

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



#### **PREFACE**

Child Help Foundation (CHF) is a Pan-India non-profit organization working towards empowering the poor and marginalized communities. We have been working across India to successfully provide humanitarian aid to the needy over the last 12 years. This annual report marks all the endeavours of Child Help Foundation in the financial year 2022-2023.

Child Help Foundation is proud of the various contributions it has made to help the country recover post-pandemic. The organization has been battling, not only to support and save the lives of underprivileged children and their families in need but also the helpless strays who have been affected due to their circumstances like poverty, natural calamities etc.

Throughout the financial year of 2022-2023, Child Help Foundation joined hands with volunteers, NGOs, Donors, Corporates, Government Bodies etc to reach its goals. We would like to express our gratitude to all of them.

Child Help Foundation is mainly a childcentric organization. In order to have a better future, it is important for a child to be healthy and educated. To stress the importance of the aforementioned, the organization has selected 'Swastha se Shiksha Tak' as the theme for this year.

Every child is an untapped potential, waiting for an opportunity. While children with financially stable parents tend to do well in their lives, many underprivileged children are left behind due to the lack of resources. Ill health and lack of educational opportunities severely hamper their future. Hence it is essential that underprivileged children be given a boost in life so that they can compete with their peers.

Child Help Foundation has made efforts to reduce this power dynamic between the underprivileged and privileged by helping children with education, scholarships, emergency medical resources, nutritional meals etc. We plan to help more children in our upcoming years.



### Swastha se Shiksha Tak (स्वास्थ्य से शिक्षा तक)

"Education is teaching our children to desire the right things"- said Plato; the ancient Greek philosopher, and he was right as each child is filled to the brim with untapped potential. They have the power to raise their family from ashes to the moon. However, these talented children are often neglected due to various factors.

One of the most gruesome factors is lifethreatening diseases. With medical rates at an all-time high, most families empty their entire treasury to raise money for their child's treatment. This often causes neglect in education or causes them to drop out of their schools.

However, neglecting a child's education can lead to harmful results. It can cause the child to be trapped in an inescapable cycle of poverty, which has smeared countless people in this nation.

Therefore, Child Help Foundation has started an initiative called 'Swastha Se Shiksha Tak'. This program will help children who have received assistance from the organization under its 'Emergency Medical Support' to smooth transition back to their classrooms.

Throughout the year, we have helped **521** people battle critical illnesses and helped **31,991** lactating mothers with our baby feeding centres. **17,726** minds were impacted through our activities related to

good health and well-being. **6,57,000** children were served nutritious meals, and **13,333** children were given access to **Quality Education.** 

The program will ensure that no child has to give up on their education due to their illness or poverty. Child Help Foundation believes that education is a basic and the most important right of a child, and we are committed to providing help to the children who are lacking.

To leave no child behind, we plan to expand our reach and hope to help out children in every corner of India.

# FROM THE DESK OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Children are beaming with untapped potential, and investing in them can change our nation for the better. When a child gets educated, he uplifts his family and nation along with him. Yet, poverty and illness go hand in hand, and a child's education can come to a sudden halt due to critical illness. These illnesses destroy years of progress that child has worked hard for, and it is during this time that they need our help.

Throughout the year 2022-23, we have done our best to provide for as many children as possible. We hope to increase this number, in the coming years, and also to work in new ventures.

In the financial year 2022-23, our network of donors, volunteers and workforce worked round the clock for our philanthropic efforts. Resulting in 84,611 lives being impacted through our 'Emergency Medical Support' program, which includes beneficiaries from emergency medical cases, baby feeding centres, and other activities related to good health and well-being.

We have made sure that **6,57,000** people sleep with full bellies, and through our WAS (Water and Sanitation), we made a positive impact on the lives of **99,233** people, which covers menstrual health, toilet construction, installation of water purifiers and other activities. **13,333** children won't have to worry about education thanks to our various programmes in the 'Quality Education' initiative. **1,824** people were helped during disasters that engulfed the nation, and the lives of **1,334** villagers were made better in the annual year. In our efforts to bridge the gender gap, we reached out to **2,717** people.

Not content with catering to the human population, Child Help Foundation also worked for our voiceless friends. **334** plants and animals were served through our 'Life on Land' initiative, and over **54,346 kgs** of garbage were collected from various beaches throughout India, which saved the lives of **16,30,380** marine species, with the help of our friends at Beach Army.

Health and Education go hand-in-hand when it comes to a child's future. Without good health, a child cannot hope to do well in education and vice-versa. I am extremely proud of the efforts taken by Child Help Foundation in not only delivering quality education to our beneficiaries but also making sure that they remain in good health.



#### **GOOD HEALTH & WELL BEING**

#### **Emergency Medical Support**

The United Nations SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being aim to promote health care at its best and ward off unnecessary suffering due to preventable diseases and premature death. According to the latest World Health Organisation report, poor health care is accountable for between 5.7 and 8.4 million deaths annually in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs). This number accounts for up to 15% of all deaths in these countries.

The goal is envisioned as increasing the life expectancy of millions of people and reducing the mortality rate by strengthening the primary health care system, focusing on maternal and newborn health, and prioritizing mental health.

Child Help Foundation has adopted SDG3 and made Emergency Medical Support the organisation's flagship program. Under this program, we provide healthcare facilities to children aged 0–18 and save as many lives as possible.

Treatment for heart defects, spine deformities, kidney transplants, liver transplants, stem cell transplants, prolonged NICU treatment for newborns, chemotherapy, and any other long-term treatment needs a lot of financial support. Child Help Foundation helps families in treating their children with these and any other medical treatment they need. We believe that good health paves the way for all things progressive, even education. Children in the best health can avail of education and lead successful career.

To date, we have provided Emergency Medical Support to 2,879 children, and the journey of bringing smiles through medical support continues.

#### **Childhood Cancer**

Childhood cancer is a cancer that affects children and adolescents. It is a diverse group of diseases characterized by the abnormal growth of cells in various parts of the body. Although childhood cancer is relatively rare compared to cancer in adults, it remains a significant health concern worldwide. The exact causes of childhood cancer are often unknown, but certain genetic and environmental factors may contribute to its development. Timely diagnosis is vital for improving outcomes. The treatment plan, stage of cancer, and supportive care services play an essential role in managing side effects and providing psychosocial support to children and their families.

Child Help Foundation collaborates with doctors and hospitals to provide cancer treatment for children. With our network of 31 specialized cancer treatment hospitals, we receive referrals from these institutions when low-income group of patients are unable to cover their treatment expenses. With the help of our resource mobilisation team, we actively fundraise for the treatment. Moreover, we leverage social media networks to raise awareness and gather financial support through targeted advertisements.

In the past year, we provided support to 26 children battling cancer. The collaborative efforts of our medical social workers (MSWs), hospitals, and the Parent Connection program with Child Help Foundation have played a crucial role in supporting pediatric cancer patients, and instilling hope in their fight against the disease.



#### **GOOD HEALTH & WELL BEING**

The year 2022 - 2023 marks 12 years of Child Help Foundation serving the children suffering from terminal illnesses. This year, we helped 26 children suffering from Cancer. Treatment for Cancer diagnosed in childhood significantly improves their chances of survival. The Medical Social Workers (MSWs), the Hospital, and the Parent Connection with Child Help Foundation have exceptionally helped the Paediatric Cancer patients, illuminating hope in their fight against the disease.

#### **Referral Systems**

Child Help Foundation works through referral systems which means that the Medical Professionals or Social Workers at our Partner Hospitals refer these children to us. When a child is diagnosed with cancer, parents are often shocked and on top of it, they are faced with the challenging task of raising the funds for their child's expensive treatment. Our organization thus provides financial aid and emotional support in the form of counselling to the underprivileged patients.

#### In the Hospitals

Child Help Foundation coordinates with the patients for good care and counselling throughout their hospital journey. We work alongside the medical partners in the Pediatric oncology wards.

#### In the Community

Our support extends in the post treatment phase of the cancer surviving patients to enable their overall development. Cancer treatment also has long term side effects. We help the children by fulfilling nursing services beyond hospice care and also by supporting their education enabling them to adapt to the new normal phase of schooling.

#### **Follow up**

After the Hospital Care, the children are given Home-Based Care. Our medical coordinators' team keeps in touch with the patient's family to monitor the child's overall progress.

# Networking with Best Hospitals or Medical Professionals

Child Help Foundation has a network of 51 hospitals across India. We connect the patients with the best doctors, nurses, and medical professionals for the most advanced technology for treatment. In addition, we are partners with the leading oncology departments.



### **1. ALKESH,** 10 years Heart Disease

Alkesh's heart was throbbing with fear. The ten-year-old boy had the unenviable fate of battling a deadly heart disease. However, his treatment cost around Rs. 2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs fifty Thousand only), which was impossible for his father, who worked as a farm labourer. In his moment of distress, he contacted Child Help Foundation. The donors of Child Help Foundation made it possible for this boy to see the light of day.









# **2. JHALLI MANVITHA,** 5 years Severe Burns

Jhalli's playtime turned into a horrific nightmare when she suffered from severe burns. Her right leg and belly got severely affected by the accident. Doctors said her dressing would require at least Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs only). The parents were not in a position to pay such a huge sum of money. So, they contacted Child Help Foundation for assistance. After verification, we opened a crowdfunding page, where the donors supported Jhalli by providing donations. Thanks to the donors, Jhalli got successfully treated.



#### **3. Shrutika,** 6 Years Leukaemia

At the tender age of six, Shrutika was tasked with battling deadly leukaemia. Doctors told her parents that she needs treatment as soon as possible, which will cost Rs 8,00,000/- (Rupees Eight Lakhs Only). Shrutika's father was a mere farmer, who didn't have the resources to amass such a huge sum of money. He reached out to Child Help Foundation in the last hour. After which, the donors poured their hearts out to save this little angel.









#### **4. Aarohi,** 3 Years Heart Disease

Aarohi's parents were concerned when they saw her deteriorating every single day. She was diagnosed with a severe heart condition. The treatment of her condition was worth Rs. 3,75,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Seventy-Five Thousand only). Being an electrician, Aarohi's father couldn't even imagine such a huge sum of money in his wildest dreams. When all hope seemed lost, the donors became a beacon of light. They poured love and affection for Aarohi, which helped her to recover from her deadly disease.



#### **5. Purvi Pardeshi,** 9 Years

Bilateral C.S.O.M

The 9-year-old daughter of Mr and Mrs Pardeshi had been suffering from high fever, extreme cold, and cough since she was two years old. When local medicines proved unable to help, it was discovered that she was suffering was Bilateral C.S.O.M. The surgery was put on hold because the 2-year-old girl was too young for a major surgery. Later, as the situation remained the same and the daughter got older, the surgery became more necessary. But the fees amounted to around Rs. 2,40,000/-(Rupees Two Lakhs Forty Thousand Only), which the family couldn't afford. They turned to Child Help Foundation to help their little daughter's lifelong problem. The surgery was performed, and the little girl was discharged on 17th June. The family lives happily together in their home.







# **6. Maryam,** 6 Years Heart Disease

Maryam is a 6-year-old girl of Mr Salim Pirjade and Mrs Tabasum Pirjade from Pune, Maharashtra. Upon noticing Maryam's fast heartbeats and discolouration of the skin, her parents took her to a doctor. It was found out that she has a hole in her heart and only surgery can cure it. At the AIMS Hospital in Pune, the doctors suggested Urgent Aggressive Medical Management, following PDA Closure Device Heart Procedure. The cost of which was Rs. 2,55,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs and Fifty-Five Thousand Only.) Child Help Foundation supported the family in arranging the funds for the treatment. Further, aid was also provided to the family after Maryam was discharged from the hospital.



## **7. Aadi Pakole,** 14 Months Heart Disease

14 months old Aadi is the son of Mr Nilesh and Mrs Shridevi Pakole from Pune, Maharashtra. He was born with a complex heart defect called Pulmonary Valve Stenosis. At the Aims Hospital, Pune, the doctors advised urgent medical management following the Balloon Pulmonary Valvuloplasty heart procedure. The estimated cost of the treatment is Rs. 2,55,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty-Five Thousand Only). Aadi's parents had spent all their savings on his medical procedures and tests. His parents then reached out to Child Help Foundation for support. We helped the family in arranging the funds and the treatment was successfully undertaken.









# **8. Abhishek Khate,** 2 Years Hypospadias

Abhishek Khate is a 2-year-old boy from Parbhani, Maharashtra. He had a lot of pain and suffered from frequent and painful urination. Abhishek suffered from Hypospadias, a congenital disease in males in which the opening of the urethra is on the underside of the penis. The doctors had proposed an urgent Re-do of single-stage Hypospadias. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 2,60,000/- (Rupees Two Lakh Sixty Thousand Only). After one unsuccessful surgery, his parents had no money left for further treatment. Child Help Foundation extended its support to Abhishek's family so that he can be treated. Abhishek is now doing well.



#### **9. Abel Arun,** 11 Months Cerebral Artery

Eleven-month-old Abel is the only son of Mr Arun and Mrs Blessy Mol Joseph who hails from Idukki, Kerala. One fine day, Abel had a seizure and he was taken to the hospital and he was diagnosed with Cerebral Artery Territory Infarct Status post Decompressive Craniectomy. It is a condition which causes brain haemorrhage. The doctors suggested treatment for Abel was a Cranioplasty, the repair of a skull vault defect costing Rs. 1,35,000/- (Rupees One Lakh and Thirty-Five Thousand only.) When the parents were actively seeking help, they came across a volunteer from our organization. Child Help Foundation came forward to help Abel. He is now successfully treated.









# **10. B/o of Maheshwari,** Infant Premature Birth Complications

In the fifth month of her pregnancy, Mrs Maheshwari underwent an ultrasound scan, which revealed that her baby had a heart defect. She did not want to give up and went ahead bravely. But in the 7th month, her water broke, and she gave birth to a preterm baby. But immediately after the birth, the baby was shifted to the NICU because of prematurity and heart defect. The doctors at Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences and research centre, Kochi, had suggested a Nasal SIMV and continued NICU support for the treatment. The treatment fee was estimated to be Rs. 5,44,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Forty-Four Thousand Only), which the family couldn't afford. The family requested Child Help Foundation to save their newborn. The treatment went successfully, and the baby was discharged from the hospital in September 2022 and now lives a healthy life.



#### **11. Andriya Sanil,** 1 Year Multi Sutural Craniosynostosis

Andriya Sanil is a 1-year-old baby girl from Ernakulam, Kerala. Her father, Mr Sanil Varghese, works as a daily wage labourer to support his family of seven. At 3 months of age, the baby was diagnosed with Multi Sutural Craniosynostosis. After a successful surgical intervention at the Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Centre, Kochi, the doctors advised that a Craniofacial Major Procedure (2nd stage surgery) only would complete her treatment. The estimated cost of this surgery is Rs. 3,98,500/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Ninety-Eight Thousand And Five Hundred Only). Child Help Foundation was successful in helping Andriya with her complete treatment.









# **12. Aravindh,** Four Years Guillain-Barre Syndrome

Aravindh Reddy is a four-year-old boy, who lives along with his parents, Mr Mahipal Reddy and Mrs Krishnaveri. One morning Aravindh started complaining about a severe stomach ache and later he fainted while walking. Mr and Mrs Reddy were advised to take Aravindh to Ankura Hospital, Hyderabad. The doctors there recommended an MRI Scan, and Aravindh was diagnosed with Guillain-Barre Syndrome.Doctors had suggested continued ventilator support as a part of the treatment. The estimated cost of which was Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lakhs Only). But the family could not afford the surgery and sought the help of Child Help Foundation. Aravindh's surgery was successful and he was discharged on 19th July 2022.



