Nuha 12 Years Fanconi Anemia

Aspiring Doctor Needs Your Help, Don't Let This Bright Mind Perish

"My daughter's intelligence astonishes me. Even at the mere age of twelve, she knows so much that I have no words to express it. I don't wish to let her talents go to waste. She has a bright future if only I could do something about her current situation."

Ejajkhan; (Father)

At a humble abode in Ahmednagar, Maharashtra, stays a family of five, a couple and three children, who all are brilliant in their own right. Two aspiring engineers and one who dreams of becoming a doctor. The father, Ejajkhan, does all he can to ensure that the dreams of his children stay alive. Unfortunately, he now has to not only keep the dreams of his children alive but also one of them.

Nuha, his youngest daughter, has been diagnosed with Fanconi Anemia. It all started with occurrences of fever. Soon, she started getting sick frequently and the time period between the sickness grew shorter and shorter. Later, the truth was found out.

Today, Nuha has to take a platelet transfusion every three days and a blood transfusion every eight days. Her ambition and studies have been forced to take a rest as she now has to battle for her life, but she is determined to stop it.

The doctors at Maharashtra's Jupiter Hospital (13.2 km from Pune Junction Railway Station) have said that Nuha needs to undergo a bone marrow transplant which would cost Rs.25,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakh Only).

Ejajkhan runs a stationery shop. He is the sole breadwinner in his family of five and lives in a rented house. He has sold his land and taken loans from his friends to fund the treatment.

Curbing Sexual Harassment Cases Including Rape At Workplaces Mewsletter

The Nation has been shook by the recent rape tragedy that happened with a resident doctor at R G Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata, West Bengal. A doctor after working her shift was raped and murdered.

On the eve of Independence Day, tricolour flags were replaced by placards demanding justice; parades proudly showcasing the glory of our nation were replaced with protests of people who were ashamed at the fact that even after 78 years of our independence, women are still not allowed to live freely. It seems that the country does not care about the independence of women and is content with the independence of men.

If women are not even safe while working, where are they safe? At times like this, Child Help Foundation strongly feels that we need to make workplaces safer for women.

One such provision in our country is the POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) Act, 2013. The act provides legal protection to female workers in our country.

The PoSH Act, 2013:

Creates a formal complaint mechanism

Defines roles and responsibilities

Ensures prompt inquiry and action

Provides safeguards against victimization

This combined with rampant educational campaigns detailing the legal provision has the provision to greatly reduce the number of sexual harassment complaints.

Child Help Foundation strongly encourages every company to have an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC). ICC is a committee with a minimum of four members, with half of the members being women. This committee takes action against every sexual harassment complaint recorded.

However, the inclusion of the ICC is not enough as Child Help Foundation believes that students should be educated about women's safety right from childhood. Child Help Foundation holds sessions educating children about 'goodtouch-bad-touch', these sessions not only make children aware of sexual harassment but also teach boys to not engage in inappropriate behaviour with women.

While protesting has a huge impact on the collective consciousness of the nation, the fight for a better world for women does not stop there. We need to make a change in our daily lives. Stop your friends from making inappropriate jokes about women, and start treating women as human beings rather than objects of lust or possession. When you start thinking of them as flesh-and-blood human beings with their own needs, wants and desires, you automatically change your perception.

When someone robs men of accountability and suggests that women themselves are responsible for such heinous crimes, remind them these are not new cases but have been happening for decades and engage them with rhetoric that

Person 1: "This is a direct consequence of Western feminism which has poisoned our society. If women don't stay out at night, these things won't happen."

Person 2: "If men are so subservient to their desires and are a threat to women. Shouldn't they be the ones forced to stay at home?"

While engaging in such a dialogue you are not advocating for reduced rights for men but exposing their flawed logic and rationale. You can also remind them that women are not safe even in their own homes and are unsafe from their own relatives, which could be their husband, uncles or even their fathers.

Child Help Foundation regularly raises awareness of POSH and has helped to form ICC in various organisations. We also regularly hold sessions educating people about gender equality. 86,895 people have been educated about gender equality through our work.

Update of Baby Feeding Centres

The Baby Feeding Centers (BFC) initiative by Child Help Foundation (CHF) aims to provide safe, hygienic, and accessible spaces for breastfeeding mothers across public places such as hospitals, railway stations, police stations, and temples. These centres ensure that lactating mothers have a dedicated area where they can comfortably breastfeed their infants, promoting child nutrition and supporting maternal health, in line with Sustainable Development Goal 3 (Good Health and Well-Being).

