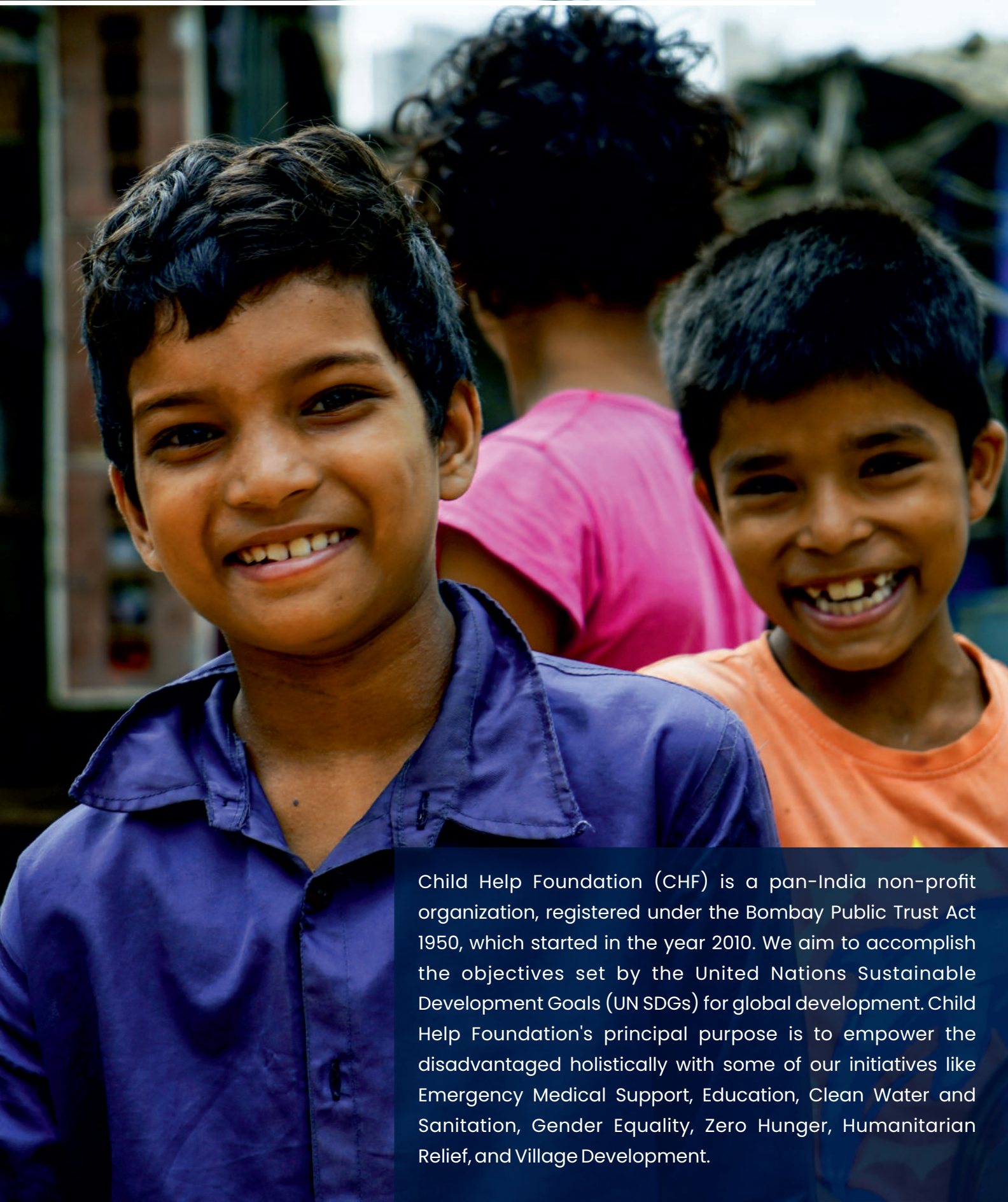

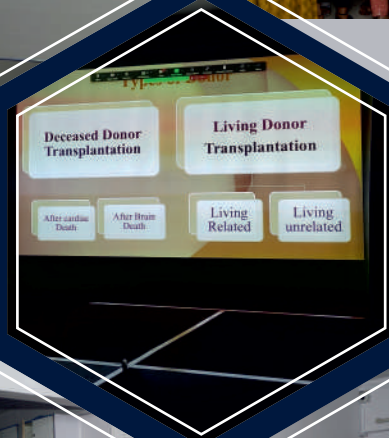

The liver is a vital organ in the human body, it is one of the largest organs in the body and has many essential functions, including detoxifying harmful substances from the blood, producing bile from digestion, storing vitamins and minerals, regulating blood sugar levels, and producing proteins for blood clotting.