### **13. Chetan,** 6 Months Heart Disease

At an age when he should be playing with toys, Chetan was confined to the hospital. He was diagnosed with a serious heart defect that was threatening to take his life. The cost of his treatment was Rs 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). Chetan's father made barely enough to pay the monthly expenses for his family, five lakh rupees was unimaginable for him. On being aided by the donors of Child Help Foundation, Chetan received his much-needed treatment.









# **14. Harshita,** Five Months Heart Disease

Harshita is a five-month-old baby girl from Gurugram, Haryana. Her father, Mr Mahesh Kumar works as an autorickshaw driver. The family of five lives in Gurgram, Haryana. When Harshita was some weeks old, she caught a cold and suffered from a high fever. Whenever she cried, her face developed a bluish discolouration. The local doctor advised the family to get her heart checked. The medical tests left her parents shocked. It was discovered that there is a hole in her heart. The baby's parents took her to Paras Hospital, Gurugram for further treatment. The doctors suggested that Harshita needs Open Heart Surgery for VSD Patch Closure. The estimated cost of this was Rs. 5,00,000/-. So he approached Child Help Foundation for assistance. Her surgery went successfully and she got discharged from the hospital on 30th April 2022.



### **15. Bhagyashree Kanavte,** 11 Months Heart Disease

Il-month-old Bhagyashree from Hyderabad is the daughter of Mr Ganesh and Mrs Anitha. Bhagyashree was born with a complex heart defect called Ventral Septal Defect. She needed heart surgery, estimated to be Rs. 5,93,000/- Being daily wage labourers, Bhagyashree's parents were falling short to arrange the amount of treatment that would save their daughter's life. But due to generous donations, Bhagyashree was able to undergo the treatment she needed and is on her way to a healthy childhood.









#### **16. Chrysolite,** 4 Years Cerebral Palsy

Chrysolite, a patient of Cerebral Palsy had delayed growth and tightness. Her mother works as a nurse in a hospital in Telangana, and her stay-at-home father were extremely worried about her health. Chrysolite was diagnosed with Spastic Diaplegiccarebral Palsy with Bilateral Hamstring Contractures. She was proposed a treatment worth Rs. 2,25,000/- by the doctors. It was nearly impossible for Chrysolite's family to pay for their daughter's life-saving treatment. Fortunately, with donations from Child Help Foundation donors, Chrysolite underwent the proposed treatment and is on her way to a healthy and beautiful childhood.



# **17. Baby of Ashwini,** Infant Premature Birth Complications

The firstborn of Mrs Ashwini was delivered prematurely at 7 months. A further check-up revealed that the baby's liver and kidney had swelling and an immediate delivery was suggested. After birth, the baby suffered from severe Respiratory Distress Syndrome and Patent Ductus Arteriosus. She was admitted to NICU stay for 2 months and the cost amounted to Rs.5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs only). The family requested Child Help Foundation to help their little daughter. She was discharged from the hospital on 3rd June and lives a healthy life now.

# **18. Jinu Jossy,** 13 Years Spherocytosis

Jinu Jossy is a school-going girl of Mr Jossy Abraham and Mrs Bindhu Jossy. Her father is a daily wage worker at a farm and her mother is a housewife who takes care of their three children. She was diagnosed with Spherocytosis with Cholecystitis Refractory ITP at a very early age and was consistently provided with treatment at a government hospital. After turning 13 years, the doctors of Aster Medcity in Kochi, Kerala advised Splenectomy Laparoscopic Level 1 and Cholecystectomy Lap Level 1. The estimated cost was Rs. 3,50,000/- (Three Lakhs and Fifty Thousand Rupees only). Her parents and relatives had already exhausted all their savings in years of hospital visits. Child Help Foundation thus helped Jinu Jossy with her final treatment towards a healthy life.



# **19. Reksha Sreeraj,** 9 Years Accidental Injuries

Reksha Sreeraj is the nine-year-old daughter of Mr Amruth Sreeraj and Mrs Rekha Raju of Kerala. She met with an awful road accident that left severe injuries on her head. At Aster Medcity, Kerala, Reksha had to undergo three minor and five major brain surgeries along with daily physiotherapy sessions for her to recover completely. She required months of intensive care and observation. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs.13,80,000/- (Rupees Thirteen Lakhs Eighty Thousand Only). With the support of our donors, Child Help Foundation was able to help the family with the arrangement of funds and her treatment was successful.









#### **20. Nesriya,** 6 Years Thalassemia Major

6-year-old Nesriya from Kerala was diagnosed with Hb E Beta Thalassemia Major in 2021. Since the parents were unable to provide for her with proper treatment, she had been suffering from severe symptoms for a year. The doctors at Aster Medcity Hospital advised a Haploidentical Stem Cell Transplant. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs.16,75,000/- (Rupees Sixteen Lakhs Seventy-Five Thousand Only). They found a donor for the patient through a healthcare organization but were unable to arrange funds. Child Help Foundation thus came forward to provide help. The transplant was successful and Nesriya is now discharged from the hospital.



# **21. B/o of Vasantha,** Infant Premature Birth Complications

In the seventh month of her pregnancy, Mrs Vasantha went through a C-section delivery and gave birth to a premature baby. The baby was taken to NICU as she suffered from extreme premature conditions. Subsequently, the situation worsened, and the baby was diagnosed with Necrotizing Enterocolitis and sepsis and shifted to Aster Mims Hospital, Kerala. The treatment cost resulted in Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakhs Only). The father, being a daily wage labourer, couldn't afford the fee and requested Child Help Foundation for help, after which the operation was successful. The baby was discharged from the hospital on 12th September 2022.









# **22. Payal Raju Madane,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Payal Raju Madane is the 11-year-old daughter of Mr Raju Madane and Mrs Varsha Madane. Payal had always been underweight and her immunity was very weak. At a local hospital, it was found that she had a heart defect. For further intervention, she was taken to Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre in Mumbai, Maharashtra. The doctors prescribed an ICR of VSD with DCRV operation for Payal. The estimated cost was Rs.3,30,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Thirty Thousand only). When the parents found themselves in this helpless situation, they contacted Child Help Foundation for help. Our team raised funds for her treatment. After which, it was successfully undertaken.



## **23. Juned Sheikh,** 15 Years Heart Disease

Juned Sheikh, a 15-year-old boy from Jalgaon, Maharashtra, was suffering from a Large Ostium Secundum ASD. His parents, who couldn't even understand the complexity of the problem, were asked to put Juned under treatment of ICR of VSD closure, which amounted to Rs. 2,50,000/-(Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). The family asked Child Help Foundation for help, and the treatment began. Juned was discharged from the hospital on 12th August after the successful surgery and lives a healthy life now.









# **24. Rushikesh,** 9 Years Heart Disease

No child should have to worry about their life at the age of nine. But such was the sad fate of Rushikesh, who had been forced to battle a deadly heart condition. The only way to save Rushikesh was through Multiple Mid Muscular VSD, which was worth Rs 3,30,000/- (Rupees Three Lakh Thirty Thousand Only). The mere mention of the amount sent a chill down Ravi's spine. Ravi works as a welder, while his wife works as a farm labourer. They had no way of paying for the medical treatment. But when all hope was lost, kind souls like you poured in love and support, which helped in the successful treatment of Rushikesh.



## **25. Bhargavi,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Eleven-year-old Bhargavi became a shell of her former self when she found out that she was diagnosed with Large OS ASD, which meant that she had a hole in her heart. She experienced symptoms like irregular heartbeats (arrhythmias), fatigue and the sensation of rapid palpitations or skipped beats. Happiness withered from the academically brilliant child, her fate now rested on heart surgery. Doctors at Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Center, Mumbai said that the treatment would cost Rs.2,50,000/-(Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). Bhargavi's father, Amritav worked as a farmer and made a minimum wage. It was next to impossible for him to raise this much money. The parents needed help to be able to pay for their daughter's treatment. Child Help Foundation was successful in helping Bhargavi with her complete treatment.









# **26. Krishna Mudnar,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Krishna Gajanan Mudnar is an 11-year-old son of Mr Gajanan Mudnar and Mrs Archana Mudnar. They are both daily wage labourers belonging to Hingoli, Maharashtra. They work on farms to run their family and look after their three children. Krishna was diagnosed with a heart defect at the time of birth and used to undergo yearly health checkups. After a recommendation from doctors at a health camp, he was taken to the Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre in Mumbai where the doctors recommended a heart surgery worth Rs. 3,30,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs and Thirty Thousand only.) Being aided by Child Help Foundation, the surgery was successfully undertaken.



## **27. Shivaraj Karhale,** 9 Years Heart Disease

Shivaraj Karhale is the 9-year-old son of Mr Gangadhar Karhale and Mrs Parvati Karhale. The parents are farm labourers. They struggle to find work and manage to collectively earn only around Rs 4000/- per month. During a school camp, the visiting doctors identified significant issues in his breathing. They suggested an immediate intervention and the parents were informed. At the Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre, Shivaraj was diagnosed with Large Perimembranous VSD Anterior Extension and DCRV. The cost of his surgery was Rs. 3,30,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs and Thirty Thousand only.) After receiving support from Child Help Foundation, the parents could manage the surgery of their son Shivaraj. He is now discharged from the hospital and is recovering.









# **28. Soham,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Soham started suffering from frequent high fever and chest pains. His worried parents took him to a local hospital and after a scan, it was discovered that little Soham had a hole in his heart. The doctors realized that further surgery at that moment was not possible considering Soham's age. Soham continued living with the problems till he reached 11 years of age, but the situation remained the same. Mr and Mrs Dhage took him to Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre in Mumbai, and upon diagnosis, they found out that he has a Large Perimembranous LCR with severe PAH and needed immediate treatment. But arranging the money for the surgery was difficult for the parents and they reached out to Child Help Foundation for help. Soham's surgery was successful.



### **29. Yash Langade,** 14 Years Heart Disease

Yash Langade, a 14-year-old boy from Solapur, Maharashtra suffered from Ventricular Septal Defect (VSD) with severe Right Ventricular Outflow Tract (RVOT) Obstruction (a complex heart defect). Doctors advised that he undergoes heart surgery after a few years because he was very young. As his condition worsened, doctors told him that, he needs to undergo an urgent Intracardiac Repair of VSD with RVOT obstruction surgery. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs.3,30,000/-(Rupees Three Lakhs Thirty Thousand Only). Because his family could not afford to pay for the treatment they were provided financial support from Child Help Foundation. Yash's surgery was successful and he was discharged on 7th July 2022.









### **30. Shristi Kondhare,** Nine Momths Heart Disease

Shristi Kondhare, a nine-month-old baby girl, was suffering from a critical heart condition. Her father, Mr Haridas Kondhare, owns a small piece of land for farming. After a few months from her birth, they noticed that Shristi was not gaining weight as a healthy child would and she even appeared to be very weak. Tensed, the parents took their baby to a local hospital in Osmanabad, where medical tests revealed that Shristi is suffering from a congenital heart defect. All of their savings had exhausted and they were heartbroken that they couldn't help their little girl. Child Help Foundation financially supported the family and Shristi's surgery was successful and she was discharged on the 9th of May, 2022.



#### 31. Burhanuddin Y. Vhore,

3 Years and 9 Months, Cancer

Today, Burhanuddin lives a fulfilling life. However, that was not the case long ago, as cancer gripped him by the throat. He needed to undergo surgery, which was beyond the reach of his parents. However, Burhanuddin's parents approached Child Help Foundation, and the donors saved the day for Burhanuddin.









# **32. Sinchana,** 8 Years Kyphoscoliosis

Sinchana's body was taking an abnormal shape due to her spinal defect. Doctors diagnosed her with Congenital Kyphoscoliosis and said that she would require Bilateral posterior instrumentation, deformity correction, vertebral column resection and fusion. The total cost of the treatment was Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakh Only), which was a cruel blow to her parents. But when all hope was lost, kind souls like you poured in love and support, which helped in the successful treatment of Sinchana.



# **33. Devika,** 6 Years Dorsolumbar Kyphotic Deformity

It seemed as if Devika's childhood would be spent in misery, as she was diagnosed with Dorsolumbar Kyphotic Deformity. Devika couldn't run or play around like normal children because of her spinal deformity. The only way to restore the robbed independence in her life was through surgery which came with a price tag of Rs 3,50,000/-. Devika's father was an auto rickshaw driver, while her mother earned her living as a daily wage worker. They were losing hope for their daughter, as they had no way to amass the massive amount. But thanks to the generous donations of our donors, Devika looks forward to living a healthy life.









## **34. Kavya Kumar,** 10 Years Scoliosis

The child of Mr and Mrs Kumar was diagnosed with Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis (Spinal Deformity) and needed urgent Deformity Correction surgery. The family couldn't afford the surgery as it cost Rs. 4,50,000/- (Four Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). They turned to Child Help Foundation to help their daughter's lifelong problem. The surgery was performed, and the little girl was discharged on the 16th of August. The family lives happily together in their home.



### **35. Shubham Solnkar,** 9 Years Heart Disease

Shubham Solnkar hails from Solapur, Maharashtra. He had a complex heart defect. He could not even live his daily life without pain as he was growing weaker every day. The doctors at the Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre, Mumbai advised Intracardiac repair of VSD Closure as a part of his treatment. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). Shubham's father works on a farm and he couldn't source money for his son. He turned to Child Help Foundation for help and the required amount was raised for Shubham. He is now recovering from his sickness.









# **36. Bo Mounika,** 9 Months Meningitis

Nine-month-old b/o Mounika had been suffering from Meningitis, with Spinal Micro Abscess, a rare spinal infection where infected material (pus) and germs get collected around the spinal cord. The family took their daughter to Sowmya Children's Hospital, Hyderabad, where the doctors suggested a PICU Stay as part of the treatment. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Only). The mother who took care of her baby alone approached Child Help Foundation for help. The surgery went successful, and the baby was discharged on 20th September 2022, and the mother and daughter live happily now.



# **37. Barnali,** 12 Years Kyphoscoliosis

A gifted student, the future was looking bright for twelve-year-old Barnali. However, fate decided to play a cruel joke on her, and she was taken down by Left Dorsolumbar Kyphoscoliosis. Her spinal cord took a grotesque structure, and the disease even stopped her growth. Doctors said that Barnali needs to undergo bilateral posterior deformity correction vertebral column resection and fusion. The problem was that the treatment cost around Rs 6,00,000/-(Rupees Six Lakhs Only). Barnali's father, Nayan Mahanta worked as a labourer in a fish market and only earned Rs 10,000. He couldn't even imagine such a huge sum of money. In such a crucial time, Child Help Foundation stepped in and helped in Barnali's treatment.









## **38. Avanthika,** 5 Years Scoliosis

Avanthika was diagnosed with Congenital Scoliosis (a rare spinal deformity) at birth. The doctors had informed the parents that she will need a deformity correction procedure when she grows up. But her condition worsened by the time she turned five. The doctors at Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital, Bengaluru suggested urgent treatment (Deformity Correction and Vertebral Column Resection and Fusion) for Avanthika. The estimated cost was Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). Her parents work on a farm to manage the family. However, the medical costs were too expensive for them. They asked Child Help Foundation for help. After successfully raising funds, the treatment took place and Avanthika is now doing well.



