Srushti Raut, 10 Year Infection in Legs and Lungs

Her Smile Is Fading, But We Can Bring It Back: Help Srushti Heal

"She was in pain, but none of us imagined it was something so serious. My daughter is only ten... She should be playing, not lying in a hospital bed."

- Omprakash Raut (Father)

Srushti Raut, a bright 10-year-old from a small farming family in Parbhani, Maharashtra, began complaining of pain and swelling in her leg. What started as a minor infection quickly worsened, leaving her

family in shock. After rushing her to a nearby hospital, the doctors diagnosed her with a severe, life-threatening infection that had spread rapidly, affecting her leg and lungs, and placing her body in a critical state.

She is currently undergoing treatment at Galaxy Superspeciality Hospital & Research Institute, Aurangabad, Maharashtra (4.6 km from Aurangabad Railway Station), where doctors are fighting to save her life. Srushti urgently needs multiple plastic surgeries to recover from the damage caused by the infection and prevent any permanent disability.

Her father, Omprakash, is a farmer and the sole earner for a family of eight. With barely enough to meet daily needs, the cost of treatment, Rs. 9,00,000/- (Rupees Nine Lakh Only), is far beyond what the family can afford. He has already borrowed from friends and relatives, but it is not enough.

Your support can bring hope back into Srushti's life. With your help, this little girl can get the treatment she needs and return to the carefree childhood she deserves. Please help us save her.

As the remover of obstacles, Ganesha teaches us that challenges are not to be feared but embraced as opportunities for growth. Modern life is full of hurdles, stress at



To combat the stigma around public breastfeeding in India, Child Help Foundation (CHF) has set up several Baby Feeding Centres (BFCs) nationwide. These centres offer safe and comfortable environments for nursing mothers, enabling them to move freely without the worry of breastfeeding in public. So far, 2,29,010 mothers have benefited from these supportive spaces, which prioritise dignity, ease, and care for both women and their babies.



Child Help Foundation Celebrates World Breastfeeding Week 2025 Across India

Child Help Foundation (CHF), a national non-profit dedicated to the welfare of underprivileged children and mothers, marked World Breastfeeding Week 2025 with a series of impactful initiatives across multiple states. Observed globally from 1st to 7th August, the campaign aimed to highlight the critical importance of breastfeeding for healthier beginnings, stronger families, and a more equitable society.

- 1. Palghar, Maharashtra: Child Help Foundation organised a special programme on 7th August 2025 at the Rural Hospital. The event featured awareness sessions led by Ms. Jyoti and Ms. Krutika, who emphasised the nutritional, immunological, and gender equity dimensions of breastfeeding. To support new mothers, baby sleep sacks were distributed across the OPD, Neonatal Care Unit, and Paediatric Department, especially benefiting families from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. The programme was graced by the Medical Superintendent and Sister-in-Charge, Smt. Deokar, whose encouragement made the initiative even more meaningful.
- 2: Bengaluru, Karnataka: On 11th August 2025, Child Help Foundation joined hands with the Paediatrics Department of the Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health. Doctors, nurses, and staff gathered to celebrate the week with an awareness drive that reinforced the health benefits of breastfeeding for both mothers and infants.
- **3. Ernakulam, Kerala:** At Lakeshore Hospital, Child Help Foundation collaborated with the Paediatrics Department to host an awareness programme on 9th August 2025. The sessions were led by Dr. Maria George, Dr. Mary Zavier, Ms. Jasna, and Ms. Krishna Priya, alongside CHF executives and hospital staff, ensuring a comprehensive outreach to mothers and families.

4. Gurugram, Haryana: On 6th August 2025, CHF Delhi, in partnership with the Haryana medical fraternity, celebrated Breastfeeding Week at the Civil Hospital. Mothers received baby sleep sacks to encourage safe infant sleep practices. The hospital's Breastfeeding Corner, installed last year by CHF, was also revisited and received positive feedback from beneficiaries. Dr. Neeraj Yadav (Dy. Superintendent) and other authorities lauded CHF's continuous contributions to maternal and child health.

Through these diverse celebrations, CHF's Breastfeeding Week 2025 initiative underscored the vital role of awareness, community engagement, and compassionate support in nurturing the earliest stages of life.

School Health Programme

Vikramgad Block, Palghar District, Maharashtra

By the end of August 2025, Child Help Foundation's (CHF) School Health Programme team had conducted field visits across multiple schools, screening the students and issuing them health cards. Doctors treated the cases of illness, with fever, cough, cold, diarrhoea, abdominal pain, and vomiting being the most common ailments.

Students with more serious conditions were not left behind—five were referred to higher health institutions, including Rural Hospitals, PHCs, and charitable hospitals, for further treatment and follow-up care. Alongside medical interventions, the team placed strong emphasis on mental health, conducting 46 awareness sessions that sensitised the students on adolescent wellbeing, including managing thoughts, behaviour, reading difficulties, and anger.