In August 2024, CHF continued to monitor, maintain, and improve Baby Feeding Centers in multiple states across India, reaching a total of 6033 beneficiaries. The BFCs are operational in major public locations across Maharashtra, Bihar, Kerala, West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, and Karnataka.

Key Observations

Maintenance and Hygiene:

The BFCs at most locations are reported to be well-maintained and regularly cleaned by hospital, railway, or local staff. Proper hygiene is essential to maintain the trust of mothers, and the feedback indicates a high level of cleanliness at centres in Kerala, Maharashtra, and Karnataka.

Katihar Railway Station (Bihar): This BFC requires attention as cleanliness standards were not met during the month. The CHF team has planned further discussions with railway authorities to address these issues.

Pune Railway Station (Maharashtra): The centre lacks proper lighting and ventilation (missing fan and light). The CHF team has scheduled a meeting with the station master to resolve these concerns and improve the facility.

Utilization Rates:

- Centres located in high-traffic public spaces such as railway stations and temples (e.g., Chottanikkara Temple, Vizag Railway Station, and Sir Atal Bihari Vajpayee College) have recorded the highest utilization, reflecting the convenience and accessibility for mothers travelling through these crowded areas.
- The hospital-based BFCs such as those in CAMA Hospital, Lakeshore Hospital, and General Hospital Kerala continue to serve a consistent number of mothers daily. The registers maintained at these hospitals help track the usage and ensure the services provided are aligned with the needs of the visitors.
- BFCs in police stations (such as Kashimira Police Station) provide not only a space for breastfeeding but also a place for women to rest, especially during long waiting times, further enhancing their usefulness.



Support from Local Staff:

Cooperation from Childline staff, railway personnel, and hospital staff is instrumental in the smooth functioning of these centres. In locations like Kalyan Railway Station, Kurla Railway Station, and Boisar Railway Station, the staff actively guides mothers to the BFCs and ensures the centres are used properly.

Feedback and Challenges:

Positive Feedback: Feedback from the staff and beneficiaries at locations such as Kashimira Police Station and CAMA Hospital has been overwhelmingly positive, with mothers expressing gratitude for having a dedicated space to breastfeed in public areas.

Challenges: The main challenge identified was the lack of proper maintenance in a few locations such as Katihar Railway Station, where cleanliness was an issue. Additionally, in Pune Railway Station, the lack of essential amenities like fans and lights hinders the comfort of the space.

The Baby Feeding Centers have proven to be an essential resource for mothers, especially in busy public spaces, where finding a safe and private area to breastfeed can be challenging. In August 2024, a total of 6033 mothers and infants benefited from these centres, highlighting the growing need and acceptance of these facilities.







Ration Kit Distribution

Mulund, Maharashtra

On 30th August 2024, as part of the TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan, a significant initiative unfolded at the TB Hospital in Mulund, Maharashtra. In a bid to alleviate the burdens faced by TB patients and their families, a nutrition kit distribution program was meticulously organized. With the hospital taking charge of coordinating the event and extending invitations to beneficiaries, a total of 40 patients, spanning both government and private healthcare sectors, were identified as recipients. The Nutrition Kit Distribution initiative under the TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan aims to provide essential nutritional support to tuberculosis (TB) patients across India. Proper nutrition plays a crucial role in the recovery process for TB patients, as the disease often weakens the immune system and reduces the body's ability to fight infections. These nutrition kits include high-protein foods, essential vitamins, and minerals to help boost immunity and promote faster recovery. By addressing the nutritional needs of patients, the initiative enhances the effectiveness of TB treatment and helps improve patient outcomes.

As part of the TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan, this initiative aligns with the broader goal of eliminating TB by ensuring that patients receive holistic care, which includes medical treatment along with nutritional support. The distribution of nutrition kits is focused on underprivileged communities, where malnutrition is often prevalent, making TB patients more vulnerable to complications. Through partnerships with local healthcare providers and community organizations, this initiative has successfully reached a large number of TB patients, contributing to their overall health and well-being while advancing the mission of a TB-free India.

The total number of beneficiaries reached-40.

