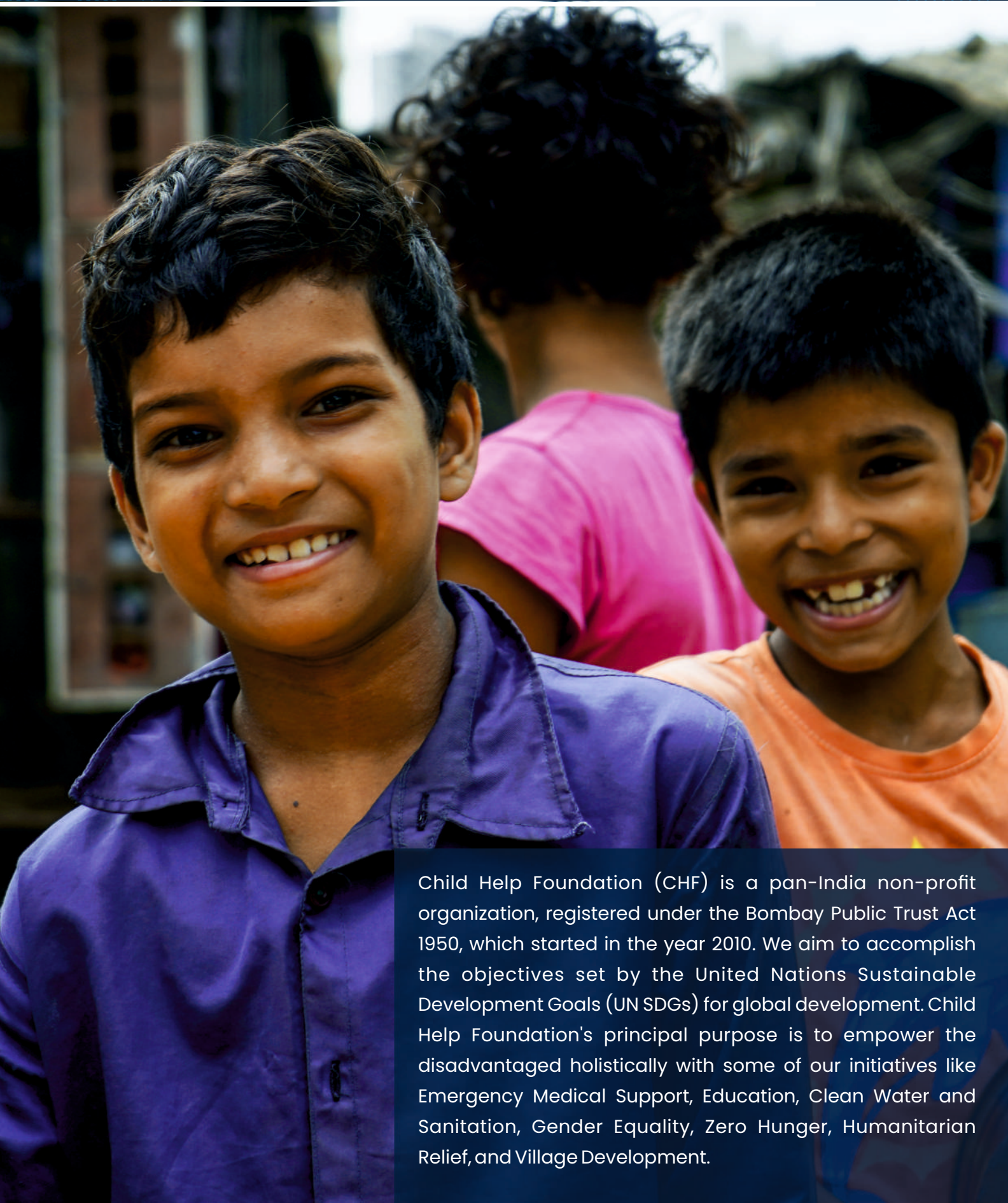
Joys of Christmas Brought to Child Help Foundation

Anorectal Malformation Has Snatched Rigvedh's Childhood, Please Help Him

"Since my son's birth, he's been battling through unimaginable challenges. All I wish for is a simple, normal life for him. Will it ever be possible?"-

Shyju V. K., (Father)

Rigvedh, a resilient 4-year-11-months-old boy, faces a challenging journey due to health complications that have required numerous surgeries since birth. Born with Ano-rectal Malformation, Hypospadias with chordee, and cardiac abnormalities, his young life has been a series of medical procedures and ongoing struggles. Instead of the carefree joys of childhood, Rigvedh is confronted with persistent pain and hindrances in performing daily activities.