# **39. Akshaya,** 13 Years Kyphoscoliosis

13-year-old Akshaya was admitted to Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital, Bengaluru, as she was diagnosed with Congenital Kyphoscoliosis. The treatment consisted of two surgeries which the mother couldn't afford. The first surgery was successful due to the kindness of the neighbours, but the second surgery, which amounted to Rs.2,60,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs and Sixty Thousand Only), was too much. The mother, having no option left, turned to Child Help Foundation for the safety of her daughter's life. The surgery was performed, and the little girl was discharged on 10th September 2022. The family lives happily together in their home.









# **40. Shivadarshini,** 6 Years Spinal Defect

Shivadarshini, a six-year-old girl from Chamrajnagar, Karnataka suffered from a spinal deformity. But her parents became worried when after 1.5 years of her birth, Shivadarshini couldn't sit or walk properly. Her body seemed to be shifted on one side. After a few check-ups, it was found that she is diagnosed with Congenital Thoracolumbar Scoliosis (a sideways curvature of the spine that is caused by a defect that was present at birth). The doctors suggested vertebral column resection, deformity correction, and fusion as a part of her treatment. The estimated cost of Shivadarshini's treatment was ₹ 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). This was beyond the family's financial capabilities and they reached out to Child Help Foundation for support and Shivadarshini's surgery was successful. Little Shivadarshini was discharged on 2nd July 2022.



# **41. Leela Gowda,** 11 Years Kyphoscoliosis

The baby of Mr and Mrs Gowda was suffering from a rare spinal condition. From the age of 8, the baby was unable to sit and stand straight. Taking it as a back injury, the parents took her to a hospital, but it was discovered she suffered from Congenital Thoracolambular Kyphoscoliosis. For the surgery, a sum of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rs. Five Lakhs Only) was needed, which the family couldn't afford. They turned to Child Help Foundation to help their little daughter. The surgery began, and their daughter was discharged on 11th June, after which she was able to sit and stand properly. The family now lives happily with their playful little daughter.









### **42. Dibyanshu,** 12 Years Heart Disease

Dibyanshu's toys were gathering dust, as he was forced to fight a deadly heart disease. He needed a complex open heart surgery, which came with a cost of Rs.4,50,000/-(Rupees Four Lakhs Fifty Thousand only). Dibyanshu's father worked as a labourer and didn't have the means to arrange such a huge sum of money. With the support of our donors, Child Help Foundation was able to help the family with the arrangement of funds and his treatment was successful.



### **43. Gourav Swain,** 1 Year Heart Disease

It all started when the one-year-old Gourav Swain experienced some breathing difficulties. Out of concern, his parents took him to the hospital. After undergoing numerous tests, the doctors diagnosed him with severe heart disease. Doctors said that he needed to undergo surgery as soon as possible. But the surgery came with a cost of Rs 3,50,000/-. The mere mention of the amount sent a chill down the spines of his parents. Hailing from a low-income family, they had no way of raising such a huge sum of money. However, due to selfless donations, Gourav Swain was able to undergo much-needed surgery and is on his way towards healthy childhood.









### **44. Bilvika,** 1 Year and 11 Months Heart Disease

Bilvika is the younger daughter of Mr Giribabu and Mrs Yamuna. She is 1 year and 11 months old and suffered from a complicated congenital heart defect. Three days after her birth, her heart defect was detected. This was when the country was under the first lockdown due to COVID-19. The doctors had suggested that Bilvika undergoes a Primum atrial septal defect disclosure treatment along with a cleft repair procedure. The estimated cost of this treatment was Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). The travelling and COVID-19 phase exhausted all of their savings. They reached out to Child Help Foundation for financial support and Bilvika's surgery was successful and she was discharged on 11th July 2022.



### **45. Prathik,** 9 Months Heart Disease

Nine months old Prathik is the only son of Mr Kalyan Kethavath and Mrs Santhosha Kethavath of Konetiwada in Telangana. He had been under treatment for more than 6 months before being diagnosed with ACHD Large perimembranous VSD with Inlet Extension Additional Tiny Mid muscular VSD, Dilated Left Heart, Mild Tricuspid Regurgitation, Confluent Branch PA's and Severe Pulmonary Hypertension. Prathik's family lacked the resources to arrange Rs. 3,50,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only) for his open heart surgery at the Care Hospital in Telangana. His father works as a security guard to support his family. He reached out to Child Help Foundation for help. After the verification process, we could arrange the money for him and he has been successfully treated.









## **46. Uday Tej,** 3 Years Heart Disease

Three-year-old Uday Tej is the son of Mr Sri Sailam and Mrs Padhma from Telangana. Uday was suffering from a rare heart defect, Large SVS Sinus ASD LR. It is a rare heart defect present since birth. He was being treated at Care Hospital, Hyderabad where the doctors suggested a complex open heart surgery which could cost Rs. 3,50,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only). Due to financial constraints, the family did not have any money to pay for their son's treatment. The funding was arranged by the team of Child Help Foundation. Uday is now completely treated and moving towards a healthy life.



### **47. Kalayi Aishya,** 4 Months Heart Disease

Kalayi Gari Aishya is a 4-month-old infant born to Mr Kalayi Gari Chanpsha and Sameena. They hail from Naladhar, Andhra Pradesh. She was born with congenital heart disease and had already undergone one operation. The complications in her heart constantly kept her ill. The doctors at the Care Hospital, Telangana suggested a Surgical PA Plasty Complex Open Heart Surgery within 8-10 days for her to survive. The estimated cost for which is Rs. 3,50,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). As a daily wage labourer, the father had no idea how he would arrange such a huge amount. So, he approached Child Help Foundation for support. We helped the family in arranging the funds and the treatment was successfully undertaken.









# **48. Warisha Khan,** 13 Years Kidney Disease

Warisha Khan is a 13-year-old girl residing in Kolkata, West Bengal. She was diagnosed with End-Stage Renal Disease in 2017 after which she was kept on dialysis for 4.5 years. The doctors at the CK Birla Hospital, Kolkata suggested a kidney transplant as the only resolution for Warisha's medical condition. The estimated cost of this treatment was Rs.10,55,000/-(Rupees Ten Lakhs Fifty-Five Thousand Only). Mr Asjad Khan (father) is a part-time assistant accountant at a private firm and he could not arrange this kind of money for his daughter's treatment. Child Help Foundation came forward to help the family in arranging the funds and the transplant was successful.



### **49. Saisha,** 6 Years Heart Disease

Saisha Shinde is the six-year-old daughter of Mr Ankush Shinde and Mrs Kirti Shinde from Pune, Maharashtra. The final sonography report discovered that the baby was suffering from Tricuspid Atresia, a heart defect. She needed to undergo TCPC surgery (Total Cavopulmonary Connection). The estimated cost of the treatment was ₹ 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Only). This amount was beyond Mr and Mrs Shinde's financial capabilities. They were provided financial support from Child Help Foundation for Saisha's surgery. The surgery was successful and she got discharged on 7th July 2022.









## **50. Arshan,** 5 Years Heart Disease

Five-year-old Arshan from Hasanpur, Uttar Pradesh, suffered from TOF with multiple AP collaterals (a combination of four different congenital heart defects). The family was advised to take their son to Paras Hospital, Bihar, for a Cardiac cath study with Tetralogy of Fallot repair. They were informed that the treatment would cost Rs. 4,50,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). Arshan's father is a labourer and earns only around Rs. 5000/per month. He couldn't pay such a huge amount. Child Help Foundation thus completed the necessary verification and helped the family in arranging funds for Arshan's treatment.



### **51. Brinda Bhan,** 1 Year Heart Disease

Brinda was only 1 year old when she started falling sick with a severe cold and cough. Worried, her father took her to the hospital, and they discovered that Brinda was suffering from a rare complex heart defect. The doctors prescribed surgery for PDA Device Closure. Mr Babru Bhan is a single father who earns a meagre amount to support his children and his ailing parents. He could not get his daughter operated because of financial restraints. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs.3,70,000/- (Rupees Three Lakh Seventy Thousand Only). Child Help Foundation verified the medical case and helped Mr Bhan with his daughter's surgery. Brinda is now treated and being taken care of.









## **52. Parvesh Khan,** 4 Years Heart Disease

Four-year-old Parvesh Khan from Uttar Pradesh was suffering from a complex heart defect called Cyanotic CHD. He struggled to breathe and felt intense pain in the chest. When his condition worsened, he was taken to Paras Hospital, Gurugram where the doctors suggested a heart surgery named TOF Repair with VSD Closure. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 4,00,000/-(Rupees Four Lakhs Only). When the parents could not arrange funds for Parvesh's treatment, they contacted Child Help Foundation for help. Later, Parvesh's surgery was successfully done and he is now discharged from the hospital.



### **53. Zakia Banoo,** 14 Years Heart Disease

the hospital on 30th August.

Fourteen years old Zakia was diagnosed with Cyanotic Congenital Heart disease, which reduced the amount of oxygen delivered to the rest of the body. She needed an immediate treatment Angiography followed by Open Heart Surgery TOF (Tetralogy of Fallot) repair, which costs Rs.

4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Only). The family reached out to Child Help Foundation to save their little girl. The surgery went successful, and Zakia was discharged from









## **54. Deepika,** 6 Years Heart Disease

Deepika is a six-year-old daughter of Mr Satvir and Mrs Rita, from Uttar Pradesh. A few tests were conducted which discovered that she was suffering from Complex Patent Ductus Arteriosus (Large Tubular PDA). The doctors had suggested a PDA surgical ligation (Heart Surgery). The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 3,60,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Sixty Thousand Only). But arranging such a huge amount was very difficult sufficed on minimal income and helpless they reached out to Child Help Foundation. Deepika's surgery was successful and she was discharged on 26th July 2022.



### **55. Hitanya,** 6 Years Heart Disease

3 months after her birth, Hitanya started facing severe difficulties in breathing. When the suffering could not get better after many hospital visits, she was taken to the Rainbow Hospital in Punjab. Hitanya was diagnosed with Transitional AVCD. The parents were informed that Hitanya needed immediate heart surgery before the hole in the heart expanded. Her family was already in debt due to her mother's three major surgeries. Mr Subhash Chander earns a meagre wage. He needed help to raise Rs. 4,50,000/-(Rupees Four Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only) for this surgery. They got in touch with Child Help Foundation to save their little girl. The surgery was successful and Hitanya was discharged from the hospital.









## **56. Manreet Kaur,** 7 Months Heart Disease

The Kaur family approached Child Help Foundation to save their little girl who had a hole in her heart. They noticed that their little girl's body would turn blue and she would have trouble breathing. When they took her to the hospital, a fee of Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Only) was demanded for the treatment to begin. Child Help Foundation helped the family save their daughter, who was discharged from the hospital on 10th June. The family lives happily now with their daughter Manreet Kaur.



### **57. Baby of Kadrunnisa,** 15 Days Bronchitis

The 15-day-old baby of Mrs Kadrunnisa was diagnosed with Bronchitis. He was admitted to Queens Hospital, Mumbai. The doctors proposed NICU and oxygen support as a part of the treatment. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Fifty Thousand Only). Kadrunnisa's husband is a daily wage labourer who only brings Rs. 150/- a day. Struggling to manage the unforeseen medical expenses, they reached out to Child Help Foundation for help. We verified the medical case and helped the family. The treatment was successfully carried out.









## **58. Baby of Soni,** 1 Month 22 Days Heart Disease

The third baby of Mrs Soni was delivered through a C-section surgery due to her fluctuating health issues. A few days after the birth, the family was devastated as they discovered their baby had a hole in her heart. With deteriorating health, the family went to the hospital, where the advised treatment was VSD Closure which costs Rs. 4,20,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Twenty Thousand Only). With a meagre income, the family couldn't afford this treatment, so they contacted Child Help Foundation to save their daughter's life. After a few days, the surgery was successfully performed, and the baby was discharged from the hospital in good health on 1st August 2022.



# **59. Ananya,** 1 Year Mucopolysaccharidosis

A price tag of Rs. 14,00,000 (Rupees Fourteen lakhs only), was put on the normal life of one-year-old Ananya. Diagnosed with Mucopolysaccharidosis type, a rare disease which hampers the motor skills of children, Ananya needed a Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplant. The doctors at Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad said that her uncle was a perfect match but her father, Saidhulu worked as a driver and earned a minimum income. He didn't have the means to raise such a huge amount of money. He reached out to Child Help Foundation. After verification, we could successfully arrange the money for her treatment, and she has been successfully treated.









# **60. Deshik Viraj,** 1 Year 4 Months Accidental Injuries

Deshik Viraj is the child of Dommeti Kiran and Kothapeli Aishwarya. They hail from Nalgonda, Telangana. Deshik was playing on the terrace when he came across this deadly accident in which his skull was fractured, oxygenation in the brain was hampered and his left part of the body was paralysed. The cost of the treatment for the Decompressive Craniectomy, Traumatic Brain Injury was Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lakhs only.) The parents needed help to be able to pay for their son's treatment. Child Help Foundation was successful in helping Deshik Viraj with his complete treatment.



# **61. Snehitha,** 12 Years Kidney Disease

Snehitha is a 12-year-old girl from Khammam district, Telangana. After complaints of severe stomach aches, she was diagnosed with end-stage Kidney Disease in March 2022. The estimated cost of her kidney transplant was Rs.15,00,000/-(Rupees Fifteen Lakhs Only). Her mother was the donor. The help provided by the relatives was not sufficient for the incurring expenses. Hence, with further support from Child Help Foundation, the transplant was completed and Snehitha was discharged from the hospital. She is now recovering and getting back to her normal life.









# **62. Twins of Madhuri,** 15 Days Premature Birth Complications

The twins of Mr and Mrs Vidhate were born prematurely and were taken to NICU. Their health kept deteriorating day by day and they needed external oxygen support to live. The idea of ongoing treatment distressed the parents because of the lack of funds to pay the hospital, which demanded a fee of Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakhs Only). The family requested Child Help Foundation to save their little children. The treatment went successfully and the twins were discharged from the hospital on 4th June and now live a healthy life.



## **63. Bo Saista,** 18 Days Premature Birth Complications

Saista was born prematurely. The baby boy was extremely weak and could only be saved by a prolonged stay in the NICU. However, upon finding out that the treatment would cost Rs 2,00,000/- (Rupees two lakhs only), the parents were distraught. The family barely managed to pay for their monthly expenses, and they had no way of paying for their son's treatment. Child Help Foundation thus completed the necessary verification and the donors helped the family in arranging funds for the baby's treatment.









# **64. Bo Rubina,** 5 Days Premature Birth Complications

A catastrophe struck the family of Rubina and Kazi when their baby was born prematurely. Doctors at Silver Crest Hospital, Haryana said that the baby girl needed a NICU stay which would cost around Rs 1,50,000 (Rupees One Lakh Fifty Thousand Only). Kazi, who works as a housekeeper, only earned Rs 12,000, which was barely enough to support his family of four. He had no way of paying for the treatment. But when all hope was lost, kind souls like you poured in love and support, which helped in the successful treatment of Rubina's daughter.



# **65. Baby of Mahfuza,** 25 Days Premature Birth Complications

The baby of Mahfuza was born in severe pain and distress. Mahfuza gave birth to the baby while she was only seven months pregnant. Naturally, the baby was born extremely weak and had severe respiratory issues. Doctors at Silver Crest Hospital said that he needed Post Surfactant and Post Mechanical Ventilation PPHN/ PDA shock, which came with the cost of Rs. 5,00,000 (Rupees Five lakhs only). Mahfuza's husband, Abubakkar Siddik worked in a hotel and earned minimum wage, which was barely enough to put food on the table. However, with the help of Child Help Foundation, he was able to treat his baby boy successfully.