Free Oral Health Screening Camp

St. Xavier's High School, Palaspalli, Bhubaneswar

Child Help Foundation's Odisha team, in collaboration with Hi-Tech Dental College and Hospital, organized a Free Oral Health Screening Camp at St. Xavier's High School, Palaspalli, Bhubaneswar. Students from 4th to 10th grade received free oral check-ups, including minor tooth extractions, teeth scaling, and nominal cavity fillings. A total of 310 students were screened. The students were transported to and from the hospital by bus, accompanied by school staff, ensuring a smooth and effective health service experience.

Free Oral Health Screening Camp

St. Xavier High School, Samantarapur, Odisha

On August 21, 2024, Child Help Foundation, in collaboration with Hi-Tech Dental College and Hospital, Bhubaneswar, conducted a Free Oral Health Screening Camp at St. Xavier High School, Samantarapur. Students from Class I to IV, totaling 200, received free oral check-ups, minor tooth extractions, simple teeth scaling, and nominal cavity fillings. This initiative aimed to promote better oral health among young students and provide essential dental care services at no cost.





School Health Program,

Palghar, Maharashtra, Supported by L&T Public Charitable Trust

The School Health Program in Vikramgad, implemented by Child Help Foundation and supported by L&T Public Charitable Trust, is a comprehensive health initiative designed to improve the physical and mental well-being of underprivileged tribal students in the Vikramgad block of Palghar district, Maharashtra. This initiative serves a critical role in addressing the healthcare needs of children in 14 schools, including Zilla Parishad (Z.P.) schools and Ashram schools, which cater to more than 10,000 tribal students.

The program aims to create a sustainable model of healthcare support within schools by focusing on early diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of illnesses, along with promoting mental health awareness and fostering a healthy school environment. Below are the detailed activities and outcomes for August 2024:

Teacher Capacity Building

To ensure the sustainability of the program and to empower educators, the Training of Trainers (TOT) model was implemented to build teachers' capacities in health education. In August:

- A specialized training session was held at Sarashi School in Palghar, Maharashtra with 11 teachers participating. These teachers were trained in mental health awareness and were provided with tools and techniques to address student mental health in the classroom.
- The training focused on helping teachers identify signs of distress or mental health issues among students and provided strategies for intervention, such as counselling or referral to health professionals. The TOT model ensures that the knowledge and skills imparted to teachers can be continuously shared and implemented across all participating schools, promoting a long-term impact on student well-being.



Educational Support

Caring Hands Orphanage, Uttan, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation is committed to ensuring that children from underserved communities, such as orphans at Caring Hands Orphanage in Uttan, Thane in Maharashtra, receive quality education. On 6th August 2024, CHF's team, led by Ms. Sendra, visited St. Joseph English School, Uttan, where they handed over a cheque to the principal to cover the annual school fees for the orphans residing in Caring Hands Orphanage. This initiative aims to alleviate financial burdens and ensure these children do not miss out on their education.

Mini Science Centers

Palghar, Maharashtra

To improve science and mathematics education in rural schools, CHF, in partnership with Samata Equal Footing, set up Mini Science Centers (MSC) at six schools in the Palghar district of Maharashtra. These MSCs are equipped with interactive science and mathematics models designed to simplify complex concepts through hands-on learning.

- Schools Benefitted: Talwada, Maan, Vinval, Kunje, Karhe, and Dadade Ashram Schools.
- Beneficiaries: 600 students.
- Project Details: Each MSC is furnished with tools and kits for teaching fundamental scientific concepts. CHF also organized a Teacher Training Program, ensuring teachers can effectively utilize the MSC tools in their lesson plans.

During the reporting month of August 2024, the MSCs at Talwada, Maan, and Dadade have been successfully inaugurated, with the remaining three scheduled for formal opening in the coming months. Teachers have already started incorporating these tools into their teaching methods, and feedback from both students and educators has been overwhelmingly positive. The project is poised to significantly boost students' interest in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) subjects, setting a strong foundation for their future academic pursuits.







Inauguration of Mini Science CenterKurnje Ashram School, Maharashtra

On 31st August 2024, CHF inaugurated a new Mini Science Center at Kurnje Ashram School, Palghar. The inauguration was attended by CHF's team members from the Head Office, including Ravsaheb and Jyoti, who oversaw the setup and integration of the MSC in the school's curriculum. Students demonstrated various scientific principles using the MSC models, showcasing their increased understanding and enthusiasm for science.

- Beneficiaries: 600 students.
- Impact: Immediate engagement of students in interactive science lessons, with plans for ongoing teacher-led practical classes to further enhance the learning experience.