Despite enduring seven surgeries, Rigvedh still grapples with difficulties in passing stool. His path to recovery includes four more surgeries, crucial for alleviating his immense suffering. The dedicated medical team at Kerala's Aster MIMS Hospital (3 km from Calicut Railway Station) has proposed procedures like Reconstruction of absent bowel with Anoplasty, closure Colostomy, and Urethroplasty that hold the promise of bringing him relief. But, it will cost approximately Rs 25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Lakhs Only.)

The financial burden looms heavily over Rigvedh's family. Shyju V. K., Rigvedh's father and the sole provider for their family of six, struggles to earn a meagre income of Rs 200-300 per day as a driver. His ability to work consistently is limited due to Rigvedh's health demands, resulting in irregular earnings. The weight of exorbitant medical expenses has already pushed the family into significant debt, accumulating to 10 lakh rupees. The family's resources are thus stretched beyond their means, making it impossible to gather the substantial amount required for Rigvedh's impending surgeries.

Please join us in supporting Rigvedh and his family during this challenging time. Your support, whether through donations, spreading awareness, or any means possible, can significantly impact Rigvedh's life, offering him the chance to experience the joys of childhood without the constant burden of pain and medical hardships.

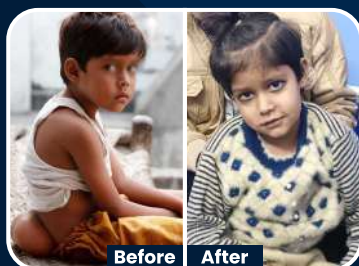
Ayaz Khan

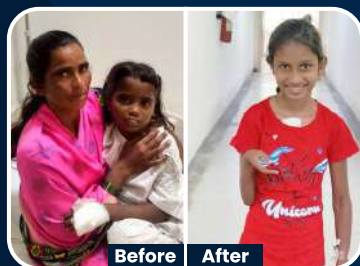
Shobha Waghmare

• LTPCT Meeting at Head Office

A meeting was organized involving the team members from the School Health Program funded by LTPCT. In the meeting, monthly activities were finalized by taking a review of the project activities that were pending. Apart from that, the vouchers were collected with a necessary explanation of expenditure from each volunteer. The orientation of the newly appointed volunteer for the post of nurse – Manisha Gahala was done. The role and responsibilities, the location of each school where the project is undergoing, documentation, and other details of the project were explained to her.

• Meeting with LTDP- PO

The meeting was organized to orient the PO about the activities which would be implemented under the School Health Program in Vikramgad, Maharashtra. The demonstration of software made to capture all the data of project was given to her explaining all the details of each parameter. The doctor – Priti explained the other details especially common morbidities that are found among the children locally. After that, the demo of the software was given to the assistant PO – Subhas Pardeshi.



• Yoga Session – Murbad Ashram School, Maharashtra

A session was organized as part of Wellness Activities which are planned in the project School Health Program funded by LTPCT. A yoga session was conducted by the certified trainer – Maya Ravte at Murbad Ashram School in Palghar, Maharashtra. She explained the importance of yoga in day-to-day life and conducted the yoga exercise with students. She taught some simple but health-beneficial asanas (exercises) to the students. A yoga session was also organized at Kawale Ashram School in Palghar, Maharashtra on 20th December, 2023.

They organized this session as a part of their social activities which they undergo during week-long camp. They had chosen this village to do the social services as a part of social activities.

After gathering the students from 8th to 10th classes in the hall, the session started at 3:30 pm. The session started with a video on substance abuse. After showing the video clip, the discussion was done through a PowerPoint presentation. The ppt slides contained information about topics such as types of drugs and how they are consumed by people as addictive, harmful chemicals, and substances.