## **66. Surya Tej,** 4 Years Pneumonia

Battling pneumonia was not easy for the four-year-old Surya. Doctors informed his parents that he would require a PICU stay and ventilator support. The total cost of the treatment was coming up to Rs 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five lakh only). Surya's father worked at a local restaurant and made barely enough to put food on the table for his family. However, after taking the help of Child Help Foundation, he was able to treat his little son.



## **67. Baby of Mamatha,** 1 Day Premature Birth Complications

When Mamatha went into labour before her due date, she knew that her worst days were ahead. True to her fears, her baby was born with numerous complications. Doctors at Sowmya Children's Hospital in Hyderabad have said that the baby girl needed an extended NICU stay, which would cost around 5,00,000/-. Mamatha's husband, Narsimma worked as a vegetable vendor who earned barely enough to put meals on the table for his family. It was close to impossible for him to arrange such a huge amount of money. However, at the last moment, selfless donors stepped in and saved the baby from the clutches of death.









# **68. Lakshmi Reddy,** 7 Months Respiratory Disease

Lakshmi Reddy, a little bundle of joy for his parents, was diagnosed with recurrent respiratory tract infections when he was seven months old. Constant vomiting and slow weight gain plagued his days. His life was confined to a hospital bed with ventilator support. The doctors at Sowmya Children's Hospital, Hyderabad proposed esophageal dilatation as a part of his treatment. Unfortunately, the cost of the treatment was Rs. 4,00,000/- which was nearly impossible to arrange for Lakshmi Reddy's family. During such dreadful times, what saved Lakhmi Reddy's life was the generous donations of various people. Today he is safe and living a joyful childhood.



### **69. Baby of Janagam,** 1 Day Severe Respiratory Distress

The baby of Janagam is a small boy from the village of Buttaigudem in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh. His father, Mr Sunaarkani Chiranjeevi, is a daily wage labourer and makes Rs. 7,000/- per month to support their family. At the time of birth, the baby of Janagam had irregular heartbeats and faced severe issues with breathing. The doctors of the Sowmya Children's Hospital diagnosed him with Severe Respiratory Distress. The estimated cost of his treatment was Rs. 9,00,000/- (Rupees Nine Lakhs Only.) The family had already drained all their savings and could not find any help. Child Help Foundation came forward to help the family and the baby has completely recovered now.









# **70. Mohd. Sofian,** 8 Years Burn Injuries

Mohammed Sofian is the 8-year-old son of Mr Mohhammed Ahmed and Mrs Asha. They live in a small town in Telangana. Sofian accidentally burnt himself with hot water and his abdomen and chest were severely affected with 25-30% superficial deep burns. The doctors at the Sowmya Children's Hospital, Hyderabad suggested several collagen dressings and a prolonged ICU stay as a part of Sofian's treatment. The estimated cost of treatment was Rs. 4,00,00/- (Rupees Four Lakhs only). The family reached out to Child Help Foundation for help. With the support and prolonged medical care, Sofian has now completely recovered and is doing well.



### **71. Sarfaraz,** 2 Years Abdominal Distension

Sarfaraz had been diagnosed with abdominal distension by the doctors of Sowmya Hospital, Hyderabad. Daily life became a burden for the two-year-old Sarfaraz as his days were plagued by intense pain. He needed first, a colostomy and second, a biopsy of the rectum and colon followed by second surgery of closure and colostomy. The total cost of the treatment came to around Rs 4,00,000 (Rupees Four Lakhs Only), which was difficult for Sadat, Sarfaraz's father, to arrange. Sadat worked as a salesperson and only earned Rs. 10,000 per month. On being aided by Child Help Foundation, Sarfaraz received his much-needed treatment.





### **72. Kruthwik,** 3 Years Heart Disease

Kruthwik was carrying a scarred heart within his body, causing him unbearable pain. For three years, his parents had to wait due to their miserable financial situation as they relied on a sole breadwinner who worked as a mere farmer. This wait was rewarded as the donors of Child Help Foundation helped to raise money for his treatment. Right now, Kruthwik lives a carefree life with pain being the last thing on his mind.







## **73. Baby of Shirisha,** 17 Days Premature Birth Complications

Mrs Shirisha gave birth to a small girl through a C-section delivery since she was suffering from PIH (Pregnancy Induced Hypertension), which caused the baby to suffer from respiratory problems. Mrs Shirisha was discharged from the hospital, but the baby had to undergo another mechanical ventilator treatment. The hospital fee was estimated to be Rs. 12,00,000/- (Rupees Twelve Lakhs Only). The family turned to Child Help Foundation as their last hope. The surgery was successfully performed, and the little girl was discharged on 30th August. The family leads a content life now, along with their healthy daughter.









# **74. Twin Girls of Drisya,** 10 Days Premature Birth Complications

The twin baby girls of Mrs Drisya and Mr Abhilash were born in the 32nd week of pregnancy (7.5 months). They suffered from extreme prematurity, low birth weight and respiratory distress syndrome. Both the babies weighed 1,270 grams and required NICU stay to develop healthily. The estimated cost of their treatment was Rs. 5,00,000/- for each baby, meaning Rs. 10,00,000/- for them both. But since Mr Abhilash is the sole breadwinner and earns only Rs. 4,000/- per month by working as an autorickshaw driver. They reached out to Child Help Foundation for financial support and the baby girls were discharged on 2nd July 2022.



# **75. Moni Kumari,** 12 Years Cleft Lip

Moni Kumari is a 12-year-old girl from Haryana. Her father, Mr Dawlu Mandal, and mother, Mrs Archana Devi, are factory workers. Moni had a cleft lip, which is a split in the upper lip. The doctors, after Moni's birth, suggested surgery for her condition. But because of their poor financial condition, her parents could not manage to afford the cost of treatment. As she grew up, Moni started to face difficulty in breathing and had frequent colds. When checked with the doctors, it was discovered that Moni was suffering from Aspiration Pneumonitis. The doctors suggested treatment for Moni's condition. The estimated cost of which was Rs. 2,00,000/-. They had reached out to Child Help Foundation for help and Moni's treatment was successful.









# **76. Twins of Jisha,** 6 Days Premature Birth Complications

The twins of Mrs Jisha were put in NICU due to immediate delivery. Since they were suffering from extreme premature symptoms, the doctors advised an extended stay at the hospital, estimated to be Rs. 1,30,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Thirty Thousand Only). The family requested Child Help Foundation to save their little children. The treatment was successful, and the twins were discharged from the hospital on the 16th of August and now live happily.



# **77. Triplets of Lijy,** 12 Days Premature Birth Complications

Mr Chacko Mathew and Mrs Lijy Raju who hail from Thiruvalla, Kerala were excited to become new parents and were living in a very blissful state. However, the doctor told them that they needed to urgently deliver the babies and that they would be premature. The couple became parents to triplets, 2 baby boys and 1 little girl, who at 12 days old were kept in NICU. The estimated cost of their treatment was Rs. 4,00,000/-(Rupees Four Lakhs Only). The family was in distress because they couldn't afford the treatment and they reached out to Child Help Foundation. The triplets were kept in NICU and their treatment was successful, they were discharged on 4th July 2022.









## **78. Baby of Pooja,** 10 Days Premature Birth Complications

The baby of Mrs Pooja was born prematurely because of blood pressure fluctuations, and Mrs Pooja suffered. Because of the sudden premature C-Section delivery, the baby weighed around just 880 grams. The baby boy was suffering from extreme prematurity along with sepsis (a condition that occurs when the body's response to an infection damages its tissues), and jaundice. Continuing NICU treatment was advised for the baby to survive and the cost amounted to Rs.2,00,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Only). The family approached Child Help Foundation to save their little boy's life. The treatment was successful and the family lives happily with their healthy boy.



### **79. Kartik Naik,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Eleven-Year-Old and already in a heap of pain, Kartik Naik had the misfortune of being diagnosed with a severe heart condition. Doctors said that he would have to undergo a procedure called ICR of subaortic membrane resection, which came with the cost of Rs 2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). The mere mention of the amount sent a chill down the spines of his parents, who had no way of arranging the money. In such a dire situation, the donors stepped in and save the day for Kartik Naik. Today, the child looks forward to leading a normal life.

### **80. Bo Laya,** 3 Days Respiratory Disease

Kattekola had already been financially ruined by the treatment of his neurological disorder in 2017. The already faint glimmer of happiness in the family's life was the expected baby. However, the baby was born extremely weak. The baby needed a treatment consisting of a prolonged mechanical ventilator inotropic support, IV fluids, IV antibiotics, and ICD and warmer care. However, the treatment came with a cost of Rs.5,00,000 (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). Kattekola works at a garment shop and earns a minimum wage. However, after taking the help of Child Help Foundation, he was able to treat his baby boy.



# **81. Aliya Fatima,** 15 Years Kidney Disease

Aliya Fatima is a 15-year-old girl from West Bengal. When she was 14, Aliya developed a severe fever. The girl was diagnosed with End-Stage Renal Disease. It became a challenge for her family to continue her treatment, as her father is a driver. Doctors advised that a Kidney Transplant was her last hope of survival. After a lot of challenges, the family was striving to face this difficult phase of their life. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 10,30,000/-. The expense was too huge for the family to bear. They had already put everything they own at risk to save Aliya. However, with the help of generous donors and the support provided by Child Help Foundation, Aliya's surgery was successful.









# **82. Baby of Jahana,** 14 Days Premature Birth Complications

Mrs. Jahana faced some complications in her uterus during pregnancy and their baby was born prematurely in just 7 months. They had already lost their first child, who was also preterm. The second baby was in NICU stay and a fee of Rs. 3,00,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Only), was needed. The parents contacted Child Help Foundation for help to save their last hope. The treatment was successful and they were discharged on 18th June. The family happily lives with their daughter who is healthy now.



### **83. Krithik,** 4 Years Pneumonia

Krithik was diagnosed with pneumonia and needed urgent HHHFNC support to cure his disease. The family did everything to get their son cured but to no avail. After a few days, as his situation got worse and worse, the doctors advised them to go to Lotus Hospital, Hyderabad. The family thought their son would get treated successfully this time, but their world was shattered when they learned that the treatment fee was Rs. 7,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Lakhs Only). With no help from anywhere, the family reached out to Child Help Foundation to save their little boy. The surgery succeeded, and Krithik was discharged from the hospital on 26th September 2022.









# **84. Crespo,** 13 Years Spinal Deformity

Crespo Robert, a 13-year-old boy from Kerala, suffered from Spinal Deformity and eye disability since birth. The family had to sell their house for his eye treatment, after which his spine problems got worse. They went to Medical Trust Hospital, Kerala, for the overall treatment, which amounted to Rs. 7,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Lakhs Only). Since the family earned a meagre amount, they couldn't afford such costly surgery. Therefore, they approached Child Help Foundation. The operation was successful, and Crespo was discharged on 21st September 2022.



## **85. Baby of Harshada,** Infant Premature Birth Complications

Mrs Harshada gave birth to a small girl through a C-section delivery eight months after her pregnancy. Post-delivery, the baby was shifted to NICU stay, where it was discovered that she suffered from extreme premature conditions and Esophageal Atresia with TOF. The doctors at Neocare Hospital, Nashik, advised continued ventilator support as a part of her treatment which amounted to Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Only). The family reached out to our Foundation to save their little girl. The surgery succeeded, and the baby was discharged from the hospital on 7th September 2022.









### **86. Asna Mol Anas ,** 12 Years Scoliosis

Asna Mol Anas is a 12-year-old daughter of Mr Muhammed Anas and Mrs Ajmy Anas from Idukki, Kerala. After she complained about numbness in her back, she was taken to the hospital for tests and was diagnosed with Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis (a type of spinal deformity that causes the curvature of the spine). The doctors at the Medical Trust College advised a Spine Correction Surgery, the estimated cost of which was Rs. 7,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Lakhs only). Her father is an Autorickshaw driver and could not arrange money for a costly medical treatment. Child Help Foundation helped the family and Asna Mol is now on the path to recovery.



### **87. Lochan Bhandari,** 9 Years Heart Disease

9-year-old Lochan Bhandari who originally hails from Nepal but has been living in Bhiwandi, Thane, for the treatment of his heart defect. His medical diagnosis stated Mod-Severe TR, Small VSD, S/P VSD Closure. The doctors of Fortis Hospital, Mulund, Maharashtra advised Lochan to undergo a VSD closure, Redo TV Repair + residual VSd Closure + CT Scan surgery. The surgery was already delayed because of the family's financial conditions. The family found out about Child Help Foundation and reached out for help with the treatment costs worth Rs. 2,87,000/- (Rupees Two Lakh Eighty-Seven Thousand only). The surgery was done and Lochan has been discharged.









### 88. Ayaan Vishwakarma

#### 4 Years 4 Months Heart Disease

Ayaan was diagnosed with Tricuspid Atresia which is a type of congenital heart disease. The doctors in Varanasi advised the parents that Ayaan would get better treatment in Chennai, Tamil Nadu. He was admitted to MIOT International Hospital in Chennai and the doctors advised him to undergo complex Fontan Completion Surgery. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 4,25 000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Twenty-Five Thousand Only) COVID-19 had been difficult for the family financially. Ayaan needed urgent surgery, and his father had exhausted all his savings on his treatments and hospital visits. They reached out to Child Help Foundation for financial support. Ayaan's surgery was successful and he was discharged on 19th July 2022.



### **89. Sachin Kumar,** 8 Years Heart Disease

Sachin was one-year-old when he was diagnosed with a heart defect. The doctors informed the family that their son would need to undergo heart surgery in the future. When the boy turned eight, his health started deteriorating. He had difficulty breathing due to constant coughing. The doctors had advised him to undergo AVR (Aortic Valve Replacement) and VSD (Ventricular septal defect) closure surgery. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Only.) The family sufficed on minimum income and was financially incapable of arranging money for his treatment. They reached out to Child Help Foundation and Sachin's treatment was successful.









### **90. Nandini Kumari,** 5 Years Heart Disease

Five-year-old Nandini Kumari was diagnosed with a large-size VSD Sub valvular aortic stenosis (SAS). It is a rare disorder seen in infants which causes a fixed obstruction to blood flow. The doctors had suggested Nandini undergo a VSD closure PM VSD as a part of her treatment, the estimated cost of which was ₹ 2,30,000/-. The family couldn't afford the amount of the surgery and they needed financial support and approached Child Help Foundation. Nandini's surgery was successful and she was discharged on 2nd July 2022.



### **91. Harleen,** 2 Years Heart Disease

Harleen, a two-year-old baby of Mr Bhupinder Singh and Mrs Jasvir Kaur, was suffering from Diabetes, Thyroid, and Congenital Heart Disease (heart defect). With her condition worsening, the family took her to a hospital where the advised surgery was ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder), (VSD Ventricular Septal Defect) surgical closure. The cost, Rs. 3,75,000/-(Rupees Three Lakhs Seventy-Five Thousand Only), was too much for the family, which is why they approached Child Help Foundation. The surgery was performed, and the little girl was discharged on 3rd August 2022. The family lives happily together in their home.









### **92. Ritika,** 6 Years Scoliosis

Ritika was born with Thoracic Scoliosis with Sprengel Shoulder. One of her shoulder blades was higher than the other, restricting the normal movements of the shoulders. The doctors treating her suggested that she needed D4 to D8 pedicle screw instrumentation, B12 Face tectomy, deformity correction, and fusion with Sprengel shoulder release. The estimated cost of her treatment was Rs. 3,80,000. Ritika's father, being the only earning person in the family of seven members, was not able to afford the cost of her surgery and hence contacted Child Help Foundation for support. Ritika's surgery is done successfully and she is recovering gradually. She goes to the hospital for check-ups and follow-ups.



