Advancing Women's Health: Breast Cancer Screening and Awareness Initiative

Child Help Foundation (CHF) is proud to share the successful organisation of a Breast Cancer Screening and Blood Test Camp at our Head Office on the occasion of Menstrual Hygiene Day, in collaboration with Arogya Vaibhav Foundation. The initiative was undertaken to promote women's health awareness and encourage preventive healthcare practices among women from diverse walks of life.

The programme served as much more than a routine health camp. It became a platform where women were encouraged to prioritise their health, seek timely medical guidance, and engage in meaningful conversations about issues that are often overlooked or discussed in silence. By combining health screening services with awareness-building activities, the camp aimed to address critical aspects of women's health, including menstrual hygiene, breast health, and the importance of regular medical check-ups.

Breast cancer remains one of the most common cancers affecting women, and early detection plays a crucial role in improving treatment outcomes and survival rates. Recognising this need, the camp provided women with access to breast cancer screening services, enabling them to take an important step towards safeguarding their health. In addition, blood tests were conducted to help participants gain a better understanding of their overall health status and identify any underlying concerns that may require medical attention.

Throughout the programme, healthcare professionals and volunteers interacted with participants, creating an environment where women felt comfortable asking questions and seeking information about their health.

Discussions on menstrual hygiene management highlighted the importance of maintaining proper hygiene practices, breaking long-standing taboos, and encouraging open conversations around menstruation. These interactions helped spread awareness about the need for self-care and the role that education plays in preventing health-related complications.

The primary purpose of the event was to promote awareness about women's health by making preventive healthcare services more accessible and encouraging women to adopt proactive health-seeking behaviours. Through awareness sessions and screening activities, participants gained valuable knowledge about menstrual hygiene, breast cancer prevention, and the significance of routine health examinations. The initiative also reinforced the message that timely screenings and early intervention can make a substantial difference in preventing serious health conditions and improving quality of life.

As a result of the camp, numerous women benefited from breast cancer screenings and blood tests while also gaining greater awareness of the importance of regular health monitoring. The programme encouraged participants to place their health and well-being at the forefront, fostering a culture of preventive care and informed decision-making. Many women left the camp feeling more confident about taking charge of their health and seeking medical assistance whenever necessary.

The digital divide goes beyond education alone. Internet access today influences healthcare awareness, skill development, financial inclusion, and employment opportunities. Children and young people who are digitally connected can access online learning platforms, educational videos, scholarship opportunities, career guidance, and skill-based courses. They are better prepared for a future in which digital knowledge is increasingly important across industries and professions.

At the same time, digital literacy also involves understanding how to use the internet safely and responsibly. Children must be guided on cyber safety, online privacy, misinformation, and responsible digital behaviour. Without proper awareness, increased internet exposure can also create risks such as cyberbullying, exploitation, and harmful online content. This makes digital education just as important as digital access itself.

Recognising these challenges, Child Help Foundation (CHF) continues to work towards bridging educational and awareness gaps among vulnerable communities. By supporting educational initiatives, installing STEM & computer labs, conducting awareness programmes, and promoting equal learning opportunities, CHF aims to ensure that children are not left behind in a rapidly evolving digital world. Baby of Silvy Prince, 4 Months
Premature Birth Complications

The birth of Silvy Prince's baby boy was meant to bring joy to his family, but instead, it marked the beginning of an incredibly difficult journey. Born prematurely just four months ago, the little child has spent nearly his entire life inside the **NICU at Rajagiri Hospital, Aluva, Kerala (5.9km from Aluva Railway Station)**. His fragile body continues to battle multiple life-threatening conditions, including severe heart complications and respiratory distress.

Doctors have diagnosed him with **extreme prematurity, extremely low birth weight, respiratory distress syndrome, ventricular septal defect, severe pulmonary arterial hypertension, bronchopulmonary dysplasia**, and several other complications. He is currently dependent on medical support, and even his feeding takes place through a tube. Doctors have advised an **emergency cardiac surgical intervention for a ventricular septal defect, along with a prolonged NICU stay** to save his life.