Every year on April 19th World Liver Day is observed to raise awareness about liver-related diseases such as Hepatitis B and C, liver cancer, and autoimmune diseases, and their prevention. Various activities are conducted on this day, pertaining to making people aware of the severity, early detection and prevention of liver diseases.

As Usual, World Liver Day has a theme. The theme for this year was 'Be vigilant, do a regular liver check-up, fatty liver can affect anyone.' The objective of the theme was to encourage people to do regular liver checkups. This day also encourages people to take steps towards maintaining a healthy liver by eating a balanced diet, avoiding alcohol and drugs, and getting vaccinated for Hepatitis B.

Thalassemia Major

## Single Mother seeks help for her son, Please save 14-Year-Old Ronit.

"Ever since my child was two months old, he has been battling Thalassemia Major. Today, he is fourteen years old. Yet, he is still in pain. He tries to hide his pain. But I can clearly see that he is putting on a fake show of strength for his mother. I have no idea how I'll save my son. Please donate as much as you can."

Sangeeta Bajaj (Mother)

Sangeeta Bajaj stitches clothes for a living, but her monthly income is barely enough to put food on the table for her family of four. She has no idea how she will save her son, Ronit, who has been battling Thalassemia Major, ever since he was two months old. Doctors at NH Mazumdar Shaw Medical Center – Bangalore, have said that he needs to undergo a bone marrow transplant, which would cost Rs. 43,00,000/- (Rupees Forty-Three Lakhs Only).

She has exhausted all her savings for her son's regular blood transfusions. She has no way of amassing forty-three lakh rupees. Please spare as much as you can for Ronit. Even a small donation can go a long way in helping him bid farewell to his disease.

Spare as much as you can for Satyam's sake and allow him to live a healthy childhood.

# Success Stories



**Sufiya**

Sufiya, a five-year-old child, was born with a severe foot deformity called 'Fibular Hemimelia.' To live a normal life she required a limb-lengthening surgery worth Rs. 3,00,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs only). Sufiya's father was unemployed and didn't have the means to amass the required funds. The funding was arranged by the donors of the Child Help Foundation. Sufiya is now completely treated and recovering towards a healthy life.



**Hridya Sunil**

The hearts of Hridya Sunil's family members throbbed with fear when they found out that their daughter was diagnosed with 'Right TMJ Ankylosis'. Right TMJ Ankylosis is a pathological condition where the jaw is fused by bony or fibrotic tissues. It leads to limitations in speaking, breathing and chewing. Rs 1,04,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Four Thousand), was the cost of her normal life, which was impossible for her parents to arrange. So, they reached out to the Child Help Foundation. After this, the donors helped Hridya Sunil to recover from her ailment.



**Avni**

Dread came knocking on the doors of Avni's family, just three-four months after her birth. They found out that Avni had to battle with the 'Tetralogy of Fallot/PDA'. Her treatment was worth Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees Four Lakh Only). Avni's father had no way of arranging this huge sum of money. In such a crucial time, The donors of the Child Help Foundation stepped in and helped with Avni's treatment.



# Success Stories



**Pooja**

The Dreams of fourteen-year-old Pooja were in peril, as she was forced to put them aside to battle “Complex Cyanotic Heart Disease with large MAPCA”. Doctors suggested a treatment that came with the cost of Rs.4,50,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). The combined income of both her parents was barely enough to put food on the table for their family, it was unimaginable for them to arrange such a huge sum of money. But when all hope was lost, kind souls like you poured in love and support, which helped in the successful treatment of Pooja.



**Mitanshee**

What started as a drop in pulse rate turned into an unimaginable catastrophe for the Jadhav family, as they found out that their youngest member, Mitanshee was diagnosed with ‘Congenital Acynotic Heart Disease’. Rs. 2,55,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Fifty-Five Thousand Only) was required for her treatment, which was impossible for her parents to arrange. However, after taking help from the donors of the Child Help Foundation, they were able to pay for their daughter’s treatment.



