Child Help Foundation (CHF) Inaugurates Clean Water & Sanitation Project in Andheri East, Mumbai

Child Help Foundation (CHF) successfully inaugurated the Clean Water & Sanitation Project in Andheri East, Mumbai, on 16 February 2026. Implemented in alignment with SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), the initiative aims to improve access to safe drinking water, sanitation, and menstrual hygiene facilities for schoolchildren and the surrounding Nagardas community. The project was inaugurated across three key locations, BMC School, Chandivali; Urdu School No. 2, Mohili Village; and a community toilet at Nagardas Road, focusing on strengthening hygiene infrastructure and promoting healthier living environments.

At the school level, the installation of water filters with coolers ensures access to clean drinking water for students, while sanitary napkin vending machines and incinerators promote safe and dignified menstrual hygiene management. Awareness sessions were also conducted to educate girls on healthy practices, directly benefiting nearly 1,500 students. Extending its impact beyond schools, the refurbishment of a heavily used community toilet at Nagardas Road has significantly improved sanitation access for approximately 5,000 residents, reinforcing the importance of hygiene in densely populated urban areas.

The inauguration was graced by key dignitaries, including Mr. Kartikayen, Company Director, along with CSR representatives and school authorities. CHF's leadership, including Executive Director Mr. Jiji John and Dr. Sunil Pandey, engaged with stakeholders to explore

future collaborations and strengthen support for underserved communities. The initiative received strong appreciation from community members and stands as a testament to the power of collaborative efforts in addressing critical water and sanitation challenges, furthering CHF's mission to create healthier, safer, and more dignified environments for all.

The activity not only sparks creativity but also reinforces the importance of sustainable choices in everyday life. When children create something with their own hands, the lesson becomes personal and

lasting.

Tree-planting drives are another vital component of CHF's environmental efforts. By actively involving children in planting saplings, the organisation helps them form a direct connection with nature. Children learn about the role of trees in maintaining ecological balance, improving air quality, conserving biodiversity, and supporting life on land. More importantly, nurturing these saplings over time teaches patience, care, and long-term responsibility, values that extend far beyond environmental protection.

These initiatives collectively align with SDG 15: Life on Land, which focuses on protecting, restoring, and promoting sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems. Through awareness programmes and participatory activities, CHF helps build a generation that understands the value of forests, biodiversity, and sustainable land use. K Priyansh, 9 Months Primary Hemophagocytic Lymphohistiocytosis

“He is only nine months old and has already suffered so much. I work as a daily wage labourer, but my earnings are never certain. We are already in debt, yet we cannot abandon our son. We just want to see him grow up like any other child.”

Four months ago, nine-month-old K Priyansh from Naigonda, Andhra Pradesh, was rushed to the hospital with a severe and persistent fever. What began as concern over high temperatures soon turned into fear as multiple tests were conducted. The results brought devastating news: Priyansh was diagnosed with Primary Hemophagocytic Lymphohistiocytosis, a rare and life-threatening condition that requires urgent and specialised treatment.

Since then, his parents' lives have revolved around hospital rooms and medical consultations. Doctors at Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad, Telangana (5 km from Khairatabad Railway Station), have advised

hematopoietic stem cell transplantation, the only treatment that can offer Priyansh a real chance at survival and a healthy future. The cost of this life-saving procedure is Rs. 20,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Lakh Only), an amount far beyond the family's means.

Priyansh's mother, Jayamma, stays constantly by his side, holding his tiny hands through every test and procedure. The family of three survives on a limited income, with mounting financial pressure adding to their emotional burden.

Despite everything, Priyansh continues to fight bravely. His small life carries immense strength, and with timely medical support and compassion, he can be given the opportunity to live the childhood he deserves.

