring Childhood, Rebuilding Futures," reflects our resolute commitment to alleviating immediate suffering and sowing the seeds of long-term transformation.

This year, CHF reached 3,90,871 children and families through our multi-dimensional interventions. From supporting critical medical emergencies to enhancing learning environments for underprivileged children, our actions were focused on restoring what many children had lost: safety, health, stability, and access to opportunities, and rebuilding pathways that lead to a brighter, more secure future. We have stayed committed to a dual approach: healing the present and strengthening the future.

Our efforts were particularly impactful in: Climate Action and Crisis Response: CHF provided emergency medical support, disaster relief, and psychosocial care to children affected critical illnesses or natural disasters. Environmental Stewardship (SDGs 14 and 15) was reflected through beach clean-ups, tree plantations, and animal welfare projects, while humanitarian relief efforts (SDGs 11, 13, and 17) provided urgent support to communities in crisis.

Bridging Gaps in Education and Health: Through our education and health verticals, 26,422 children accessed learning opportunities, and 424 received preventive or curative healthcare. Our Baby Feeding Centres served over 1,10,521 beneficiaries, ensuring nourishment for the youngest and most marginalized. The distribution of baby sleep sacks and awareness campaigns on maternal and child health underscored our holistic approach to well-being. We conducted vital awareness sessions on child safety (POCSO) and digital wellness, equipping young minds with the tools to thrive in a rapidly evolving world. Infrastructure enhancements, including renovated schools and STEM labs, laid the groundwork for sustainable learning environments.

Tackling Hunger and Malnutrition: We delivered over 26,365 nutritious meals, helping children grow with strength and dignity.


WASH: With a strong emphasis on clean water, hygiene, sanitation, and menstrual health, our programs reached 5,811 beneficiaries, with a particular focus on adolescent girls.

Gender Equality: remained a cornerstone of our efforts, with 150,939 individuals benefiting from POSH training sessions, leadership programs, and advocacy campaigns against gender-based discrimination. Our collaborations with corporations, educational institutions, and grassroots organizations amplified our impact, fostering safer and more inclusive spaces for women and girls.

It's not just about what we give, but what we help restore. 





Baby Feeding Centres (BFCs) are not just facilities for mothers to feed their babies, but also a step towards making public spaces more accessible and inclusive for nursing mothers. The primary aim of these centres is to provide a safe and comfortable haven for breastfeeding, addressing the stigma that often surrounds public breastfeeding in India and many other parts of the world. Due to limited options, mothers are often left with no choice but to breastfeed in uncomfortable conditions. BFCs are thoughtfully designed with cushions, sofas, and ceiling fans to ensure comfort for both mother and child.

In the financial year 2024-25, eight new Baby Feeding Centres (BFCs) were established at Majestic, Yeshwantpur, Kengeri Bus Terminal, and Baiyappanahalli Metro Stations in Bengaluru; Puri Railway Station in Odisha; Shornur in Kerala; Civil Hospital, Gurugram; and Taluk Government Hospital, Bengaluru. With these additions, a total of 31 BFCs are now operational across India.

To further promote the use of these centres, Child Help Foundation (CHF) organised Street Play Awareness Programmes at Palghar and Boisar Railway Stations. CHF interns performed an engaging street play on maternal and child health, spreading awareness about the importance of Baby Feeding Centres in supporting mothers and infants.

Home for BMT - Case Summaries

In a city as expensive as Mumbai, most underprivileged families cannot afford the financial burden of travel and accommodation during medical treatment. To address this challenge, Home for BMT provides residential support in Bhayandar for major paediatric patients undergoing treatment at Kokilaben Dhirubhai Ambani Hospital and Medical Research Institute. The facility offers lodging for patients, their families, and donors, along with round-the-clock support staff, a doctor-prescribed diet, tuition classes, recreational activities, and post-transplant care.

Home for BMT's significance was demonstrated when its first patient, Aarav Kumar, successfully underwent a Bone Marrow Transplant (BMT) for Thalassaemia. After discharge, he continued his observation period while residing at the facility. By easing the burden of accommodation and related expenses, the initiative ensures equitable access to healthcare for children from remote regions who would otherwise struggle to reach treatment centres in Mumbai.

Between April 2024 and March 2025, Home for BMT, an initiative of Child Help Foundation (CHF), supported 24 children and their families, offering safe accommodation, emotional support, and access to healthcare during critical treatment phases. In addition to residential care, the initiative promoted awareness and community engagement. An awareness session on Thalassaemia, conducted by CHF volunteers with the assistance of interns from Bengaluru, Vadodara, and Mumbai, benefited more than 70 participants. A Children's Day celebration was also organised for 24 children undergoing or recovering from treatment, featuring drawing, painting, games, and dance, with sweets and gifts distributed to uplift spirits.