**Riyanshivitha**

Life was extremely cruel to one-month-old Riyanshivitha. She had an unenviable fate of battling meningitis. She required an extended NICU stay, along with ventilator support. The total cost of her treatment was coming around Rs 5,00,000. (Rupees Five Lakhs Only). Riyanshivitha’s father worked at a mobile shop and was finding it difficult to manage the expenses of the treatment. With the support of our donors, Child Help Foundation was able to help the family with the arrangement of funds and her treatment was successful.

# Success Stories



**Madhupriya**

For more than eleven years, peace and comfort were distant strangers for Madhupriya. Ever since her birth she has been battling a severe heart condition. A Complex Open Heart surgery worth Rs.3,50,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only) was the only way to help her. However, her parents worked as daily wage labourers and had no way to bear the cost of the treatment. Child Help Foundation thus completed the necessary verification and the donors helped the family in arranging funds for the Madhupriya's treatment.



**Shifa**

It was a nightmare for 11 year old Shifa and her parents when she was suffering from congenital heart disease. She wanted to undergo VSD Surgical closure, and this procedure would cost Rs 4,75,000/- (Rupees Four Lakhs Seventy-Five Thousand Only). The mere mention of the amount sent a chill down his spine. Her father worked as a contract labourer and was sole breadwinner. Child Help Foundation with the support of our donors, was successful in helping the family and paving a way for her recovery.



**Eashani**

What started as a mere fever, turned out to be the worst nightmare for three-year-old Eashani and her parents Jayakesh and Lakshmi, when the doctors diagnosed her with High-Risk Acute Myeloid Leukemia and was suggested for Bone Marrow Transplant and cost of the treatment was Rs 25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakhs Only). Jayakesh had lost his job due to an accident and it was impossible for him to arrange such a huge amount. Child Help Foundation was able to help the family and arrange the required funds with the help of our donors.

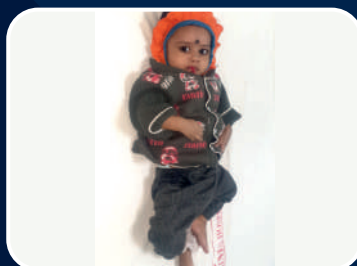
**Krishant Chouhan**

Kamlesh and Sonu, parents of Krishant thought a liver transplant would give their son a new chance at life. Little did they know that their worst troubles were just starting to form. After the transplant, it resulted into a blood infection and the doctors of Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad, diagnosed him with sepsis. For further treatments, Krishant required expensive antibiotics antifungals and immunoglobulin and the cost was Rs 15,00,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Lakhs Only). His father had already spent around Rs 21 lakh for his son's treatment but he had no option rather than seeking help. That's when Child Help Foundation with the help of our donors came in Krishant's aid and helped him in his successful treatment.



**Shrutika**

Six year old Shrutika's happiness had drained out of her life when she was diagnosed with Acute Promyelocytic Leukemia, a type of blood cancer. She couldn't enjoy her life like the rest of the kids. She was advised for chemotherapy along with necessary supportive care and the estimated amount was around Rs. 8,00,000/- (Rupees Eight Lakhs only). A farmer who barely earned enough found difficulty in managing such a huge amount. They further approached Child Help Foundation and with the help of our generous donors, we were able to to arrange the money for her treatment and is successfully under recovery.



**Tanuj Sheler**

Little Tanuj's parents were the happiest when he was born but didn't know that this happiness wouldn't last longer. Their son was detected with congenital heart defects and suffered from painful symptoms. The doctors proposed repair of subaortic ventricular septal total correction heart surgery and cost of treatment was Rs 5,20,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Twenty Thousand Only). This was the only hope for their child to get better. The sole bread winner with minimum salary was in no shape to afford such a huge expenditure. The fundings was arranged by the help of donors through Child Help Foundation and the parents could pay for little Tanuj's treatment.

# Success Stories



**Aarush**

Since five years Aarush and his parents were living a struggling life. Aarush was diagnosed with Thalassemia major when he was five months old. To survive, he required a Bone Marrow Transplant. The therapy cost around Rs. 20,50,000. (Rupees Twenty Lakh Fifty Thousand only). His parents managed to make Rs. 5000 each month by farming on a tiny plot of land they own. With this scanty income it was difficult for them to gather the amount required to save their son. They connected to Child Help Foundation and with the help of our donors, we could get his treatment successful.