Through capacity-building sessions, the students were also educated on vital topics such as POSH-POCSO, anaemia, nutrition, HIV/AIDS, sexual and reproductive health, and their responsibilities within the school environment. To strengthen teacher involvement, two Training of Trainers (ToT) were organised for the teachers at Vikramgad Ashram School and Vikramgad High School, enabling them to better support their students' health and overall development.











Donation of Essential Supplies

Fort Kochi, Kerala

On 23rd August 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) donated essential supplies at Ashwasa Bhavan, Fort Kochi, Kerala. The contribution included essential food items, hygiene products, and sanitary supplies such as biscuits, jam, rice, sugar, cooking oil, soap powder, toothpaste, Lizol, and sanitary pads. The Kerala Team personally handed over the items, ensuring the children's daily needs were met with care and dignity.



Medical Equipment Handover

Palghar, Maharashtra

On 12th August 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) organised a Handing-Over Ceremony at Palghar Civil Hospital for the medical equipment donated by Saraswat Bank under its CSR initiative. The contribution included 9 Portable X-ray Machines, 9 DR Systems with Laptops, and 9 Healthcare Diagnostic Kits with Mobile Phones. The equipment was formally received by Civil Surgeon Dr. Ramdas Marad and his team of technicians, who also attended demonstrations to ensure proper usage and handling of the machines.







Backpacks and Water Bottle Distribution

The children's smiles delighted the donors, and teachers and staff expressed heartfelt appreciation to Child Help Foundation and the donors for their thoughtful support.

Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with The Thought Bulb and Bain distributed cycles and snacks to underprivileged children. The initiative aimed to ease their commute to school, encourage regular attendance, and promote consistent education. Beyond improving accessibility, the program fostered joy, independence, and confidence among the children, creating a lasting positive impact on their academic journey.









Quality Education (SDG-4)

Centre Of Excellence Project

Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

The Centre of Excellence Project by Child Help Foundation (CHF) is an educational initiative aimed at improving the quality of learning in municipal schools through supportive education, digital literacy, inclusivity, and life skills. The programme currently benefits students from Standards 1st to 7th across three Mira Bhaindar Municipal Corporation (MBMC) schools, Municipal School No. 36 Bandarwadi (Bhayandar East), Municipal School No. 20 Miragaon (Mira Road East), and Municipal School No. 24 Morva (Bhayandar West).

Teachers have been deployed to conduct supportive education classes and implement a structured computer training curriculum covering both theory and practical skills such as the history of computers, hardware and software basics, MS Paint, MS Word, and typing. Alongside classroom learning, the initiative involves home visits to engage parents, awareness programmes on the POCSO Act, and special batches for 10th Standard students at MBMC School No. 4.

To track progress, pre, midline, and postsurveys were conducted with the students from Grades 1st to 8th across the three schools, results showed significant improvement. While the project has achieved measurable impact, it continues to face several challenges that limit its full potential. Many partner schools either lack computer equipment altogether or have non-functional systems, making it difficult to deliver consistent digital learning. Frequent internet disruptions further disrupt lessons, while the absence of dedicated computer labs and proper seating arrangements restricts the quality of classroom experiences. In addition, systems require



frequent repair and troubleshooting, and wide learning gaps between students' age and grade levels make it harder to ensure uniform academic progress.

Looking ahead, the plan focuses on strengthening learning outcomes through regular academic assessments, continuous feedback collection from students, parents, and teachers, and targeted interventions to improve performance. The programme also envisions gender equality training across all the MBMC schools, alongside POCSO and POSH sessions for staff and faculty to create a safe, inclusive environment. To make this vision sustainable, support from MBMC will be crucial in providing essential educational equipment, ensuring regular maintenance and connectivity, developing proper infrastructure such as computer labs and seating, and fostering stronger collaboration from principals, teachers, and administrators.







Mini Science Centre

Palghar, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Mini Science Centre (MSC) project, supported by the Samata Equal Footing Foundation, is being implemented in 10 Ashram Schools across Palghar District, Maharashtra. Three teacher-cum-coordinators have been appointed to conduct interactive science sessions using MSC lab models during regular school visits.

In August, session schedules were impacted by heavy rainfall, school holidays, festivals including Rakshabandhan, Janmashtami, Ganesh festival, Independence Day, and examination days. Consequently, the coordinators were able to conduct sessions on 12 days during the month.





Mini Science Centre

Bihar

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Mini Science Centre (MSC) project, supported by National Fertilizers Limited, is being implemented at M S Maur and M S Koyaribigha Schools in Barbigha, Bihar. CHF teachers continued conducting regular science and math classes in the MSC labs.

In August, the schools remained closed for five festivals, but students eagerly look forward to visiting the Mini Science Lab and actively enjoy the interactive sessions conducted there.







Computer Labs Bihar

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Computer Lab project, supported by National Fertilizers Limited, is implemented at Tailik School Utkramit Uchch Vidhyalay, Lodhipur, and Madhya Vidhyalay Samas, Barbigha block, Sheikhpura, Bihar. Each lab is equipped with 21 computers, well-furnished, and maintained, with three teachers appointed per lab to conduct sessions.

This month, the schools were closed for the festivals, limiting the number of classes conducted. Despite this, students actively participated in the sessions, enjoyed the learning experience, and gained valuable computer skills.