• Site Survey at Civil Hospital, Palghar, Maharashtra

On 21st December, 2023, Ms Jyoti, Mr. Shashibhushan and the contractor visited the Civil Hospital in Palghar, Maharashtra. The purpose of the visit was to meet the Dean to ask his approval for starting the construction of the Baby Feeding Centre. Ms. Jyoti and Mr. Shashibhushan met the Civil Surgeon and explained to him the purpose as the Dean was not available.



• BABY SLEEPING SACK DISTRIBUTION

The baby sack distribution, titled 'Sleeping Sack Kiddie Comforts', is a comfortable sleeping sack for children of 6 months to 2 years, where the material is made comfortable as well as baby-friendly in terms of dryness and cleanliness. These baby sacks are to be distributed amongst the less privileged masses to help their children during the various seasons keeping them comfortable and warm. The sacks were distributed in Govandi, Bandra (In collaboration with Bombay YMCA) in Mumbai, Maharashtra, Godabari School in Cuttack, Odisha and Darshan Hospital in Meerut, Uttar Pradesh.

• Arogya Sadan

Child Help Foundation is committed to making a positive impact on the lives of various disease and disorder-affected paediatric patients and their families (currently started with paediatric patients with thalassemia). We are working to provide support and assistance to these young warriors who battle with unwavering courage. Arogya Sadan (Child Help and Care Centre) serves as an essential facility to provide care, support, and a safe environment for children living with various types of diseases and disorders. Arogya Sadan provides Free Accommodation, Free Food (Nutrition), Free Transportation, Hygiene and Sanitation, Psychosocial Support, Non-Formal Education Services, and Recreational facilities to the paediatric patient and their families. Arogya Sadan offers disease and disorder-affected paediatric patients and their families a supportive and caring environment to manage their condition effectively.

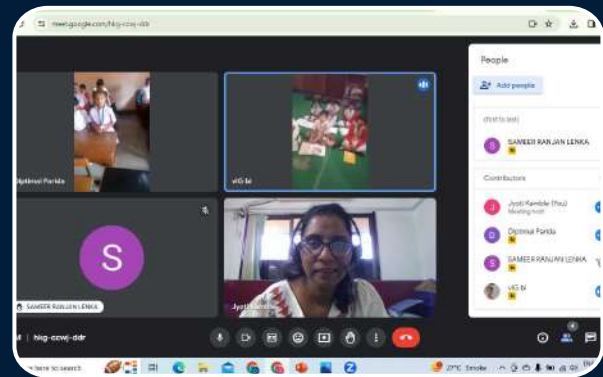
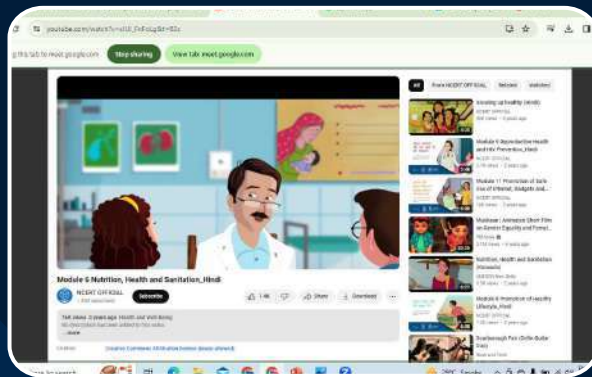

• Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health - Metropolis

Child Help Foundation is dedicated to improving the lives of children and adolescents by addressing their unique needs and challenges. In line with our commitment, we propose a comprehensive project to promote adolescent health and well-being in Palghar School, located in the Palghar district of Maharashtra. The Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH) project aims to address the critical issues of sexual and reproductive health among adolescent girls, specifically focusing on the challenges of child marriage and the lack of proper education on menstrual hygiene. By providing comprehensive SRH education, raising awareness about menstrual hygiene, and advocating for an end to child marriage, the project aims to empower adolescent girls with the knowledge and resources necessary to make informed decisions, protect their rights, and lead healthy lives. Here are the details of the program and the beneficiaries reached:

ARSH Awareness Session with Adolescent Girls (Covered 6515 adolescent girls)

Formation of Kishori Group (Formed 36 Kishori Groups)

Awareness Sessions with Teachers (Information given to 93 teachers)