Impact Assessment

Sakhare Ashram School, Maharashtra

On 26th August 2024, CHF conducted an Impact Assessment at Sakhare Ashram School, Palghar, to evaluate the outcomes of projects such as the Mini Science Center (MSC), Centre for Excellence (CFE), Health initiatives, and Arsh programs. The assessment included:

- Survey of 60 male and 60 female students to gather their feedback on the project's impact on their learning.
- Survey with 20 teachers to assess changes in teaching methods and student engagement.
- Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) with the school's Principal, teachers, and students to obtain qualitative insights into the program's effectiveness.

The findings revealed that the MSCs had significantly increased student participation and enthusiasm for STEM subjects. Additionally, the health and wellness programs had positively impacted students' awareness of personal hygiene and well-being, contributing to a healthier school environment.

Mini Science Center and Computer Lab Project

Barbigha, Bihar

CHF extended its MSC and Computer Lab initiatives to Barbigha block, Bihar. In M S Maur School and M S Koyaribigha School, CHF installed MSCs in January 2024 to improve students' understanding of core science and math subjects.

Teachers' Feedback: The use of models in the MSC has made abstract concepts more tangible for students, particularly in subjects like Physics and Geometry.

Furthermore, CHF supporting a Computer Lab at Tailik School, which serves 987 students. This lab is equipped with 20 computers, and a full-time computer teacher has been appointed to impart regular lessons in basic computer skills, Microsoft Office, and internet usage. This initiative is especially critical in a rural region where students had limited access to digital resources prior to this intervention.





New Computer Labs

Barbigha, Bihar

In June 2024, CHF established two additional Computer Labs at Utkramit Uchch Vidyalaya, Lodhipur and Madhya Vidhyalay, Samas in Barbigha block, equipped with state-of-the-art systems. These labs provide digital literacy to students and teachers alike, allowing the school to adopt modern teaching methods.

Impact: The introduction of these labs has equipped students with essential 21st-century skills, contributing to their holistic development and preparation for future academic or professional endeavours.

Support to Child Care Institutions (CCIs)

CHF continues to provide education-related support to seven Child Care Institutions (CCIs) across India. These institutions cater to vulnerable children, and CHF ensures their educational needs—such as school fees, uniforms, and study materials—are met.

Key Activities: Independence Day celebrations, health camps, and remedial classes were organized at CCIs in Bangalore, Bhubaneswar, Angul, Chennai, Jharkhand, and Pune.

Long-term Impact: These initiatives ensure children from disadvantaged backgrounds receive consistent educational support, helping them stay on track in their academic journey.





Centre of Excellence (COE)

Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

CHF initiated a Centre of Excellence (COE) project in collaboration with the Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation. This proposed project aims to transform schools into centres of academic and extracurricular excellence by upgrading infrastructure and educational tools. Shilpa visited the proposed schools for the scoping of the interventions.

Schools Visited: Municipal School No. 4, 20, 24, 36, 19, 14, and 32, covering Marathi, Hindi, and Urdu medium students.

Project Status: CHF identified key areas of improvement and is working on implementing measures to enhance the learning experience in these schools.

Digital Skills Program

Amboli, Dadra and Nagar Haveli

In Amboli, Dadra Nagar Haveli, CHF operates a Computer Training Centre, which conducted 36 computer classes in August 2024, with 640 students attending. The centre focuses on teaching essential digital skills such as typing, Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint, along with basic internet usage.

Impact: Enhanced digital literacy among students, enabling them to use computers for academic purposes and setting a foundation for future technological proficiency.







Silvassa, Daman and Diu

CHF inaugurated a Computer Training Centre at Marathi Centre Primary School, Silvassa, Daman and Diu on 8th August 2024 with the support of Dorf Ketal. The centre is equipped with 30 laptops and projectors. Throughout August, 67 classes were conducted, with 8,375 students in attendance.

- Curriculum: Classes focus on MS Office applications, basic typing, and internet usage.
- Impact: Immediate improvement in student computer literacy, fostering digital competence in a region previously lacking such resources.

Through these diverse initiatives, Child Help Foundation contributes to SDG 4 (Quality Education) by providing financial assistance, interactive learning opportunities, digital education tools, and skill development for underprivileged children across India. Each project is aimed at creating sustainable educational support systems that empower students to achieve their academic goals and prepare for a successful future.