Mahindra University Internship Session

Hyderabad, Telangana

On 13th August 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) visited Mahindra University to attend students' internship presentations. Over 50 students participated, with 14 presenting their projects, including Child Help Foundation interns Ms. Saanvi and Mr. Bhavvik, who showcased the foundation's initiatives and impressed the faculty. The team also presented an overview of Child Help Foundation, engaged in in-depth discussions with faculty, and distributed brochures to raise awareness. The college expressed appreciation and interest, promising an additional session with prospective interns in the near future.







STEM Lab

In January 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) installed a STEM Lab at Ramnath Naik Memorial High School, Goa, in collaboration with the Government of Goa and the CSR Authority of Goa. The lab is equipped with 80 science and math models, and students use it regularly for hands-on learning.

The Goa Board Examination 2025 reflected the lab's impact, with more than two-thirds of students securing distinction and first-class marks. The principal, Mr. Naik, expressed heartfelt gratitude to CHF, noting a significant increase in students' interest, engagement, and confidence in Science and Mathematics

Digital Skills Program

Vikramgad, Maharashtra

In August, Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted 552 sessions across 15 schools, combining practical demonstrations, classroom lessons, and extracurricular activities such as games, skits, and rhymes. Training of Trainers (ToT) sessions were held in ten schools, with the teachers participating in modules covering syllabus overview, training methods, yearly activity planning, student progress tracking, and implementation mechanisms. Trainers also facilitated assessment surveys conducted by the Sys Foundation, covering 13 schools by the end of the month.

On 7th August, a coordination meeting was held at Vikramgad with Child Help Foundation trainers, the Program Manager, LTPCT representative Mr Akshay Katad, and Sys Foundation members to discuss syllabus implementation challenges and record-keeping. A follow-up Sys Foundation training session on HTML and syllabus revision was attended by all 15 trainers.

On 8th August, a ToT session led by a School Health Program counsellor oriented trainers on essential life skills for students, including communication, teamwork, critical thinking, and goal setting through interactive activities.

On 21st August, the project was presented at a meeting organized by ITDP Jawhar, attended by the Project Officer, Assistant Project Officer, and representatives from organizations working in Vikramgad and Jawhar.

Invisible Girl Project Maharashtra

In August 2025, the Child Help Foundation (CHF) team conducted awareness sessions on child marriage and female foeticide across schools and colleges in Maharashtra. Students actively participated by sharing their views and emphasizing the importance of education, employment, and selfconfidence in ending child marriage. Girls, in particular, expressed determination to continue higher studies and make independent decisions about their lives. The sessions helped students think critically, motivated them to bring change, and provided opportunities for CHF to connect with new institutions. Principals and teachers appreciated the "Save Our Daughter" initiative, which made the outreach even more meaningful.

The Maharashtra team completed 25 sessions, across Palghar, Mira Bhayandar/Thane, and Raigad. Trainers Akesh Minde (Beed/Raigad), Annarao Waghmare (Palghar), and Krutika Koli (Mira/Bhayandar) successfully conducted 9, 10, and 6 sessions respectively. Supportive teachers and principals enhanced engagement, while the students were encouraged to think responsibly and share their opinions. Challenges included limited resources such as halls, electricity, and digital tools, as well as social resistance due

to traditional beliefs. Outreach was also delayed during Ganesh Chaturthi due to school closures and festive activities.

Key learnings from August highlighted the need for regular sessions, use of local languages like Marathi, and targeting larger schools to reach more students efficiently. Moving forward, CHF plans to continue awareness sessions in schools, colleges, and communities, aiming to reach around more students and community members in the coming months. In September, sessions will focus primarily on schools and colleges to maximize outreach, spread awareness among both men and women, and empower young people to create a lasting societal impact.







Invisible Girl Project Haryana

In August 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) team conducted 39 awareness and sensitization sessions across educational institutions in Rewari and Mahendergarh. The sessions engaged students and teachers in meaningful discussions about social issues, their rights, and ways to challenge harmful social customs. Participants shared the challenges they observe in their communities and were encouraged to take proactive steps towards creating positive change. The initiative aimed to empower youth, students, and teachers while fostering awareness of social wellbeing and individual rights.

The trainers included Ms. Nitanshi Yadav (16 sessions in Rewari, 7 in Mahendergarh), Mr. Ajit (6 sessions in Rewari, 8 in Mahendergarh), and Ms. Anu Bharti (2 sessions in Mahendergarh). Participants highly appreciated the initiative, noting its positive impact on their communities and expressing confidence in the long-term benefits of such interventions. The Haryana team demonstrated strong initiative through strategic planning, effective coordination for permissions, adaptive outreach strategies, and efficient execution of sessions.

Challenges during the month included school holidays and excessive rainfall, which

led to postponements in some institutions. Despite these setbacks, the team successfully conducted the majority of planned sessions, and approvals have already been secured for rescheduled outreach in September. The August efforts highlighted the team's strong performance, strategic planning, and ability to adapt, while continuing to make meaningful connections with students and teachers across the state.