**Ayush Sachin Shigvan**

The bitter truth knocked the door of Ayush's parents when he suffered from a rare heart condition. It was diagnosed when he was five months old and his parents couldn't continue his treatment because of covid - 19. Later, the doctors suggested that Ayush needed an urgent BDGS with conduit Surgery and the estimated amount was ₹ 6,50,000/- (Rupees Six Lakhs Fifty Thousand Only). The amount shook his parents and sought help from Child Help Foundation. The donors poured the funds required and helped Ayush in his successful treatment.



# 5 Female Activists you should know about

Battling through thousands of years of oppression has created many setbacks for the Dalit community. However, Dalits have proven themselves resilient and have broken through glass ceilings to make a name for themselves.

The movement started with Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar, and today his legacy is carried out by several of his followers. To honour Dr Ambedkar, 14th April is celebrated as Dr B.R. Ambedkar Remembrance Day.

But a single day is not enough to celebrate the achievements of the Dalits. Hence in 2015, a group of Dalit women started a project called Dalit History Month. The project took inspiration from Black History Month. It has also been formally recognized in Canada's British Columbia province.

Story Telling Sessions, Discussions, Art Works, and Exhibitions are organised during this month by the followers of Ambedkar. Besides being an advocate for Dalit rights, Ambedkar was also a huge feminist. Ambedkar famously said:

"Unity is meaningless without the accompaniment of women. Education is fruitless without educated women and agitation is incomplete without the strength of women."

So what better way to celebrate Dalit History Month than honouring five female Dalit activists alive today.

## 1. Meena Kandasamy

Hailing from Chennai, Meena Kandasamy is a fearless Dalit activist. She is also a fiction writer, poet, and translator. She made her debut as a fiction writer in 2014 by publishing a novel called 'The Gypsy Goddess'. The novel is a fiction story based on the 1968 Kilvenmani massacre. Meena Kandasamy has faced numerous death threats for her criticism of the

caste hierarchy. But Meena is not someone who is going to bow down easily. In reply to her death threats, she said:

"This threat of violence shouldn't dictate what you are going to write or hinder you in any manner."

## 2. Thenmozhi Soundararajan

Thenmozhi Soundararajan is a Dalit activist who lives in the United States of America. She voices her advocacy through songs and films. Her songs can be found on her Soundcloud profile. She explained her experience as a Dalit, living in The United States, in an essay titled 'The Black Indians', which was published in Outlook Magazine. She also hosts a podcast titled 'Caste in the USA.' For her efforts, Robert Rauschenberg Foundation included her in their first Artist as Activist fellows.

## 3. Sanghapali Aruna

Sanghapali Aruna is one of the prominent and well-known Dalit activists we have today. She is the Executive Director of Project Mukti, which describes itself as 'an incubator working as a Dalit, Bahujan, and Adivasi women and children focused start-up working to end the effects of caste, tribe, and class discrimination.' Their workshops focus on building resilience, addressing trauma and mental health among women and children. She can also be seen during protests. She famously participated in Dalit Mahila Swabhiman Yatra (Dalit Women's Self-Respect Tour), travelling through India to raise awareness about Caste-Based violence.

## 4. Asha Kowtal

Holding A Master's degree in social work, Asha Kowtal uses the skills acquired by her education to good use. Currently, she serves as the General Secretary of All India Dalit Mahila Adhikar Manch. She is also a part of the

### • Visit to Schools in Palghar (L & T project)

On 21st April 2023, The team of Child Help Foundation planned the visit to Government Ashram Schools in Murbad, Talwada, and Karhe. The team first visited Government Secondary Ashram School, Murbad to meet their respective school principals. During the meeting, the team explained the programmes of Child Help Foundation in detail along with the LTPCT project, the requirements from schools like providing separate rooms, tables and chairs to conduct the Health Screening Camp, Follow-up Health Screening Camp, Counselling Sessions, Awareness session, Information about the total strength of the school, and Proper Internet Connection.

### • POCSO Session

On 1st April 2023, Ms Jyoti had been to St John school, Goregaon to conduct a session on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses. The session was about the laws, the provisions under the law, what are the responsibilities of the staff, and all precautions they need to take. Feedback from the staff was taken after the session. ### • Summer Vocational Classes

Since 24th April 2023, Summer Vacation Supportive Classes have been started in numerous villages. Projects teachers are regularly going to the various padas and villages to provide education to the children. Currently, through this programme, teachers and volunteers are providing children with information related to various social and environmental issues. As per the feedback received from the students, they are enjoying the daily lectures and are finding them helpful at the same time.