Digital Skills Project

Vikramgad, Maharashtra

Since May 2024, the Digital Skills Project has been actively implemented across 15 schools in the Vikramgad block, including eight Zilla Parishad (Z.P.) schools and seven ashram schools. This initiative was designed to empower underprivileged rural students by providing them with essential digital skills through structured computer training, bridging the digital divide in these remote areas.

The program's goal is to equip students with the technological knowledge and tools they need to navigate an increasingly digital world, ensuring that they have the skills necessary for future educational and employment opportunities.

Training of Trainers (TOT):

Total Teachers Trained: 198 teachers from the 15 participating schools

Training Topics Covered:

- Internet browsing and understanding its educational potential
- Basic functions of Microsoft Word and Excel, allowing teachers to create lesson plans and manage student data
- Integration of digital tools and resources into traditional teaching methods to make learning more interactive and engaging
- During the TOT sessions, a variety of resources and instructional materials were employed to ensure that the teachers were well-equipped to transfer their learning to the students. These included:

Computer Assignments: Teachers practised real-time tasks to reinforce their learning.

PowerPoint Presentations: Used to demonstrate how to structure lessons and effectively use digital tools for classroom instruction.

Audio-Visual Shows: These were introduced to demonstrate the role of multimedia in making subjects more accessible and engaging for students

Through this multi-faceted approach, the Digital Skills Project has not only reached thousands of rural students but has also empowered educators to adopt and implement digital learning in their classrooms, creating a long-term impact on the educational ecosystem in Vikramgad.



School Fund Raising Eastern India

In the eastern regions of India, CHF organized extensive fundraising campaigns through its Child for Child initiative, aimed at engaging school children in raising funds for social causes. Locations such as Siliguri (West Bengal), Darjeeling Hills (West Bengal), Cuttack (Odisha), Malda (West Bengal), Dumdum (West Bengal), Bargarh (Odisha), and Raigarha (Jharkhand) were actively involved. CHF volunteers and team members worked closely with schools in Kolkata, West Bengal, and Odisha to ensure the success of the campaign. Among the team, individuals like Soumen, Disha, Rupa, and Aman were especially instrumental in field operations. The schools also acknowledged the topperforming students for their exceptional fundraising efforts.

Experiential Classes

Kolkata, West Bengal:

CHF Kolkata launched an internship program focusing on experiential learning for subjects like mathematics, science, art, and history. The program spans 11 months and is designed for children aged 4-9 years. Held every Saturday at Salt Lake Community, the initiative has over 150 beneficiaries and is gaining popularity among students and parents alike.





Workshop Mahindra University

Hyderabad, Telangana:

On 15th August 2024, CHF Hyderabad held an orientation workshop at Mahindra University, introducing students to CHF programs. Faculty members and students from the School of Media participated in the event, with discussions on future internships and collaborations



POSH Certification Process

CHF conducted a series of training sessions on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) Act. The training, held from June to August 2024, involved four levels of assessment, culminating in the certification of seven CHF trainers from across India. The program provided participants with essential knowledge on workplace safety and legal frameworks, empowering them to train others.

Invisible Girl Project (Maharashtra & Haryana)

In August 2024, the IGP team members, Annarao, Ria, and Ibrahim, accompanied by Chris and Jyoti, conducted a series of sessions across various schools and colleges in the Palghar and Thane regions of Maharashtra. The purpose of these sessions was to raise awareness about gender equality, promote education for girls, and empower them with knowledge and skills to enhance their future prospects. The Haryana team is also focusing on the schools and community to raise awareness over the same topics.

Highlights of the Month:

Session Permissions: The team successfully received the necessary permissions from schools and colleges, allowing them to conduct all planned sessions without any cancellations. This ensured the smooth execution of the program as per the schedule.

National Service Scheme (NSS): The team received additional permissions to conduct sessions for the remaining classes in colleges through the NSS, expanding the program's reach.

Strategic Targeting: The team focused on institutions with a large number of beneficiaries, which helped maximize the program's impact. This strategic approach was highly successful in reaching a significant number of students.

Adolescent Life Skills Project

(ARSH Initiatives) - Metropolis

On the 16th of August 2024, Shilpa Lokhande, a member of the project team, visited Bhopoli Ashram School in Palghar, Maharashtra to monitor and supervise the ongoing Life Skills Project under the ARSH (Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health) initiative. During the visit, several key observations were made regarding the quality of training being provided:
