# A Father's Struggle to Bring Back His Son's Smile

"My son cannot speak properly, eat without difficulty, or enjoy the simple joys of life like

other children. He was born without hands and legs, and now this condition makes life

even harder for him. But I will keep trying until he gets the help he needs."

-Shekhar (Father)

Seven-year-old Vidhur from Saharanpur, Uttar Pradesh, has never known an easy life.

Born without hands and legs, he has faced unimaginable challenges since birth. To make matters worse, Vidhur has also been suffering from Temporomandibular Joint (TMJ) Ankylosis, a painful condition that restricts the movement of his jaw, making it difficult for him to open his mouth, eat, or speak.

His parents first noticed the symptoms early on, but due to their financial limitations, they could not seek proper treatment. After multiple consultations, doctors at Panacea Hospital, Dehradun, Uttarakhand, confirmed that Vidhur urgently needs

Temporomandibular Joint Surgery to ease his pain and give him a chance at a better future. The cost of this treatment is Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees Six Lakh Only).

Shekhar, a labourer and the only earning member of a seven-member family, is struggling to make ends meet. He is already in debt after trying everything possible to save for his son's treatment.

To combat the stigma around public breastfeeding in India, Child Help Foundation (CHF) has set up several Baby Feeding Centres (BFCs) nationwide. These centres offer safe and comfortable environments for nursing mothers, enabling them to move freely without the worry of breastfeeding in public. So far, 2,29,010 mothers have benefited from these supportive spaces, which prioritise dignity, ease, and care for both women and their babies.



## **School Health Programme**

#### Vikramgad Block, Palghar District, Maharashtra

By the end of July 2025, the School Health Programme team conducted field visits across multiple schools, screening newly admitted students and issuing their health cards. Doctors addressed a wide range of seasonal illnesses such as scabies, fungal infections, dental caries, and ear discharge, ensuring that each child received timely treatment and necessary medication. Students requiring more specialized care were referred to external hospitals and charitable institutions for follow-up treatment.

Beyond medical care, the programme also offered personal counselling to students, helping them navigate life challenges, focus better on their studies, and address behavioural concerns. Mental well-being was a key priority, with the team conducting awareness sessions on topics such as emotional regulation, anger management, depression, and coping strategies for everyday challenges.

Through the student capacity-building initiative, children engaged in interactive sessions on personal hygiene, good and bad touch, peer pressure, HIV/AIDS, POSH & POCSO, early marriage and childbearing, anaemia and nutrition, healthy eating habits, and sexual and reproductive health—equipping them with knowledge and skills for a healthier, safer future.



## Led Water Bottle Donation by UNOREX REALITY

On 17th July 2025, UNOREX REALITY, in a compassionate gesture, donated LED water bottles to paediatric patients and Bone Marrow Transplant (BMT) donors at Arogya Sadan, a centre supporting individuals with life-threatening conditions such as Thalassemia. ## **Centre Of Excellence Project**

#### Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

On 22nd July 2025, Dr. Madhu Singh, representing LTPCT, visited the Digital Lab of MBMC School No. 24 to explore the structure, implementation, and impact of digital learning in Mira-Bhayandar's municipal schools.

Welcomed by the school administration, Dr. Singh toured the digital infrastructure, including smart boards and interactive teaching tools, and observed how they are enhancing classroom engagement. She also interacted with teachers and students, gaining first-hand insights into how technology is transforming traditional lessons into dynamic, tech-enabled learning experiences.





## **Mini Science Centre**

#### Palghar, Maharashtra

The Mini Science Centre project, supported by Samata Equal Footing, is being implemented in 10 Ashram Schools in Palghar district, Maharashtra. Three teacher-cum-coordinators have been appointed to conduct classes using the models and resources provided in the MSC labs.

With schools reopening in mid-July, coordinators resumed sessions for both newly enrolled and continuing students. Despite heavy rains in Palghar during the month, classes continued uninterrupted, ensuring students could consistently engage with hands-on science learning.









# Mini Science Centre

The Mini Science Centre project, supported by National Fertilizers Limited, is being implemented at M S Maur and M S Koyaribigha School in Barbigha, Bihar. With the start of the new academic year, both new and returning students are engaging in science and math classes conducted by the CHF teacher. The Mini Science Lab has become a favorite learning space, with students eagerly looking forward to their sessions and enjoying the hands-on learning experience it offers.



# Computer Labs

The Computer Lab project, supported by National Fertilizers Limited, is being implemented at Tailik School Utkramit Uchch Vidhyalay, Lodhipur, and Madhya Vidhyalay Samas in Barbigha block, Sheikhpura, Bihar. Each lab is equipped with 21 computers, well-furnished facilities, and three dedicated teachers.

With the reopening of schools for the new academic year, computer classes have resumed, providing students from various grades with regular, structured training to strengthen their digital skills.







## **Digital Skills Program**

#### **Computer Training Centre**

#### Amboli, Dadra & Nagar Haveli

In July, Child Help Foundation (CHF) delivered 78 engaging digital skills sessions that combined practical demonstrations, theoretical lessons, and interactive activities such as games, skits, and rhymes. Students learned beginner-level typing, revised Microsoft Word, explored the parts and applications of a computer, and practiced using MS Paint.