School Health Programme

Vikramgad Block, Palghar, Maharashtra

Under the School Health Program, Child Help Foundation (CHF) continued to strengthen access to preventive and curative healthcare for school-going children, with a focus on physical and mental well-being. A total of 1,609 illness cases were treated with necessary medical support and medications, covering common concerns such as seasonal illnesses, communicable diseases, skin infections, dental issues, anaemia, and menstrual health among adolescent girls. Five students were referred to higher

healthcare facilities, including Sub District Hospital, Jawhar, Sambare Hospital, and Vedanta Hospital, Dhundalwadi, for specialised treatment. The programme also addressed emotional well-being by providing individual counselling to 9 students on issues such as family stress, peer conflicts, ADHD, and overall mental health. Additionally, mental health awareness sessions reached 1,834 students in Classes IX–XII, while 39 classroom sessions on themes such as “My School, My Responsibility” and personal hygiene further strengthened students’ awareness, life skills, and healthy practices.

World Cancer Day

Kochi

Child Help Foundation (CHF), on the occasion of World Cancer Day, organized a cancer awareness session at Santa Cruz Higher Secondary School, Fort Kochi. The session engaged students and teachers, focusing on cancer prevention, early detection, and the importance of adopting healthy lifestyle practices.



Digital Skills Programme

Vikramgad Block, Palghar, Maharashtra

Under the Child Help Foundation (CHF) Digital Skills Program, 912 sessions were conducted across 15 schools, reaching 20,173 cumulative student attendances and 4,447 unique beneficiaries through a blend of classroom-based theoretical, practical, and video-supported learning. An LTPCT virtual meeting was held to plan the upcoming year's implementation strategy, including expansion into new locations and focus areas. To strengthen trainer capacity, two Training of Trainers (ToT) sessions were organised by SYS Foundation, one on 14 February 2026 covering QBasic, Large Language Models (AI), social media, and chatbots, and a second session focusing on Scratch programming and various Google applications, enhancing both technical and instructional capabilities.



Computer Training Centre

Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted 75 classes during the reporting month, recording 1,485 student attendances with 122 unique beneficiaries. Students were trained in essential digital skills, including MS Word, PowerPoint, presentation development, and file management, enhancing their practical knowledge and confidence in using technology.

Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted 107 computer education classes, reaching 3,351 student attendances and 466 unique beneficiaries. The sessions covered internet browsers, Typing Master, Notepad, and WordPad, shortcut keys, menu functions, and Microsoft Excel with practical exercises. Additional hands-on activities, such as drawing screen layouts, helped strengthen students' understanding of computer concepts.

Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted 91 sessions, recording 1,985 student attendances with 239 unique beneficiaries. Students received training through theory and practical sessions on HTML, font usage, and various Google applications and tools. The programme also integrated awareness sessions on HIV/AIDS, peer pressure, and POCSO, benefiting 2,354 students.

Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace (POSH)

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, commonly known as the POSH Act, is a landmark initiative by the Government of India to ensure safe and dignified workplaces for women. Child Help Foundation (CHF) is fully compliant with the POSH Act across all offices, field locations, and virtual workspaces. The organisation's approach extends beyond legal compliance, fostering a culture rooted in dignity and respect, with zero tolerance for sexual harassment.

The Internal Committee (IC) addresses every complaint with fairness and confidentiality. All new employees undergo mandatory POSH policy training, while existing staff members participate in regular sensitisation workshops. Through a "Train the Trainer" programme, CHF has developed a cadre of 25 certified POSH trainers across India. These trainers have conducted awareness sessions to reach individuals and have mentored and certified three external professionals or members to enhance outreach and long-term impact. ICC Meeting (Case)

Child Help Foundation (CHF) was appointed as an External NGO Member to the POSH Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) at Panchayat Samiti, Vasai, for a three-year tenure. During a committee meeting, CHF actively participated in formal proceedings to address a POSH complaint, which was successfully resolved through a collaborative and diligent process. This role reinforces CHF's commitment to promoting institutional justice and ensuring safe, harassment-free environments within public service systems.



Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO)

Child Help Foundation (CHF) places child safety at the core of its mission, strictly adhering to the POCSO Act 2012, which protects children under 18 from sexual abuse and harassment while ensuring

child-friendly complaint, investigation, and court processes. Regular 'Good Touch – Bad Touch' sessions are conducted in schools to teach children how to recognise unsafe touch, set boundaries, seek help, and use the Child Helpline number 1098.