### **93. Zaid Shaikh,** 2 Months Knee Deformity

Knee deformity made life extremely difficult for the infant, Zaid Shaikh. Their parents relied on medications to help Zaid, but the only hope lay in treatment, which was beyond the means of parents as they were surviving with limited income. Zaid's father was the only breadwinner in the family of seven. The donors of Child Help Foundation made the treatment possible through their undue love and kindness. Today, Zaid runs and jumps around like a normal child.









## **94. Priti Padvi,** 2 Months Heart Disease

When Priti was born, she was healthy. However, two months later, her parents discovered she had some physical issues, so they took their daughter to the nearby hospital to find out what was wrong with her. Following a few tests and scans, Priti was diagnosed with Restricted Peri membranous Ventricular Septal Defect (VSD) which is a heart defect and was suggested to undergo surgery. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). Priti's surgery was done successfully at Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre, Maharashtra. After successful surgery, she was discharged on 23rd December 2022.



### **95. Jagdish Bharwad,** 6 Years Heart Disease

Jagdish was diagnosed with a congenital heart defect. Little Jagdish would suffer from severe pneumonia and would go into coughing fits. He suffered from the same painful symptoms and has been admitted to Balaji Heart and Diagnostic Centre in Nandurbar, Maharashtra. Doctors proposed an ICR of VSD Closure surgery for him, and the estimated cost was around Rs 3,30,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Thirty Thousand). The family sufficed on minimum income and was financially incapable of arranging money for his treatment. They reached out to Child Help Foundation and Jagdish's treatment was successful.









## **96. Kartik Kamble,** 6 Years Heart Disease

Kartik's parents were distressed to know that their baby boy had a hole in his heart. They went to multiple doctors looking for a cure but all of them suggested surgery. Unfortunately, due to a very poor financial condition and Kartik at a tender age, the family decided to wait till their son was a little older to go ahead with the surgery. Since then, he has been on medications to keep his health stable. Kartik was being treated at Balaji Hospital, Mumbai. The ICR surgery for VSD Closure. The estimated cost of this treatment was Rs. 2,50,000/-.(Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). The surgery was successfully done and Kartik was discharged on 3rd June 2022.



### **97. Bo Sushma,** 10 Months Spinal Defect

Sushma's baby was born with a spinal defect. The doctors at Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital in Bengaluru, Karnataka proposed Meningomyelocele Closure with tethered cord release. The estimated cost for the treatment was Rs. 1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lakh and Fifty Thousand Only). Shivprasad (father) is an Auto Driver. Somehow, the husband and wife managed the family struggles but medical treatment was a very costly affair for them. They approached Child Help Foundation. The operation was successful, and Bo Sushma was discharged on 21st December 2022.









### **98. Balaji,** 6 Years Kyphoscoliosis

Balaji was diagnosed with Congenital Kyphoscoliosis, a sideways curvature of the spine that was caused by a defect that was present at birth. The parents discovered the diagnosis a few years after his birth when Balaji started walking differently. His body was inclined to one side, and it caused him immense pain in everyday activities. Balaji was taking treatment at Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital, Karnataka. The doctors proposed Vertebral column resection to correct the spinal deformity. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lakhs Only). After taking the help of Child Help Foundation, The operation was successful and Balaji was discharged on 11th January 2023.



### **99. Hitvika,** 4 Years Heart Disease

Hitvika was suffering from Large Primum ASD and Moderate Mitral Valve Regurgitation, a kind of Congenital Heart Disease with small holes in her heart's interior and posterior positions. The family was asked to go to Care Hospital in Hyderabad for further treatment. The doctors at Care Hospital proposed a treatment for ASD closure and Mitral Valve Repair. Unable to understand the illness or the treatment, the family was shocked to know that it would cost them Rs. 3,00,000/-(Rupees Three Lakhs Only). With the help of Child Help Foundation, Hitvika's treatment was done successfully and she was discharged on 5th November 2022.









### **100. Khunal Dharni,** 10 Years Heart Disease

10-year-old Khunal was suffering from CHD Large Perimembranous VSD restricted. When taken to Care Hospital in Hyderabad, The doctors advised RCC Prolapse, Obstructed Muscle Bundle, as a part of Khunal's treatment. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). The family was in extreme distress as they had no savings left and were in debt which was preventing them from getting the necessary treatment for Khunal. Child Help Foundation thus came forward to provide help and all treatment or Operation was done successfully and he was discharged on 4th October 2022.



#### **101. Rayan Lijo,** 2 Years Congenital Neutropenia

Rayan Lijo, a two-year-old boy from Kerala, was suffering from Congenital Neutropenia. At 18 months old, he developed a severe skin infection and constant fever, which made his parents rush to the local hospital. When the family was told about the disease, and how it can turn an infection into a lifethreatening situation, their world came crumbling down. The doctors suggested Raya an Allogeneic peripheral blood stem cell transplant. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 35,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty-Five Lakhs Only). Rayan's father, being the only breadwinner in the family of five, could not afford such a huge amount for his surgery. Child Help Foundation came forward for Rayan Lijo and surgery was successfully done.







### **102. Bo Swetha, 7** Days Septic Shock

Swetha who hails from Telangana gave birth to a baby girl, who was later diagnosed with Sepsis/Septic Shock with the consolidation of the Right lower lobe. It was a lifethreatening organ dysfunction. The baby struggled to breathe, and the condition caused seizures. She was admitted to Disha Hospital, Telangana. The doctors proposed a prolonged NICU stay as initial treatment. The NICU stay alone required an estimated amount of Rs. 3,40,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Forty Thousand Only). Mrs Swetha and her husband, Mr Kukatpally Gnaneshwar spent all their savings and sold their belongings, to pay for the delivery. They reached out to Child Help Foundation for financial support. The treatment was successfully done and Bo Shewta was discharged on 1st October 2022.



### **103. Vignesh,** 7 Months Heart Disease

Vignesh was diagnosed with a complex heart defect when he was just two months old. His parents were informed that he would need heart surgery, but due to financial constraints, they could not afford it at that time. His parents had spent their life earnings on his medication so far. Vignesh's health was deteriorating, and he was taking treatment at the Apollo Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad. The doctors proposed an Intracardiac Repair surgery that was estimated up to Rs. 4,75,000/- (Rupees Four Lakh Seventy-Five Thousand Only). The family reached out to Child Help Foundation for help. We verified the medical case and helped the family, and the treatment was successfully carried out.





#### **104. Bo Aparna,** 3 Months Premature Birth Complications

Aparna's baby was born prematurely at 32 weeks and weighed less than 2 kgs. He was taken home but after 15 days, while being fed he started choking with a cough and had to be taken to the hospital immediately. After taking X-Rays, the baby was diagnosed with Pneumonia. The baby was admitted to the Rainbow Children's Hospital in Chennai, Tamil Nadu. The doctors said that he needed further treatment which would cost Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees six lakhs only). The doctors proposed HFNC support, IV fluid, IV antibiotics, nebulization, NG tube feeding and warmer care under observation for the patient. Donors of Child Help Foundation helped the baby to undergo treatment.



#### **105. Lavanya,** 14 Years Hermansky Pudlak Syndrome

Lavanya was diagnosed with Hermansky Pudlak Syndrome in 2021. It is a rare, genetic, multisystem disorder that could lead to severe lung disease. Lavanya had to go for her regular blood transfusion cycles every 20 days. Her body was growing weaker day by day and she could not live a regular childhood like many others. She was taking treatment at Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad. The doctors proposed a Haploidentical Stem cell Transplant for Lavanya. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 16,00,000/- (Rupees Sixteen Lakhs). Child Help Foundation helped Lavanya and treatment was successfully done.







### **106. Bilal Shaikh,** 14 Years Accidental Injuries

One day, Bilal had gone to an ice cream shop and accidentally came in contact with an Electrical Transmission Wire which had a load of 11kb. The parents immediately rushed him to a local hospital where the left side of his body was completely worn out. They referred Bilal to a Government Hospital in Chennai and he was left untreated for 2 hours after which his condition worsened and he lost consciousness. His wound debridement and flap cover of the scalp cost around Rs 20,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Lakhs Only). Bilal's father requested to Child Help Foundation for help. After verifying the medical reports, The treatment was successfully done on 21st January 2023



### **107. Keiron,** 2 Years 4 Months Leukemia

Cancerous blood became the cause of pain in the entire family of Keiron. The little one had to rely on painful chemotherapy. However, Keiron braved through it all and became cancer-free, with the help of donors who helped in paving the way for his treatment. Now the child lives a care-free life and rests with his parents. His parents are looking forward to raise their child and give him the best life possible.







#### **108. Jatin,** 6 Years B-Thalassemia Major

A few months ago, Jatin suffered from a continuous high fever and threw up blood. His parents were informed that their son was diagnosed with B-thalassemia major. This was the most terrifying news for the family. Jatin was admitted to HCG MSR Cancer Centre, Bengaluru. However, to survive, he needed to urgently undergo Allogeneic Stem Cell Transplant. His elder sister, Maithali was his donor. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakhs Only). Even after finding the cure, the family was helpless because they could not afford such a huge amount for the surgery. They had reached out to Child Help Foundation for help and Jatin's treatment was successful, and he was discharged on 21st January 2023.







### **109. Radha Lokhande,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Radha was diagnosed with Tricuspid Atresia, an inherited heart defect. The specialists suggested that Radha would have to undergo heart surgery. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs 4,50,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs and Fifty Thousand Only). Since the parents could not afford to pay a large sum of money for an operation, she was given temporary medical care every time Radha fell ill and would return home. Radha's illness continued through all of this and her condition only worsened with time. She was admitted to Fabiani and Budhrani Heart Institute in Pune, Maharashtra. After a few days, surgery was successfully done.





### **110. Shiv Dev,** 4 Years Cleft Lip

Four-year-old Shiv Dev was suffering from cleft lip and the only hope lay in urgent treatment, which came with a hefty price tag. This treatment was impossible, as the entire family lived on meagre incomes. However, when the situation seemed bleak, the donors became a superhero for the little one and helped him get out of his predicament. Today, Shiv Dev's complications have become a mere footnote in his life, as he continues to thrive and grow just like all his peers.



### **111. Shifa Tahimin,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Shifa was suffering from congenital heart disease. Somedays, she even had to skip school because of her unrelenting weakness. Doctors at Kamneni Hospital, Hyderabad said that Shifa needed to undergo VSD Surgical closure, and this procedure would cost Rs 4,75,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Seventy-Five Thousand Only). Mohmad Khaleel works as a contracted labourer and is the sole breadwinner of the family. His meagre income is barely enough to feed his family of six. However, after taking the help of Child Help Foundation, he was able to treat his little daughter. She was happily discharged on 10th April 2023.









### **112. Smarnika,** 5 Years Heart Disease

Five years of Smarnika's life were spent in dread, as she battled a deadly heart condition since she was born. Her treatment came with an enormous price tag. For her parents this was an enormous blow, as they survived on the income of a sole breadwinner, who was a farmer. However, now she lives a comfortable life, which was only made possible, with the help of kind donors, who poured their hearts out in support.



### **113. Twins of Pavithra,** 1 Month Premature Birth Complications

Pavithra's twins, a boy and a girl weighed only around 750 grams and 820 grams when they were born. They were admitted to the NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) of the Kovai Medical Center and Hospital Private Limited, Tamil Nadu. The twins were suffering from extreme preterm symptoms and respiratory distress syndrome. The doctors proposed Surfactant Therapy Parenteral Nutrition (CPAP) as a part of the baby's treatment. The estimated cost of the treatment was 12,00,000 /- (Rupees Twelve Lakhs Only). They had already mortgaged their small property to fund the treatment. The family reached out to Child Help Foundation to save their little twins.









# **114. B/O Sivgami,** 20 Days Premature Birth Complications

Sivagami Rangappanaikar was in severe pain on the night of 24th November 2022 when she delivered a premature baby boy in her 7th month of pregnancy. The complication was caused due to less blood circulation in her body. Baby of Sivagami was admitted to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of the Kovai Medical Center and Hospital Limited, Namakkal, Tamil Nadu. The doctors proposed a Parental Nutrition CPAP NICU Stay for the Extreme Preterm, Low Birth Weight Distress Syndrome of the patient. The estimated cost for the treatment was Rs 7,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Lakhs Only). Child Help Foundation came forward for help and treatment was successfully done and discharged on 14th February 2023.



#### **115. Divyanshu Kumar,** 1 Year Heart Disease

Divyanshu was born with a heart defect at a small community hospital where treatment was unavailable. After switching various hospitals at last, the parents admitted Divyanshu to Mahavir Heart Hospital in Bihar where the doctors informed them that Divyanshu was supposed to undergo Intra Cardiac Repair for VSD Closure Surgery a year ago and that the family had wasted a lot of time. His heart defect had worsened and he needed urgent surgery to survive. The Father, having no option left, turned to Child Help Foundation for the safety of his son's life. The treatment was done, and the little boy was discharged on 20th August 2022. The family lives happily together in their home.









### **116. Ruthra Sree,** 3 Years 8 Months Heart Disease

Ruthra Sree was detected with heart problems but the parents wanted to wait to undertake the treatment because of her tender age and lack of finances. However, when she started facing issues with breathing and discolouration in her skin due to prolonged sickness, she had to be hurried to the hospital. The doctors at MIOT International Hospital in Chennai, Tamil Nadu suggested an urgent operation (Elective ASD device closure) of the heart for correction. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs.1,90,000 (Rupees One Lakh and Ninety Thousand Rupees Only). The family could not find the means to pay for their child's treatment. Child Help Foundation came forward to help and operation was successfully done



### **117. Karan Zalke,** 9 Years Heart Disease

What started as mere fatigue and weakness, turned out to be a severe heart defect called Large Os ASD. Doctors suggested that Karan needed to undergo ICR of ASD Closure, but the cost of this treatment was Rs 2,50,000/-(Rupees Two Lakh Fifty Thousand Only). Karan's Father, Ukande earned a meagre income which was barely enough to cover the daily expenses of his family. He had no way of amassing such a huge sum of money. Child Help Foundation thus completed the necessary verification and helped the family in arranging funds for Karan Zalke.









### **118. Bo Shakuntala,** 21 Days Premature Birth Complications

Mrs Shakuntala Yadav went into labour at 7 months into her pregnancy and successfully gave birth to a baby boy. However, after the delivery, the doctors informed the parents that their newborn was suffering from prematurity and had a significantly low birth weight. Their little boy was put on ventilator support for 5 days. The doctors in Neo Clinic said that the treatment would cost Rs. 8,00,000/. Therefore they approached Child Help Foundation. After all the necessary verification, the donors of Child Help Foundation helped with the baby's treatment.



### **119. Krishant Chouhan** 1 Year 5 Months Sepsis

Kamlesh and Sonu, parents of Krishant thought a liver transplant would give their son a new chance at life. Little did they know that their worst troubles were just starting to form. After the transplant, it resulted in a blood infection and the doctors of Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad, diagnosed him with sepsis. For further treatments, Krishant required expensive antibiotics antifungals and immunoglobilin and the cost was Rs 15,00,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Lakhs Only). His father had already spent around Rs 21 lakh for his son's treatment but he had no option but to seek help. That's when Child Help Foundation with the help of our donors came to Krishant's aid and helped him in his successful treatment.









#### **120. Siddharth,** 11 Months Cervical Meningomyelocele

As an eleven-month-old orphan, Siddharth's situation looked extremely grim and dire. He was suffering from Cervical Meningomyelocele with Chiari and Holocord Syrinx, a rare spinal defect. Doctors said that he needed to undergo surgery, which would cost Rs 1,60,900/- (Rupees One Lakh Sixty Thousand Nine Hundred Only). The orphanage couldn't afford the treatment, as it also had to pay for the expenses of fifty children, residing on their premises. So, they reached out to Child Help Foundation. After this, the donors helped Siddharth to recover from his ailment



#### **121. Shrija,** 7 Years Heart Disease

The seven-year-old Shrija had never experienced a moment of comfort in her life due to her severe heart condition. At the mere age of seven months, Shrija had to undergo heart surgery. But her condition didn't improve and she required Intracardiac repair of Tetralogy of Fallot, PDA ligation along with right ventricle to pulmonary artery conduit surgery, which was worth Rs. 5,50,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Fifty Thousand only). Looking at the expense, the parents approached Child Help Foundation, and the donors saved the girl.

### **122. Shreya Ghorpade,** 5 Years Heart Disease

Being the daughter of a mere farmer, it seemed like Shreya's treatment was never going to happen. Coughing fits, severe back pain, severe weight loss, joint pain, and body weakness became the norm for her. Hope was dying out for Shreya. However, the love of donors and well-wishers proved everyone wrong, who with their donations and shares helped Shreya beat her heart disease.



#### **123. Rajeshwari,** 9 Years Heart Disease

Rajeshwari Sable is a nine-year-old girl from Telangana. Little Rajeshwari was suffering from a congenital heart defect. It troubled her with weakness, frequent colds and coughs and high fever growing up. She was advised to undergo heart surgery for her condition but financial constraints prevented the surgery. Rajeshwari's father, the sole breadwinner of the family managed to bring just Rs. 300 per day which was not enough for their monthly expenses. Arranging an amount of Rs. 4,75,000 was beyond their capabilities but Rajeshwari's surgery had to happen. During her tough times, your kindness stood with her and only with your support she received the required treatment and lives a healthy life. Thank you, donors!









#### **124. Aditya Binnar,** 12 Years Scoliosis

Aditya Binnar was bending due to his scoliosis, which was making daily life difficult for him. His condition could have been solved with Scoliosis Deformity Correction. The only problem was that it was worth Rs 6,50,000/- (Rupees Six lakhs Fifty Thousand). Adding to the parents' misery, The untimely rain washed away all their crops, which severely affected their income. It was at this moment, the donors stepped in and rescued Aditya from his condition. Today, Aditya looks forward to living a disease-free life.



#### **125. Kanaiya,** 10 Years Heart Disease

Kanaiya's woes started just three weeks after being born. After suffering from a high fever for a prolonged period, Kanaiya was diagnosed with a severe heart condition. For more than nine years, Kanaiya had been suffering from his condition, and the doctors at Fortis Hospital, Mulund said that he needed to undergo treatment which included CT Scan, Cardiac Catheterization, Fontan Procedure and Completion. The cost of the entire treatment was coming around Rs. 3,12,000/-. Kanaiya's father earned a meagre income as a daily wage labourer. Even in his wildest dreams, he couldn't imagine earning such a huge sum of money. When all hope seemed lost, kind and generous donors stepped in to save the day. Today, Kanaiya's health complications have become history.









### **126. Rishank,** 6 Years Epilepsy

Rishank, a six-year-old boy suffering from Drug-Resistant Epilepsy, was able to undergo the necessary Epilepsy Surgery at Fortis Hospital in Mumbai. The estimated cost of the surgery, amounting to Rs. 5,75,000, was covered, alleviating the financial burden on Rishank's family. As the sole breadwinner, Rishank's father had limited income, and the family was struggling to afford the treatment expenses. However, with the help of generous donations, Rishank received the medical intervention he urgently needed. The family is immensely grateful for the support and hopeful for a brighter future for their son.



### 127. Sangamesh, 15 Years

#### **Bone Cancer**

However, five years later, his condition began to deteriorate. His mother, Shankari had to quit her job to take care of her son. The entire financial burden fell on Dulal Patra who had to arrange 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakhs Only) for his son's bone marrow transplant at HCG/ MSR Cancer Centre. But his meagre income of 10,000/-, was not nearly enough for his son's treatment. But with the help of Child Help Foundation, Hitesh was able to undergo a much-needed bone marrow transplant.



#### **129. Midhun,** 2 Years Steroid Resistant Nephrotic Syndrome

Two-year-old Midhun from Kerala was suffering from Steroid Resistant Nephrotic Syndrome, a heterogeneous disease that includes an immune disorder. He was proposed for prolonged ICU and Ventilator support as treatment by the doctors. The estimated cost of the treatment was Rs. 10,00,000/-. Midhun's father, being the sole breadwinner of the family, was feeling hopeless as his minimal income was insufficient to even bear their monthly expenses, let alone the cost of the treatment. But with the help of kind donors like you, Midhun received the treatment right in time and today he is safe at home with his parents. Thank you for supporting Midhun during his miserable times.





#### **130. Gourav Kamble,** 10 Years Biliary Atresia

Biliary Atresia forced Gourav Rao to know the bitter taste of medications before baby food. Doctors suggested an urgent liver transplant for Gourav, which was beyond the means of his parents. His parents then approached Child Help Foundation for help, whose donors helped to raise money for Gourav's treatment.







### **131. Baby of Uma,** 10 Days Premature Birth Complications

### **132. Baby of Renuka,** 1 Day Premature Birth Complications

The baby was underweight and suffered from complications, including jaundice and respiratory difficulties. The doctors had recommended CPAP respiratory support and a two-month stay in the NICU. The baby's father, who worked as a cab driver, could not afford the prolonged medical care, so he reached out to us. Child Help Foundation extended support for the care of the child, and he received life-saving treatment, which was successful





### **134. B. O Rajimol,** 6 Days Premature Birth Complications

Born prematurely to Rajimol Shaji from Alappuzha, Kerala, this brave little fighter overcame the challenges that threatened his life. Thanks to the incredible support of Child Help Foundation (CHF), the baby received timely medical intervention and surgeries to address the lumps at the back of his head. Through the dedicated efforts of the medical team at Tiruvalla Medical Mission, Kerala, and the generous contributions of donors, the baby's health gradually improved. Today, this once fragile infant thrives, surrounded by the love and joy of his grateful family. This inspiring success story is a testament to the power of compassion and collective action in transforming lives.



### **135. Donica Reddy,** 3 Years Leukemia

Three-year-old Donica Reddy was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML). Her parents, Mr. Sumanth and Mrs. Theja faced the challenge of finding the best treatment for their daughter. They sought medical assistance at Swetha Hospital in Tirupati and Rainbow Hospital in Hyderabad, where Donica underwent chemotherapy. However, the doctors advised a bone marrow transplant as the next step. Her condition prevents her from walking and enjoying everyday activities. With the urgent need for an operation, her family turned to Child Help Foundation (CHF) for support. Thanks to the generosity of CHF and compassionate donors, Maheswari underwent a successful Hypoplastic Left Ventricle surgery at Care Hospitals in Banjara Hills, Hyderabad. #### **137. Madhu Priya,** 11 Years Heart Disease

Eleven-year-old, Madhupriya, was born with Ventricular Septal Defect, and despite her parents managing to pay for one surgery, she now required Complex Open Heart Surgery to close the hole in her heart. The cost of the life-saving surgery was Rs. 3,50,000/-. Overwhelmed by the financial burden, the Gudeli family turned to Child Help Foundation (CHF) for assistance. With the generous support of CHF and compassionate donors, Madhupriya underwent the necessary surgery at Care Hospitals in Banjara Hills, Hyderabad, ensuring her smile, childhood, and bright future.

Just three months after Tanuj's birth, he was diagnosed with a dreadful heart disease. Pneumonia and coughing hampered his days, making every day pass with misery. 2. Ajwal, 3 Years
Heart Disease

Ajwal has been diagnosed with 'CTGA Intact Ventricular Septum S/p PA Banding', a severe heart condition. It all started when his parents noticed that he was losing a lot of weight. After rushing him to the doctors, the parents found out that their child was in such a sorry state. Even after undergoing surgery, Ajwal's condition has not improved. Now, the doctors at Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences in Tamil Nadu have said that the child needs to undergo Cardiac CT, Double Switch Operation, and Tricuspid Valve Repair. The estimated cost of the treatment is coming around Rs. 6,00,000/-(Rupees Six Lakhs Only).

Ajwal's father, Ajesh toils day and night as a construction worker and makes scanty income. He is the sole breadwinner in his family of six. He has exhausted all his savings for his son's treatment, but it hasn't been enough.

# **3. Huzefa Khan, 11 Years Old** Thalassemia Major

Huzefa needs an urgent stem cell transplant but the estimated cost of it is Rs. 10,50,000/- (Rupees Ten lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). Mr Ajmal Khan and his family live in Jalgaon, Maharashtra. He works at a construction site and earns up to Rs. 17,000/- per month. Mr Ajmal is the sole breadwinner in the family of five. The family has used all their savings for Huzefa's blood transfusions. They are in debt as they borrowed a huge amount of money from their friends and relatives.

Please help the family in distress and save their son, Huzefa.



**4. Aditya Raut, 13 Year Old**Familial Hypercholesterolemia Type-1

Aditya Raut, a 13-year-old boy from Ahmednagar, Maharashtra is suffering from a complex ailment - Familial HypercholesterolemiaType-1.

Mrs Archana Raut, Aditya's mother was in distress as she said "He was just five years old when we noticed these blisters, we tried every home remedy but none of them helped. His appetite had decreased suddenly, and we were worried about what this disease could be?"

Only a liver transplant can save Aditya. He was taken to Nanavati Max Super Speciality Hospital, Mumbai, Maharashtra for advanced treatment, but he could not get started with his treatment as the estimated cost of the transplant stated is Rs. 16,50,000-(Rupees Sixteen Lakhs and Fifty Thousand Only). The family has spent all their savings on Aditya's treatment so far and he has not recovered yet. They need you in these times of distress so they can save their son.





# **5. Aleena, 3 Years**Transfusion Dependent Thalassemia Major

Aleena is the only daughter of Mr Akbar and Mrs Anjum. They belong to Gadag, Karnataka. Mr Akbar (father) works as a labourer and earns about Rs. 8,000/-monthly (Rupees Eight Thousand Only). Mrs Anjum works on a farm. They make very little money only to support their family. Everything was going smoothly until one day when the parents observed their daughter was not feeling well and took her to the closest medical aid. After performing a few tests, the doctors diagnosed Aleena with Transfusion Dependent Thalassemia Major. The experts recommended that Aleena receive blood transfusions every 15 days.

Despite the blood transfusion, Aleena's condition did not heal. The doctors then recommended her to undergo a bone marrow transplant. At the moment, Aleena is admitted to Narayana Hospital, Karnataka. The estimated cost of the treatment is 28,00,000/- (Twenty-Eight Lakhs Only). They need your support.



### **6. Khadija Gaonkhadkar, 5 Year** Urinary Infection

Five-year-old Khadija is the elder daughter of Mr Salam and Mrs Mueena from Maharashtra. Khadija is suffering from Urinary Incontinence. Khadija is currently getting treatment at Surgical Urology and Multispeciality Hospital, Maharashtra. The doctors have advised a treatment called Augmentation Ileocystoplasty and Bladder Neck Reconstruction Mitrofanoff procedure.

The estimated cost of the treatment is Rs. 3,00,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Only). Khadija's parents have spent lakhs of rupees on the treatment so far; they had to borrow the money from different places resulting in a massive debt on their shoulders. The family is in dire need of your help; please support.





# **7. Varshith, 5 Years** Aplastic Anemia

After a successful Bone Marrow Transplant, Mr. and Mrs. Reddy felt that their kid's life would return to normal and they would be able to live happily, but their dreams shattered again when little Varshith complained to them of severe fever. Worried, they admitted him to Sri Ramachandra Medical Centre, Chennai, Tamil Nadu where after a few check-ups, he was diagnosed with Aplastic Anemia. The parents were devastated when the doctors informed them about the severity of this disease. For them, their little boy had gone through enough, which made this situation unbearable.

Varshith needs chemotherapy and Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplantation (HSCT) as a part of his treatment which is estimated up to 30,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty Lakhs Only). The family sold everything they owned to afford Varshith's previous treatment. Now they have left with nothing to arrange for this huge sum of money. The Reddy family is in dire need of your support. Please help them save their loving son.



**8. Dheeraj, 4 Year** Aplastic Anemia

It was a typical sunny day in Cherai, Kerala when suddenly four-year-old Dheeraj fell ill. Days went by, and Dheeraj got sicker than before. His condition worsened, and his parents had to admit him to the Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences in Kerala. The doctors there diagnosed little Dheeraj with severe Aplastic Anemia. The doctors there proposed an Immuno Suppressive Therapy, that would cost around Rs 8,00,000/-(Rupees Eight Lakh Only).

Dheeraj's father, Vishuraj is a daily wage labourer and earns a meagre daily wage. Greeshma, the mother of Dheeraj, is a daily wage labourer as well but mostly stays at home due to Dheeraj's worsening condition. Dheeraj's parents have already spent a whopping three lakh rupees on his diagnosis. They mortgaged their only house and are now living with their in-laws. They have exhausted all their savings and are struggling to get by each day.





**9. Amulya, 9 Years** Thalassemia Major

Amulya is the 9-year-old daughter of Mr Ramanjaneya and Mrs E Lalitha Kumari. They hail from Nayakanahatti in Bengaluru, Karnataka. The mother and father both work as labourers to run their family of six members. The father himself is a heart patient and he keeps ill on most days. With great difficulties, they manage to earn around Rs. 5000/- per month.

The youngest child of the family, Amulya has been diagnosed with Thalassemia Major. She is on medication and also undergoes blood transfusion every 15 days. The family has made all efforts in the monthly treatment by selling off the small number of possessions they owned and also by taking loans from acquaintances. They have nothing left for the upcoming treatment of their daughter. Amulya is being treated at the Narayana Hospital in Bengaluru. The doctors have recommended a Bone Marrow Transplant which costs Rs. 21,30,000/-(Rupees Twenty One Lakhs and Thirty Thousand Only). The family is in great distress. They need your support. Help this family save their child.



**10. Inayath, 7 Years** Thalassemia Major

Gulam Mahmood still remembers the eighteenth day of April 2015, when the eldest son in his family was born. He still fondly remembers little Inayath's first cry. But Gulam Mahmood never thought even in his nightmare that Inayath would suffer from deadly Thalassemia Major. Inayath, who is seven years old now suffers from coughing fits, severe pneumonia, severe weight loss, blood loss, and extreme body weakness. He needs blood transfusions every ten to fifteen days. Currently, he is admitted to the Narayana Hospital in Bengaluru, Karnataka. The doctors there have proposed a Haplo match TCR Alpha/ Beta and CD 45RA depletion therapy, which would cost an estimated Rs. 38,80,000/- (Thirty-Eight Lakhs Eight Thousand Only)

Gulam works at a nearby shop and earns a meagre salary. He is the only breadwinner in the family. It is at this moment that the family needs support from generous donors like you. So please come forward and donate generously to the medical crowdfunding case.





**11. Zubia Sayed, 9 Years** Fanconi Anemia

Little Zubia who is nine years old now suffers from coughing fits, seizures, severe pneumonia, severe weight loss, blood loss, and extreme body weakness. She is currently admitted to the Rainbow Children's Hospital in Hyderabad, Telangana. The doctors there have proposed a Haploidentical stem cell transplant (HSCT) support therapy, costing an estimated Rs. 25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Lakhs Only).