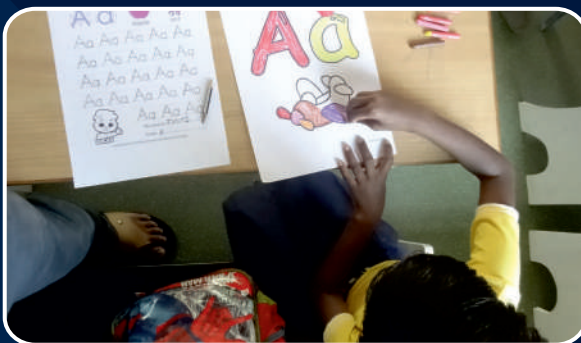

### Capacity Building Workshop in Schools, Dimapur, Nagaland

During the month of April, Colouring and Drawing, Handprint Sunshine Card Making, Language learning through games/activities, Skill Training on hand, and Embroidery were conducted. After the activities, it was found that after the community stakeholder became responsible for children's education, children improved their learning and were motivated to attend school, which led to a decrease or stop in dropouts in schools. Manuals and curriculums are replicated by the teaching staff in the schools. A meeting with the SMC, School In charge and Subject teachers was conducted to discuss the action plan and share with each other on how to mould the school into a better school.



### Supportive Classes for Village Students

Now that the grape harvesting season is over, the villagers have started returning to their homes. Currently, volunteers are providing assisted classes to the students of the village. Volunteers are taking tuition of village children regularly. At present the beneficiaries are selling their products and services from the allotted shops in the bazaar haat. Surgana weekly market is every Friday so most people buy goods from the Surgana market 1 day before Gulabi village market so village customers don't want to buy goods again after the 1-day gap. So the villagers of Gulabigaon decided to change the day of the weekly market from Sunday to Tuesday so that people can approach

## SDG 6: WAS (Water & Sanitation)

### • School Development Project, Sheikhpura district, Bihar

Two government schools in Sheikhpura district, Bihar approached Child Help Foundation for support. They had asked for toilets, clean and safe water facilities and also for educational support for their students. CHF staff visited the two schools namely, M.S Maur & M.S Koyaribigha School, Barbigha Block, Sheikhpura, Bihar and decided to support the school in building toilets for girls, water purifiers and a Mini Science Centre. Under the school development project, two toilets were constructed and water purifiers were installed in both the schools in collaboration with the CSR partner The National Fertilizers Limited. The project was started in the month of March and completed in the month of April.



### • Water purifier project in two schools, Satara district, Maharashtra

In the month of April 2023, two schools from Satara district in Maharashtra, namely, Jilha Parishad Prathamik Shala Bothe and New English School Bothe, Satara district were supported by Child Help Foundation under the WAS program, CHF provided those schools with water purifiers. The purifiers would be delivered to the schools at the beginning of May and the installation work will be completed in the month of June as the schools are closed for the summer vacation.

## SDG 11: SUSTAINABLE CITIES AND COMMUNITIES

### • Village Cleaning – Sahapur, Odisha

On the 2nd, 9th, 16th, and 30th of April 2023, Village cleaning activity was conducted by 10-15 volunteers of Hemchandra Sanskrit Vidyalyaya at Village Sahapur, Odisha. Community and temple places were cleaned by volunteers and proper instructions were given to the villagers to keep their areas clean and tidy. Through this activity, they learned to keep the premises clean of their village and also provided motivation to others.



## SDG14: VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

### • Velankini Beach Cleaning, Maharashtra

In April 2023, there were beach cleaning activities conducted at various locations. The activity raised awareness about the importance of keeping beaches and oceans clean. It also educates people on the harmful effects of littering and the need for proper waste management. Beach cleaning activities help to remove harmful debris from the beach, which harms marine life and negatively impacts the ecosystem. This also helps to protect the environment and promote sustainable tourism. Beach cleaning activities were conducted at Uttan and Velankini Beach with the help of volunteers from Wilson College. A total of 156 and 122 kgs of garbage were collected from the beaches respectively. 37 people participated in Uttan Beach Clean Up, while 40 participated in Vellankini Beach Clean Up. As per the above-mentioned data, the collection of garbage by beach cleaning activities is 278 kg