Prince Kurian works as a daily-wage labourer at a chicken farm and is the sole earning member of a family of five. The family was already struggling with debt after the recent loss of the baby's grandmother and medical expenses linked to the difficult pregnancy and delivery. The treatment cost of **Rs. 30,00,000 (Rupees Thirty Lakh Only)** is unaffordable.

Despite everything, this tiny fighter continues to hold on, giving his family hope with every passing day.

School Health Programme

Child Help Foundation (CHF) undertook extensive preparatory activities to strengthen project implementation for the current academic year. Student health screening cards were updated and revised, while awareness session worksheets were streamlined to improve implementation and documentation. Mock awareness sessions were conducted to enhance facilitation skills and session delivery.

The team also developed Mental Health Pre- and Post-Assessment Forms, updated mental health worksheets, and prepared a WASH Assessment Form for school-level data collection. Additionally, IEC materials, training modules, health cards, worksheets, and referral sheets were revised based on project review discussions. To ensure effective programme delivery, 11 awareness session topics were finalised, and the list of medicines and medical equipment required for implementation was prepared in consultation with doctors.



Blood Donation Camp

Computer Training Centre

At the Amboli Centre, 25 classes were conducted, recording a total attendance of 371 with 107 unique beneficiaries. Students were equipped with essential digital skills, enhancing their confidence and practical knowledge in using technology.

Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace (POSH)

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, commonly known as the POSH Act, is a landmark initiative by the Government of India to ensure safe and dignified workplaces for women. Child Help Foundation (CHF) is fully compliant with the POSH Act across all offices, field locations, and virtual workspaces. The organisation’s approach extends beyond legal compliance, fostering a culture rooted in dignity and respect, with zero tolerance for sexual harassment.

The Internal Committee (IC) addresses every complaint with fairness and confidentiality. All new employees undergo mandatory POSH policy training, while existing staff members participate in regular sensitisation workshops. Through a “Train the Trainer” programme, CHF has developed a cadre of 25 certified POSH trainers across India. These trainers have conducted awareness sessions to reach individuals and have mentored and certified three external professionals or members to enhance outreach and long-term impact. Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO)