Zubia's parents, Mohd. Waseuzzama Sayed and Humera Khanam both belong to the lower middle-class category. Zubia's father used to work at a shop as a supervisor but lost his job due to COVID-19. It is extremely difficult for them to manage their living expenses at this moment. They live in a small dingy room on Balepir Beed, Maharashtra's outskirts. Moreover, little Zubia has two younger siblings. At this moment, the family needs support from generous donors like you. So please come forward and donate generously to the medical crowdfunding case.



**12. Ashok, 17 Years** Kidney Disease

Ashok is the 17-year-old son of Mr Mune Gowda and Mrs Nagaveni from Bengaluru, Karnataka. Mr. Mune Gowda is the sole breadwinner of the family who had to leave his minimum-paying work as a labourer three months ago because he met with an accident. The family has turned to you for help. Today, Dhruva is in the hospital and has to rely on antibiotics. His father, Prabhu, is the sole breadwinner of the family and works as a freelance graphic designer. His income range is something around Rs 10,000. Out of which Rs 4,000 goes to paying the house's rent. He has to manage his family of four, with whatever income is left with him.

He is completely powerless to help his son right now. Please come to the aid of Dhruva and save him.



**14. Nasrin Parvin, 9 Years** Thalassemia Major

It all started when Manuwara noticed that Nasrin's stomach had taken a grotesque structure due to swelling, and her eyes and skin were yellow. Their condition was beyond the means of their local doctor, so they had to take her to a bigger hospital. After undergoing a genetic test, it was confirmed that Nasrin was suffering from Thalassemia

Every month she has to go for blood transfusions, and she also has to undergo body tests after fixed intervals.

The entire financial burden of the family is carried out by Lal Mahammad, who works as a craftsman.

Doctors have said that Nasrin needs a bone marrow transplant, which will cost around 34,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty-Four Lakhs Only). Please save Nasrin from her gruesome disease, and allow her to live the carefree childhood she deserves





**15. Anvika Pandit, 1 Year 5 Months**Germ Cell Tumor

Anvika is a one-year-five-month-old baby girl. When Anvika was only nine months old, she was diagnosed with a Germ Cell Tumor. She lives with her parents, Mr Yogesh and Mrs Chitralekha in Shahapur, Maharashtra. Anvika underwent a biopsy (procedure to remove tissue) when she was one year old, but unfortunately, that was not the ultimate solution. After many chemotherapy sessions, the doctors at Fortis Hospital, Mumbai, Maharashtra have suggested surgery followed by multiple chemotherapy cycles. The estimated cost of the treatment is Rs. 9,75,000/- (Rupees Nine Lakhs Seventy-Five Thousand Only).

Anvika's father, the sole breadwinner in the family of five, earns a minimum salary that hardly covers their monthly expenses, much less the daily medications of his daughter. With time, medical expenses have exhausted Anvika's parents' savings. Now, they have no other source to get money, hence, they have turned to you for help. Please help the Pandit family in times of need and save their daughter.



**16 Mohd Shazin K.P, 16 Years** Thalassemia Major

Mohd. Shazin is the 16-year-old son of Mr. Abdul Gafoor and Mrs. Sahida hailing from Kannur, Kerala. Shazin was diagnosed with Thalassemia Major, a blood disorder when he was one year old. Since then, blood transfusions every two weeks have been necessary for him to survive. Shazin often falls sick with a high fever, cough, and cold, his body is growing weak and has to miss school and other activities most days. The doctors at Narayana Hospital, Bengaluru, Karnataka have proposed a Bone Marrow Transplant worth Rs. 25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakhs Only).

Shazin's younger sister is the donor for the transplant but unfortunately, the excessively high cost of treatment is preventing them from moving ahead with the transplant. Shazin's father is a truck driver and earns Rs. 500/- a day. He is the sole breadwinner in the family of six. It is nearly impossible for Shazin's family to arrange such a huge amount. Please help the family to save their son. Any amount donated will push Shazin further towards a healthy life. Please help him.





#### 17. Satyam Potdar, 9 Years Leukemia

It all started two years ago when Satyam was taken down by a high fever, upon taking him to the doctors, they said that his platelet count was exponentially high. They asked the parents to take him to another hospital. It was there they found out that Satyam was suffering from Relapsed `B` Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia.

Every Alternate Day, Satyam has to go to Shri Siddhivinayak Ganapati Cancer Hospital in Miraj, Maharashtra for check-ups. According to the doctors, he needs to undergo an Allogenic Bone Marrow Transplant, which comes with a cost of Rs. 12,00,000/- (Rupees Twelve Lakhs Only). Ghanshyam works as a driver and only earns enough to feed his family of four. He has managed to pay the medical bills by taking loans. The only way Satyam can be saved is through your kindness and generosity.

Spare as much as you can for Satyam's sake and allow him to live a healthy childhood.



**18. Pradnay Kodale, 10 Months** Leukemia

It all started when Pradnay was taken down by a fever, which didn't recede even after antibiotics. Later, the infant developed swelling in his body. After undergoing numerous tests, it was discovered that he was suffering from blood cancer.

Pradnay's treatment would cost Rs 6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lakhs Only). Pradnay's father earns a meagre income, out of which he has to pay for the expenses of his family of four. He has already spent one lakh rupees on his son's treatment by exhausting his savings and borrowing from his family members.

#### **BABY FEEDING CENTER**

Child Help Foundation initiated the Baby Feeding Centre (BFC) program to address the need for private and hygienic spaces for mothers to breastfeed their infants in public buildings and spaces. The objective was to provide a safe and comfortable environment for breastfeeding mothers, promoting maternal and child health. BFCs were constructed across various hospitals and railway stations in Maharashtra, Bihar, and Kerala as part of the foundation's SDG3 program.

In Maharashtra, Child Help Foundation established three Baby Feeding Centers (BFCs) in collaboration with different organizations. The first BFC was inaugurated at Cama & Albless Hospitals on November 29th 2022, in partnership with Alkem Foundation The second center was inaugurated at St. George's Hospital on December 9th 2022, in collaboration with IDBI Trusteeship. The third BFC was setup at Urban Health Centre in Bandra on March 23rd 2022, with the support of the IDBI Trusteeship. These BFCs aimed to provide private and hygienic spaces for breastfeeding mothers in hospitals, promoting maternal and child health in Maharashtra.

In Bihar, a BFC was inaugurated in 2019 at Katihar Railway Station, catering to the needs of breastfeeding mothers in the region.

In Kerala, BFCs were set up at Lakeshore Hospital, Ernakulam General Hospital, and Chottanikkara Temple. These centers witnessed significant utilization, with a total average of 50 mothers benefiting from the three centers each day.

The implementation of BFCs in various locations aimed to ensure the safety and hygiene of infants and mothers, aligning with Child Help Foundation's focus on maternal and child care. The foundation plans to construct more Baby Feeding Centers across India to support the well-being of mothers and infants.

The total beneficiaries from Baby Feeding Centres constructed across India are 31,991

#### **Awareness Session**

#### Jawhar and Dahanu, Maharashtra

On 10th September 2022, A Mental Health session was conducted in Boisar, Maharashtra. Ms Chris Shenoy and Ms Neha Singh, project team members, honoured the guests, Adv. Sayukta (advocate) and Vaishali Parmar (Clinical Psychologist). There was an intense need for spreading mental well-being among the students due to the suicide committed and attempts made by the students in ITDP Schools in Palghar District, Maharashtra. Vaishali Parmar presented a PowerPoint about the different types of counselling therapy, which was a guideline for teachers to understand the psychological thoughts of children. On the other hand, Adv Sayukta stressed the importance of intervention to focus on increasing suicide rates. She also explained what preventive measures can be taken. The participants were impressed by the knowledge of the guests and wished for more workshops in the future. The teachers and the superintendents felt the utmost need for the programme and considered this as guidance for intervening in this issue in the schools at their level.

#### **Jawhar**

Considering the dire need for mental health well-being in the ITDP Schools at Jawhar, Maharashtra to cater for the psychological needs of the students; another Mental Health Session was conducted in the month of September at Jawhar, Maharashtra. Ms. Meena Lokhande (POSH trainer) and

Mr. Subhash Pardesi (Asst. PO in ITDP) helped with the arrangement of the events. Adv. Sharada Shinde, Ms. Snehalata Athaide (Counsellor) and Ms. Shradha Shringarpure (Clinical Counsellor) were guests for the day. Adv. Sharada Shinde gave an excellent talk on the roles and responsibilities of schools when it comes to the prevention of suicide. While Ms. Snehalata lent her expertise to explain the warning signs of suicide and how to prevent it. Finally, Ms. Shradha Shringarpure relayed information about strategies to prevent suicide. The LTPCT Representatives, Mr. Shamuvel and Dr. Kalyani Meshram also talked about this crucial topic. It was concluded that mental health awareness, regular camps and counselling support for students is of utmost importance.

#### **Ration Kit Distribution**

#### Mulund, Maharashtra

On March 24th, 2023, World Tuberculosis Day, Child Help Foundation took a significant initiative to support 40 children in Mulund, Maharashtra who were affected by TB. The distribution of these kits aimed to provide comprehensive support to the children affected by TB, addressing their medical, nutritional, and educational needs. By becoming a Nikshay Mitra and joining the PradhanMantri TB Mukt Bharat campaign, Child Help Foundation demonstrated its commitment to fighting tuberculosis and ensuring the well-being of the affected children.



Child Help Foundation recognizes the significance of education and actively works towards providing primary education to economically disadvantaged sections of society through its 9 Child Care Institutes (CCIs) across the country. Through these efforts, the lives of 351 children have been positively impacted by receiving support for their education.

Child Help Foundation understands the importance of protecting children from any harm or adverse influences. Child Care Institutions serve as a social safety net, ensuring essential services such as emergency outreach, institutional care, family and community-based care, counselling, and support for underprivileged children. By providing a nurturing environment and opportunities for positive childhood experiences, the foundation strives to help children build their personalities and thrive.

The CCIs organize various activities throughout the year to engage and inspire the children. Special occasions like Teachers' Day, Women's Day, Republic Day, and Independence Day are celebrated with

enthusiasm. Drawing, Dance, Elocution competitions, and other educational and entertaining activities are conducted to promote the students' spirit and overall development. Additionally, awareness sessions on social issues such as early child marriages, child safety, mental health, and the importance of education are organized, empowering the children with knowledge and instilling important values.

Child Help Foundation's ultimate goal is to provide equal opportunities to all children, irrespective of their socio-economic background. It recognizes that many underprivileged children in India face barriers such as limited access to schools and a lack of parental support for education. # EDUCATION SUPPORT AND STATIONERY KIT DISTRIBUTION

#### **Education Support in Chennai**

A Tuition Centre was conducted regularly in Chennai, Tamil Nadu for underprivileged children. These children were majorly from the slum pockets of Chennai who were unable to pay the normal tuition fees. As a token of appreciation for their performances in studies in spite of tough circumstances, on the 15th of July 2022, 81 underprivileged students were supported with stationeries viz. notebooks, files, pens, pencils, scales, and erasers in Chennai. The initiative was led by Mr Jagadhees, a project team member.

#### **Tuition Classes in Bihar**

Child Help Foundation supported a tuition centre run by Mr Ramvilas in Lalmanpatti, Supaul, Bihar. The age group of the children attending the centre is between 8 and 15. These children in the village are given the opportunity to attend extra classes near their place of stay. Classes are conducted in a space that is given for free by a wellwisher. The teacher teaches difficult subjects like Maths, Science and English. The classes are conducted in the morning from 6 to 9 am. Mr. Sharwan Kumar is a teacher who conducts the classes. These classes encourage children to go to school. The purpose of the tuition is to help the underprivileged children who are weak in the subjects. 43 students attended these classes.











# EDUCATION SUPPORT AND STATIONERY KIT DISTRIBUTION

Mr Sharwan Kumar is a teacher who conducts tuition classes for underprivileged children in Sikrahata, Supaul, Bihar. The age group of the children is between 8 and 15. Classes are conducted in a rented place. The teacher teaches Mathematics, Hindi, English, and History to the children. A total of 50 children attend the classes on a regular basis.

# **Nutanix-**Sakhare Ashram School & Bhopoli Ashram School

demonstrates the positive impact of the program on their educational journey.

Moving forward, CHF wants to remain dedicated to supporting the fellows and providing continued assistance to the students as they pursue their educational aspirations. We are confident that with our collective efforts, we can empower more children and pave the way for their future success.





# Capacity Building Workshop in Schools, Dimapur, Nagaland

During the academic year 2022-2023, a workshop on Capacity Building in Schools for students was organised by Child Help Foundation in two schools by coordinator Yashika at the Dimapur Branch, Nagaland. Parents' meetings, Teachers' meetings, Outdoor activities related to learning word identification, art and craft activities, and School library set-up was conducted. As a result, the students have increased their interest in studies and have developed their language. This project was ended in the month of December 2022.

In the month of January 2023, a survey was conducted. The survey was preliminary work to launch the new project program with a special focus on the Government Primary School. It was to generate specific information from the target population or household, to involve the community in Children's Education, and to assess and evaluate the success and failure of the project. The survey through PRA exercises is conducted in a focused manner on specific themes such as Community Situation Analysis, Livelihood Analysis, Education and Local Services.





#### **EDUCATIONAL KITS**

# **Stationery Kit Distribution -** Nagaland

The project is to build a core education team within CHF to work in a long-term and sustained manner with communities and schools to improve communities' commitment to education as well as the quality of education in Government Primary schools in Dimapur District of Nagaland. The team will focus on primary education, particularly on language and mathematics. The manner of teaching is through enjoyable learning. These methods of interactive learning were used to teach mathematics and language to 100 students at the Government Primary schools in the Dimapur District of Nagaland. Our volunteers also distributed stationery kits and school bags to the students in the month of September 2022.















# IMPROVING COMMUNITIES' COMMITMENT TO EDUCATION

#### **Education Project -** Dimapur, Nagaland

In the month of January 2023, the Nagaland Centre for Human Development and Information Technology (NCHD-IT) planned a research-based analysis of the situation with PRA. This survey is preliminary work to launch a new project program with a special focus on the government primary school. It was to generate specific information from the target population or household, to involve the community in Children's Education, and to assess and evaluate the success and failure of the project. The Village Council and SMC showed a very positive acceptance and assurance of their participation in the project program. Parents' negligence of children's studies is because of their economic background wherein most parents work as daily wagers. Additional assistance in TLRM like digitization of the teaching systems will attract children.

The project was implemented to improve the Quality of Education in Government Primary Schools in Dimapur District. The objective is to make the community stakeholder responsible for children's education, to implement Experiential Learning in Schools, to stop dropouts, to improve learning and increase the motivation to attend school. Also that the manuals and curriculums are replicated by the teaching staff in the schools.

Observation and informal visits to families and interaction with families helped us to familiarize ourselves with the community members. The team also mapped the families' socioeconomic settings. It was found that 95% of families are daily wage earners, and the rest have petty shops like tailoring, vegetable vendors etc. They reached out to 50 parents and 70 children.

The reception to the program has been overall positive. Children and parents loved the initiative as it has been proven to be helpful in their learning experience.