Home for BMT further fostered emotional wellness and unity by celebrating Independence Day with a painting competition, cultural performances by patients and staff, and fruit distribution. Through comprehensive residential and supportive care, Home for BMT continues to stand as a life-saving option for families from remote areas, promoting health equity and improved treatment adherence.

TB Awareness under Pradhanmantri TB Mukt **Bharat Abhiyaan** Mumbai, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation (CHF) organised a series of initiatives to raise awareness and support patients under the Pradhanmantri TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan. A "Wish Tree" activity was held at Chennai, where residents shared heartfelt messages promoting solidarity and education on TB prevention. The initiative reflected a strong commitment to public health through creative community engagement.

In collaboration with Filaantro, the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP), and Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), a Nutrition Kit Distribution Drive was conducted in Mumbai under the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukt Bharat Yojana. Mr. Mahindra Patil, Product Marketing Managers (PMM), Mulund, attended the event, where TB-affected patients received nutrition kits containing rice, flour, groundnuts, oil, and other essentials to aid recovery. This initiative marked the expansion of monthly nutrition support into Mumbai to strengthen efforts for a TB-free India.

Additionally, monthly nutrition kit drives were organised at the TB Hospital in Mulund, Maharashtra. Forty financially vulnerable TB patients from both government and private hospitals were provided with protein-rich ration kits. The hospital identified and invited eligible patients, ensuring that the support reached those most affected by the high costs of treatment and low household income. These kits aimed to improve nutrition, thereby contributing to better treatment outcomes and recovery.









Reproductive Health Awareness Sessions

Pan India

On the occasion of International Women's Day, Child Help Foundation (CHF) organised a sanitary pad distribution drive for underserved women and girls, promoting menstrual hygiene and dignity.

With CSR support from Samata Equal Footing, a women's health and nutrition awareness session was conducted in Gorthan village, Palghar, Maharashtra. The session, led by Adolescent Reproductive & Sexual Health (ARSH) experts, focused on reproductive health and key nutrition practices. Additional concerns related to education and water were also addressed. Women and girls participated, expressing appreciation and requesting more such initiatives in the future.

In collaboration with CSR partner Rentokil Initial, a Menstrual Hygiene Awareness session was organised in Mumbai Suburban. The session educated participants on menstrual health, hygiene practices, and the importance of breaking taboos. Sanitary pads were distributed to all attendees, benefiting women and girls. The initiative helped raise awareness while promoting health and dignity.






Utility Table Support

Digital Learning

Bihar & Silvassa

Child Help Foundation (CHF), with support from National Fertilizers Limited (NFL), inaugurated computer labs at Madhya Vidyalaya Samas and Madhya Vidyalaya Lodipur in Barbigha, Bihar. Each lab is equipped with computers, furnished workstations, and trained instructors, with three dedicated teachers conducting regular digital-skills sessions-benefiting students, especially girls, and building on the earlier success at Tailik Balika High School.Additionally, under the Digital Skills Program sponsored by Dorf Ketal, CHF opened a Digital Learning Centre at Centre Primary Marathi School, Silvassa. The centre provides laptops, internet access, a projector, and AC seating, along with a dedicated instructor, helping bridge the digital divide in underserved communities.





Centre for Excellence

Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with Servier India Pvt. Ltd., launched the Centre for Excellence project at Bhopoli Ashram Shala and Sakhare Ashram Shala, Jawhar Block, Palghar, providing extra coaching in Mathematics, Science, and English to students from Classes 8 to 10. The programme covered key topics such as quadratic equations, statistics, refraction, and space missions, along with educational resources that enhanced academic performance and student confidence. CHF, together with Borosil and support from MGA Lifestyle, Kolkata, also implemented a boys' toilet project for Classes 11-12, promoting health and hygiene. Discussions focused on reducing dropout rates and potential collaboration with Servier India through National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) to support continued education and holistic development of students.





STEM Lab and Mini Science Centres

Child Help Foundation (CHF), with CSR support from Samata Equal Footing Foundation, National Fertilizers Limited (NFL), Skypath Solutions India Pvt. Ltd., and the Goa CSR Authority, has launched impactful initiatives to strengthen STEM education in tribal and rural schools. In Palghar district, 10 Mini Science Centres (MSCs) were set up in Government and Aided Ashram Schools, each equipped with 84 hands-on science and math models. A two-day training for 12 teachers by experts from the Vikram A. Sarabhai Community Science Centre ensured effective use, benefiting over 4,800 students. Similar efforts with NFL established MSCs at M.S. Maur and M.S. Koyaribigha schools, supported by a dedicated science coordinator. In Goa, a pilot STEM Lab at Government High School, Tharmatha Bhile, Surla, features 46 models and 12 charts, with training for 120 teachers and students. A formal inauguration by the Chief Minister is planned. These initiatives promote inquirybased learning and better academic outcomes.

Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH)

As part of the ARSH (Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health) Life Skills Project, Child Help Foundation (CHF) implemented community-based initiatives through Kishori Manch groups across schools and villages in Palghar. Activities included tree plantation drives, cleanliness drives, Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) and Good Touch-Bad Touch awareness sessions, as well as creative competitions like rangoli and postermaking to foster adolescent participation. Kishori Conclaves and micro-conclaves featured cultural performances, skits, speeches, and interactive sessions, engaging community stakeholders such as Sarpanchs, ASHA and ICDS workers, teachers, and school heads. The project was highlighted at a CSR Conclave in Dadar, where Kishoris were felicitated and CHF received an Award of Appreciation. These initiatives strengthened life skills, leadership, and community engagement, creating a foundation for long-term social impact.

In 2024–25, Child Help Foundation (CHF) supported seven Child Care Institutions (CCIs) across India, focusing on education, health, cultural enrichment, and emotional well-being.

At Koel Saraswati Sishu Vidyalaya, Rourkela, children received stationery kits and participated in sports, essay writing, and school picnics. At Khirod Basini Kanyashram, Angul, tribal girls benefited from remedial education and life-skills training, while dry rations supported residents. CHF initiates regular cleanliness drives and hygiene monitoring, promoting a safe and nurturing environment.

In Bengaluru, children at **Needs Charitable** Trust engaged in health, hygiene, counselling, and sports activities. At Ashraya, Bhubaneswar, children joined drawing contests, cultural events, and exposure visits to build confidence.

At Charis Foundation, Chennai, children took part in summer camps, computer and music classes, and cultural celebrations. The Special School of Joy, Jharkhand, nurtured children with special needs, while SASA, Pune, supported children with yoga, sports, and cultural programmes.

Autism awareness and inclusive care were promoted across Jharkhand, Pune, and Odisha. Independence Day was marked at all CCIs with dances, skits, and artwork.

Khirod Basini Kanyashram has enabled girls to complete primary education, with many advancing to higher studies and

professional courses. Students also excel in district-level debates, dance, and essay writing competitions.

Overall, CHF's initiatives have improved academic outcomes, ensured nutrition and essentials, and nurtured healthier, more confident children across all CCIs.
















RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

Rural Development Projects

Discrimination is on the rise worldwide, hitting women, persons with disabilities, the poorest, and less-educated individuals hardest. Globally, 1 in 5 people faced discrimination last year, with rates highest in Least Developed Countries (24.3%).

Lack of decent work opportunities weakens the social contract that progress must be shared. Child Help Foundation (CHF) is taking action—this year, we empowered 20 people to lead their shops in Gulabigaon, Nashik, by setting up Bazaar Haat, providing jobs and a platform to sell their own products.





Village Clean-Up Drive

CLIMATE ACTION

Climate Action

The United Nations reports that our planet is already 1.2°C warmer than the late 1800s, with emissions continuing to rise. To limit global warming to 1.5°C, greenhouse gases must be halved by 2030. Urban populations are growing-expected to reach 70% by 2050—while marine pollution and biodiversity loss accelerate.

Child Help Foundation (CHF) is tackling this triple crisis of climate change, pollution, and biodiversity decline. This year, we've impacted 176,493 lives through tree plantations, beach cleanups, gasushala construction, relief for flood and landslide victims, eco-friendly workshops, and more.













Tree Plantation Drive

In Visakhapatnam, volunteers cleared debris left after the immersion of Ganesh idols, while at Velankanni Beach, CHF collaborated with the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI), Vasai Branch (WIRC) and WICASA, collecting around 200 kg of waste. CHF has also conducted beach-cleanup activities at Juhu Beach, Uttan Beach in Mumbai. These initiatives highlighted eco-friendly practices, heritage site cleanliness, and community responsibility towards protecting our environment.



Emergency Flood Relief



Child Help Foundation (CHF) extended vital support to families affected by the devastating landslides in Wayanad, Kerala, where numerous households were displaced and left in urgent need of relief. To strengthen ongoing rehabilitation efforts, CHF provided financial assistance to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerala, Mr. Pinarayi Vijayan, ensuring timely aid reaches the affected communities. The CHF team

closely coordinated with local authorities to channel the contribution responsibly and effectively.