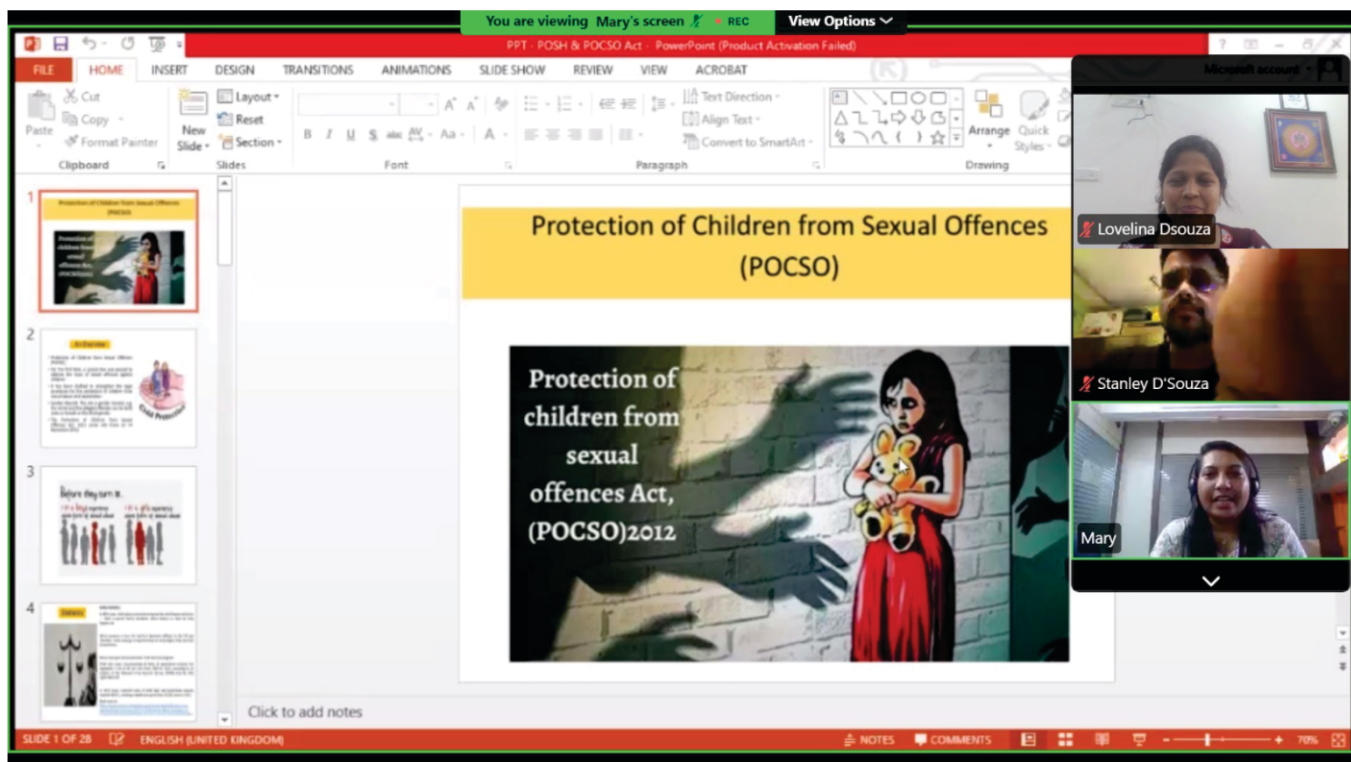
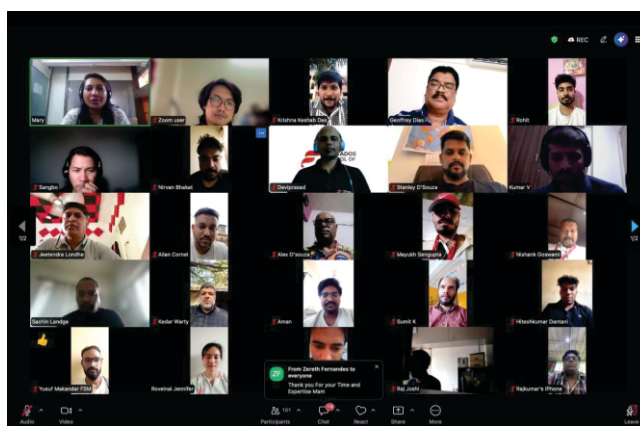
Child Help Foundation (CHF) places child safety at the core of its mission, strictly adhering to the POCSO Act 2012, which protects children under 18 from sexual abuse and harassment while ensuring child-friendly complaint, investigation, and court processes. Regular 'Good Touch – Bad Touch' sessions are conducted in schools to teach children how to recognise unsafe touch, set boundaries, seek help, and use the Child Helpline number 1098.

POSH & POCSO Session Online for teachers' group

Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted a comprehensive training program for music teachers at Furtados School of Music (FSM),

covering POCSO and POSH law awareness, safety protocols, and professional etiquette for online and offline music instruction. The session was further enriched by Mr Jiji John, a certified POSH trainer, who addressed the significance of the POSH Act and the role of the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC).

Sanitary Pad Distribution on Menstrual Hygiene Day

Haryana, Maharashtra & Odisha

On the occasion of Menstrual Hygiene Day, Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted a series of awareness and distribution initiatives across Haryana, Maharashtra, and Odisha to promote menstrual health, hygiene, and dignity among adolescent girls and women. School, Jasipur. These initiatives encouraged open discussions, challenged menstrual stigma, and fostered healthier, more informed, and period-friendly communities.

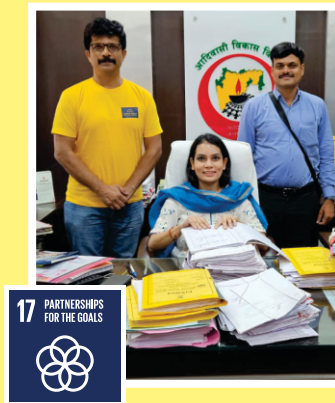