#### ADDITIONAL EDUCATION SUPPORT

#### **Summer Vacation Teaching**

During the summer vacation period from 1st May 2022 to the 15th of June 2022, Child Help Foundation has implemented a program to provide additional educational support to students from Murbad, Wangani, Sakhare, and Bhopoli Schools in Maharashtra. This initiative aims to make productive use of the vacation time by offering various activities such as extra classes, home visits, student and parent counselling, family counselling, case studies, testimonials, and more. The Centre for Excellence teachers from Child Help Foundation have been deployed to different locations, including villages, field sites, and factory sites. They are conducting classes and educational sessions for students in their respective homes or any available spaces. The feedback received from both students and teachers indicates that the concept of summer vacation teaching has been beneficial and useful for enhancing the student's education. The additional classes during the vacation period provide students with an opportunity to strengthen their academic skills, revise important concepts, and explore new areas of knowledge. The personalized attention received through home visits allows teachers to better understand the individual learning needs of each student and tailor their teaching accordingly. Moreover, the counselling sessions for students and parents aim to address any academic or personal challenges they may be facing. By providing guidance and support, Child Help Foundation aims to empower both students

and their families to overcome obstacles and make informed decisions regarding their education. Additionally, case studies and testimonials may be conducted to highlight success stories and inspire other students. These activities showcase real-life examples of individuals who have overcome challenges and achieved academic success. serving as motivation for other students to strive for excellence. Overall, the summer vacation teaching program organized by Child Help Foundation aims to maximize the educational opportunities available to students during their break from regular school. By providing additional support, counselling, and engaging activities, the foundation aims to create a conducive learning environment and contribute to the holistic development of the students.

At the end of the program, snacks were distributed, and students actively participated in the program. According to the feedback received from the school, the students enjoyed and liked the program very much.

### About 83 students participated in these competitions.

3 winners of each competition were felicitated with gifts, trophies and certificates. At the end of the program, snacks were distributed to all the students of Vangani Ashram School. According to the feedback received from the school, the students enjoyed and liked the program very much and were able to reflect on the social issues and culture that they are very much in touch with.













#### **ENHANCING ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE**

#### **Motilal Oswal Foundation**

The project is currently being implemented in the Government Ashram Schools of Murbad and Vangani in Maharashtra. Every year approx. 1200 students are benefiting from this centre. The project aims at providing extra classes in Math, Science, and English to the students of Std. 8th, 9th, and 10th. Through this project; training was conducted for the teachers on how to teach effectively with basic communication and practical skills.

The Teacher's Training Workshop, one of the objectives of the project, included the methods of creativity and activity-based teaching like showing documentaries related to the topic, having role-plays, and involving them in chart making. There are various methods of maintaining discipline in class and involving children in making rules to maintain discipline in class and planning for the lectures. The specialized trainers in education explained Bloom's taxonomy to the teachers and how they could implement it.

The inauguration of the project was conducted on 5th October 2021. Child Help Foundation with the support of MOF donated a television set and a water purifier to the school. Three new teachers are appointed for English, Maths and Science subjects who will be attending the school regularly and help students with extra coaching and brush up their basic knowledge on these subjects. They will also help the students to clear their doubts and will be teaching the students using activity methods.

Improvement in Academic Performance-Individual and School


After the implementation of the MOF project in Wangani Ashram School, the performance of the school in the academic year 2022–2023 is 100% which was 47.54% earlier.


In Murbad Ashram School, the school performance in the academic year 2022–2023 is 90.10% which was earlier 79.35%.

The individual performance of students in both Ashram schools for the academic year of 2022–2023 is significantly better

Earlier before the implementation of MOF project individual performance of students was between 60% to 70%, but now after the implementation of MOF project individual performance has increased above 70%

#### **ENHANCING ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE**

Post-COVID, schools have not recruited teachers for Maths, Science, and English. After implementing the MOF project, we appointed qualified and trained teachers for these subjects. Project teachers taught them during school hours and also during extra hours of school, as there were no teachers in the school during school hours. This had a positive effect on the student's studies and the students scored better in their exams.

Reduced the rate of dropout – Students got strong support from project teachers for easy learning. Also, the project teachers are very helpful, friendly, and supportive to the students. As a result, school dropout rates were reduced and regularity of attendance developed among students

Reduced Water Borne Diseases- A water purifier was donated to Murbad Ahsram School under MOF project, as a result, water-borne diseases like Cholera, Typhoid, Diarrhoea, and Hepatitis A reduced, which affect positively on students' attendance.

Created awareness about menstrual health management among adolescent girls - Under the MOF project, there was an awareness session on MHM along with the distribution of sanitary pads in both ashram schools.

Mobile Booster & Digital Classroom Set-Up-Due to poor network connectivity in Vangani Ashram School, mobile boosters and digital classrooms were set up there. As a result, students used the facilities for their online studies post-Covid.

Home Tuitions were provided in summer and Diwali Vacations- During summer and Diwali vacations, MOF project teachers provided home tuition with the aim of imparting education without any gaps. The initiative had a positive effect on students.

Increased participation in extracurricular activities -Extracurricular activities like children's gatherings, awareness sessions, celebrations of notable occasions, and competitions organized by project teachers had given students the confidence to participate in activities. Now students are actively participating in events, competitions, and activities with their best performance even in inter-school competitions.

Information and knowledge related to various concepts through awareness sessions –Awareness sessions were conducted in both ashram schools. Resulting that, students have gained information and knowledge about the prevention of COVID-19, Sexual Reproduction Health, HIV/AIDS, Child Labour Prohibition and Gender Equality.

**Self Defence Training** - Murbad Ashram School, Murbad, Maharashtra

### **CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION**

Diseases are rampant in areas where cleanliness is still a dream. For a healthy society, it is absolutely necessary for the surroundings to be clean. Child Help Foundation wants everyone to enjoy clean amenities.

Toilets have reached 100 more people and 994 people got access to clean drinking water in the year 2022-23. Sanitary napkins were also distributed to 2,105 girls in order to promote menstrual hygiene.

#### Toilet Construction, Odisha

In the month of May 2022, Child Help Foundation (CHF) embarked on a significant initiative to construct two toilets in Sahapur village, Odisha. The focus of this project was to address the pressing need for proper sanitation facilities for the girls studying at Hemachandra Sanskrit Vidyalaya. The construction of these toilets aimed to provide a safe and hygienic environment for the girls, ensuring their comfort and well-being.

Access to clean and functional toilets is not only a basic necessity but also plays a vital role in promoting good health and maintaining proper hygiene practices. CHF, in collaboration with local authorities and community members, successfully completed the construction of the toilets. The design and construction adhered to high-quality standards to ensure durability and functionality. The facilities were strategically located within the school premises, ensuring easy access for the girls.

The implementation of these toilets has had a profound impact on the lives of

approximately 100 beneficiaries, primarily the girl students of Hemachandra Sanskrit Vidyalaya. The provision of these facilities has significantly enhanced their educational experience by addressing a fundamental need that was previously lacking.

By having access to proper sanitation facilities, the girls can now attend school with greater confidence and comfort. They no longer need to worry about the lack of suitable restroom facilities, which often posed challenges to their health and hygiene. The construction of these toilets has empowered the girls to focus on their education without the distractions and discomfort associated with inadequate sanitation.

### Baseline survey on Menstrual Health Management (MHM) -Mumbai, Maharashtra

Project team member Ms Neha Y. Singh conducted a baseline survey on Menstrual Health Management (MHM). A total of 100 women participated in the survey event. The purpose of the survey was to understand the practice followed by women and girls during their periods. Whether they use sanitary pads during their cycle or clothes. Awareness and discussion sessions were also held to give a better understanding of sanitation and safe methods to be followed during menstruation. A survey form was filled out by the participants and the results were a 50/50 chance of women in the local communities using both pads as well as cloth during menstruation





# Role Play on Menstrual Health Management

On 2nd July 2022, a role-play on menstrual health management was conducted. The skit was organized for the telecampaigners at Mira Road office in Maharashtra. Through the skit, they learned how to tie paper bags to securely dispose of sanitary napkins, preventing any discomfort or unhygienic situations. The exercise emphasized the significance of proper disposal in maintaining personal hygiene and a clean environment. Through this role play and exercise, the telecampaigners at the Mira Road office gained knowledge, practical skills, and empowerment to promote menstrual health management and educate others about the importance of proper disposal practices.

### **VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT**

India lives in an unfortunate state where certain regions are marred by inequity. While metropolitan cities like Mumbai, Delhi, Bengaluru, and Kolkata are booming with opportunities, there are some areas where people have to struggle for their daily bread. Most of these areas are given the term 'rural areas'.

Therefore it is necessary to make the villagers independent and help them to stand on their own two feet. Child Help Foundation understands the severity of this issue and has helped many villages. We have set up self-help groups, business centers, training sessions etc.

Through Village Development programme, Child Help Foundation aims to bring prosperity and development to the remotest regions of India. We bring jobs, business opportunities and skill training to rural areas. In Gulabigaon (Bhintghar community), Nashik, Maharashtra, Child Help Foundation, along with IIFL Foundation, started a community development project last year. A thriving commercial hub called Bazaarhaat was later established to benefit the local people in several ways. The main advantage of this initiative is that it will give locals additional work chances. With the setting up of several shops in the business hub, people can start their own businesses and earn a livelihood. Additionally, the project also provides training and skill development programs to open up more employment opportunities. 2127 beneficiaries benefitted from this activity.

# Inauguration of 10 Shops in Business Centre

### Bhintghar, Maharashtra

1. Branding - As per the guidelines received from IIFL, the branding of the Business Hub was done in February 2023. The name and logo of India Info line Limited and Child Help Foundation are mentioned on the four walls.

2. Start-up of Business Hub - The beneficiaries started their shops in their allotted spaces from 14 February 2023 onwards. Now they are selling bakery products, snacks, and medicines from their shops. Also, they are offering hair-cutting services from their shop. According to the feedback from the villagers, now they don't have to go to other villages or blocks to get haircuts and buy medicines. They are buying things from the shops of the business hub. # Skill Development Training: Cloth Bags Making

Bhintghar, Maharashtra

On 11th November 2022, Child Help Foundation organized workshop on Cloth Bag Making with the help of India Info Line Foundation. Using a simple technique of making cloth bags from old cloth taught by project team member Shilpa Lokhande. Some beneficiaries used tailoring machines for stitching work while some beneficiaries did hand stitching. It includes cloth bags of various sizes. The participants used their creativity and skills to create the bags. Simple techniques and measurement pattern have been provided by project team member. A total of 10 women attended the training and 16 cloth bags were produced by the women beneficiaries during the training. According to their feedback, they like the training and need to visit the factory to sharpen their skills.





## Awareness Session on De -Addiction & Donation of Football and Volleyball

Bhintghar, Maharashtra

Overcoming addiction can be difficult, constant help and guidance are needed by addicts. Child Help Foundation with funding partner, India Info Line Foundation, organized an awareness session on De-Addiction at Gulabigao (Bhintghar), Surgana, Nashik, Maharashtra on 3rd December 2022. The session was conducted in the presence of Mr N. D. Gavit, (OSD) Officer on Special Duty, Tribal Development, Mr Raghunath Jadhav, Sarpanch, Mr Kuber Popati and Police Patil. The Resource Person, Mr Vikrant Lokhande (Master in Globalization and Labor-TISS), Superintendent of De-Addiction Centre, Support, Saphale conducted the session using real-life examples and experience. In the session, they covered the points related to the side effects of addiction on their personal health and on their families. At the end of the session vote of thanks was given by Mr N.D. Gavit, and Mr Kuber Popati for organizing the important session in the village as there is an extreme need for a De-Addiction session in the village. In the end, volleyball and football were donated to their respective team. Villagers felt very thankful for this donation and committed to making proper use of this sports equipment.

A weekly market was started on 4th December 2022 with the cooperation of the villagers at Bhintghar (Gulabigaon), Taluka-Surgana, District-Nashik, State-Maharashtra. Villagers took the initiative to create public awareness about the business hub of Child Help Foundation. Bazaarhat was planned in the upper ground of the Business Hub. The beneficiaries of the IIFL project put up their stalls in the market which consisted of snacks, clothes, vegetables, groceries, cutlery, dry fish, and grains. There were around 50 stalls. More than 200 customers shopped in Bazaarhaat. An approximate amount of Rs. 20,000 was traded in this market.

# **HUMANITARIAN RELIEF**

Nature is unpredictable. When everything seems perfect, calamity can strike and ruin everything in a stroke. It is during this time, that human kindness is needed more than ever. Child Help Foundation (CHF) strongly supports Humanitarian Relief Initiatives and reaches out to affected people in calamity emergency situations. Child Help Foundation has been at the forefront of relief efforts during natural calamities. At such times, Child Help Foundation staff and volunteers, work tirelessly across the several states of India to where aid and assistance are most needed.

Child Help Foundation has helped 1,824 people during natural calamities.





#### **Assam**

After the dreadful floods in Assam in 2022, Child Help Foundation along with Raindrop Foundation volunteers catered for the affected people in Nalbari, Changsari, Kamrup, and Darrang Districts in Assam with flood relief kits. The distribution was in collaboration with Bernil Pratyasha Foundation. 420 families were helped with flood relief kits that included rice, masoor dal, potatoes, mustard oil, soybeans, salt, poha, muri, Dettol soap, bleaching powder, and sanitary napkins to take care of their nutrition intake during those tough times. In Silchar District of Assam, 1000 flood-affected families were given ration kits. This initiative was in collaboration with CCHRC(Cachar Cancer Hospital and Research Centre). Groceries like rice, dal, oil, and salt were distributed to the families.







### AT THE FOREFRONT OF RELIEF EFFORTS

#### Uttarakhand

The devastating floods that occurred in Uttarakhand in September 2022 caused immense suffering and loss for the affected people. In response to this crisis, Child Help Foundation, in collaboration with India Cares and the local administration, stepped forward to provide much-needed support.

One of the crucial forms of assistance provided was the distribution of ration kits to the shelter team. These kits contained essential food items and other supplies that helped address the immediate nutritional needs of the flood-affected families. By ensuring that these families had access to basic nutrition, Child Help Foundation, India Cares, and the local administration played a significant role in providing relief during this challenging time. In addition to ration kits, the assistance provided also included sanitation support. Child Help Foundation contributed to their overall well-being and helped create a safer environment for them. Through these combined efforts, many families were able to receive the necessary support to meet their basic needs and rebuild their lives after the devastating floods.



#### Maharashtra

November 2022 was highly challenging for Maharashtra with cold waves hitting the state. A blanket distribution drive organized by Child Help Foundation and led by Mr Ajit Nair, Regional Coordinator of Mumbai and Pune was conducted, where 35 girl children of Anugraha Seva Mandal, Ambernath, were given blankets to protect them from chilly winters and keep them safe. Ration kits were distributed to specially-abled, and older people and widows in the Mashcha Pada community. 64 ration kits were distributed to help them with their basic nutritional needs. 63 underprivileged women in Kalyan, Maharashtra were given blankets to stay warm during winter.







### **DISTRIBUTING RELIEF KITS**

### Bengaluru

Child Help Foundation, in collaboration with Zivame under their CSR program, distributed grocery kits to children at Sneha Orphanage, Bengaluru. Similarly, specially-abled and older citizens who are in the golden years of their lives were given ration kits to support their daily nutritional needs and well-being, these rations would be helpful to provide them sustenance and safety. When given the goodies, a ray of hope shone in their eyes with a sense of assurance and security. Child Help Foundation is always ready to serve society in these manners.

#### Kerala

The collaboration with the Kumali Panchayat to address the needs of the people during the chilly winters showcases a collective approach towards community welfare.