Paper Bag Making Workshop






Monkey Feeding Drive

Through this collaboration, water purifiers will be installed in 7 primary government schools and 9 Anganwadis, ensuring safe and clean drinking water for young children. Additionally, vital medical equipment will be provided to the Primary Health Care Centre, Marcaim, enhancing healthcare services for the local community. This partnership is a significant step toward creating healthier, safer, and more empowered communities in Goa.



Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace (POSH)

POSH

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013—commonly known as the POSH Act—is a landmark initiative by the Government of India aimed at ensuring safe and dignified workplaces for women. Child Help Foundation (CHF) is fully compliant with the POSH Act across all offices, field locations, and virtual workspaces. The organisation's approach extends beyond legal compliance, fostering a culture rooted in dignity, respect, and zero tolerance towards sexual harassment.

The Internal Committee (IC) addresses every complaint with fairness and confidentiality. All new employees undergo mandatory POSH policy training, while existing staff members participate in regular sensitisation workshops. Through a "Train the Trainer" programme, CHF has developed a cadre of 25 certified POSH trainers across India. These trainers have conducted awareness sessions, reaching individuals, and have mentored and certified three external professionals or members to enhance outreach and longterm impact.

During the reporting period, multiple awareness and sensitisation sessions were conducted for varied audiences, including educators, corporate employees, healthcare professionals, NGO staff, and government officials. Key initiatives included:

Educational Institutions: POSH awareness sessions at Ravindranath Tagore School, Pune and SAN Academy, Chennai, focusing on legal rights, workplace safety, and respectful workplace culture.

Government Departments: Training at Panchayat Samiti, Vasai for officials from the Women & Child, Education, and Health departments. The session was commended by the Block Development Officer for promoting women-friendly workplaces.

Healthcare Sector: Awareness training for staff at Nirali A.M. Naik Charitable Healthcare Facility, covering legal provisions, prevention strategies, and redressal mechanisms.

NGO Sector: Session for staff members at SUPPORT NGO, emphasising female staff safety, Internal Committee formation, and zero tolerance for harassment.

Hospitality Sector: Workshops at Ginger Mumbai Airport, engaging participants on the POSH Act, workplace rights, and complaint mechanisms.

Corporate Organisations: Training for new employees at Taj Lands End, Mumbai, Ketto Online Ventures, Team Pumpkin, and ITSPE Hyderabad, focusing on prevention, prohibition, and redressal under the POSH Act.

Additionally, CHF submitted its POSH Annual Report to the District Women and Child Development Office, Thane. Discussions were held with the Childline Supervisor and Protection Officer regarding future collaborations for POSH and POCSO trainings, as well as partnership opportunities under One Stop Centre initiatives to strengthen community-based safety efforts.

Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO)

POCSO

Child Help Foundation (CHF) places child safety at the core of its mission, strictly adhering to the POCSO Act 2012, which protects children under 18 from sexual abuse and harassment while ensuring child-friendly complaint, investigation, and court processes. Regular 'Good Touch - Bad Touch' sessions are conducted in schools to teach children how to recognise unsafe touch, set boundaries, seek help, and use the Child Helpline number 1098.

The Foundation was invited as a guest speaker at the Mahila Melava organised by ICDS in Bhatane, Maharashtra, where participants learned about the POCSO Act and the role of adults in ensuring child safety. Under the Centre of Excellence project, a POCSO awareness session was held at MBMC School, Mire, for students from 1st to 7th standard, focusing on personal safety skills. Additionally, a POCSO awareness training was conducted for music teachers of Furtados School of Music at their Khar, Mumbai centre, covering child protection protocols, safe interactions, and digital content guidelines.

These initiatives aim to create a safe, respectful, and empowering environment for every child.

SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAME

School Health Programme

Mumbai, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with Larsen & Toubro Public Charitable Trust (LTPCT), Integrated Tribal Development Project (ITDP), and Zilla Parishad, implemented a School Health Program across 14 Schools in Vikramaad Block, Palghar. Through health visits, the project screened students, treated over 10,800 illness cases, and referred 65 students for advanced care. In addition, Training of Trainers (ToT) equipped the teachers on POSH, POCSO, and mental health, while CHF staff received Mental Health Literacy training to strengthen delivery.

Our awareness sessions reached 58,000+ students, addressing topics like hygiene, nutrition, menstrual health, and emotional well-being. Gynaecology camps (455 girls), career guidance workshops (2,339) students), and special campaigns on Sickle Cell, Suicide Prevention, and Mental Health further promoted holistic development. These initiatives strengthened education, health, and awareness, fostering holistic adolescent development.














FOUNDATION DAY