Beyond classroom training, the trainer also participated in school initiatives, including a Dengue Prevention Rally, the formation of the Bal Sansad, and the "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" tree-planting campaign, contributing to both student learning and community awareness.





### **Computer Training Centre**

#### Silvassa, Daman & Diu

In July, Child Help Foundation (CHF) delivered 120 digital literacy sessions covering topics such as input and output devices, parts of a computer, Typing Master, MS Word, and essential features of MS Excel.

Alongside classroom teaching, the trainer participated in a Gurupurnima celebration where students created cards to express their gratitude to teachers, highlighting the importance of mentorship.

## **Digital Skills Program**

## **Urban Underprivileged Educational Programme**

#### **New Delhi**

On 14th July 2025, Child Help Foundation's self-funded Slum Education Programme in Mohan Estate, New Delhi, marked its sixmonth milestone. Coordinated by Ms. Kanchan and the Haryana team, the initiative focuses on improving learning outcomes and socio-emotional

development among children in slum communities. This first major review assessed key progress indicators, including attendance, learning improvements, and community participation, ensuring the programme stays on track to deliver lasting educational impact.



## Internship Collaboration with Andhra Mahila Sabha College for Women

#### Hyderabad, Telangana

Child Help Foundation (CHF) visited Andhra Mahila Sabha Arts and Science College for Women and met with Principal Dr. K. Jansi Rani and Vice Principal Ms. Vasudhara to introduce Child Help Foundation's internship program, outlining its objectives, benefits, and focus on social impact. While the college is already associated with 2–3 institutes for internships, the principal expressed interest in exploring additional opportunities. She invited CHF for a detailed discussion to explore potential collaboration that would complement their existing programs.



### **Child for Child Initiative**

As part of the Child for Child (CFC) initiative, we visited Krishnaveni Talent School to conduct an assembly talk focused on childrelated issues, including health, education, rights, and the importance of helping those in need. The session aimed to nurture empathy, responsibility, and social contribution among students. We handed over the CFC Collection Form to the teacher for distribution, inviting students to participate in a tangible act of giving that fosters ownership in creating positive change. This initiative supports Child Help Foundation's mission to improve healthcare, education, nutrition, and emergency aid for underprivileged children across India. In a related effort, student interns from Symbiosis Law School, Pune, successfully conducted a drive to raise awareness about CHF's programs. The drive not only mobilized resources for children in need but also engaged young legal minds in social responsibility, building long-term visibility and trust for the foundation's work.





## **Gender Equality (SDG-5)**

## **Invisible Girl Project**

Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation (CHF) volunteer Krutika has been actively visiting schools and colleges across Mumbai Suburban to seek permission for upcoming awareness sessions, successfully covering around 15-20 institutions so far. She conducted a mock session under the guidance of Dr. Sunil Pandey and Ms. Jyoti Kamble, along with trial sessions at Morwa School (MBMC), Palghar Kokan English School, and Chapekar College. Earlier, she was trained on using Google Drive for uploading photos and reports, as well as on writing reports in the proper format. She also prepared and submitted an official permission letter, which has led to the scheduling of three to five awareness sessions in the first week of August.

In Raigad district, Akesh conducted twelve awareness sessions in schools and colleges, while in Palghar district, Mr. Annarao held twenty-three sessions across different institutions. In Mira-Bhayandar, the ongoing recruitment and training of a new coordinator limited activities, with only one

session conducted at Cama Hospital,

reaching twenty-nine beneficiaries.

During July, the programme reached 10,573 beneficiaries in Palghar, 4,726 in Raigad, and 29 in Mira-Bhayandar, bringing the total to 15,328 beneficiaries for the month. Looking ahead, more sessions are planned for schools, communities, Anganwadi parents, NGO staff, PHC centres, and ASHA workers in the coming months.













# Invisible Girl Project Haryana

In July 2025, Child Help Foundation's Haryana outreach team actively conducted awareness and sensitization sessions across educational institutions, engaging both students and teachers in meaningful discussions on social issues, rights, and overall well-being. During these sessions, participants openly shared the challenges and harmful customs they observed in their communities, while being encouraged to work towards eliminating such practices.

A total of 42 sessions were held across the state. In Rewari, Ms. Nitanshi Yadav conducted eight sessions, Mr. Ajit held two, and together they facilitated fifteen joint sessions. In Mahendergarh, Ms. Anu Bharti led eight sessions, while Mr. Ajit conducted nine. These efforts reached 4,312 individuals in Rewari and 3,580 in Mahendergarh, benefiting a total of 7,892 people.

August height Francischer Seiter august height Seit The response from educational institutions was overwhelmingly positive, with students and teachers appreciating CHF's initiative and expressing confidence that it will inspire real, meaningful change in their communities. The Haryana team showed strong initiative in setting strategic goals, securing permissions from institutions, and adapting their approach to meet timeframes and logistical requirements.









### Prerna Manch: ARSH & Life Skills Initiative

#### Palghar, Maharashtra

On 18th July 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) visited Bhopoli Ashram School, Ms. Shilpa Lokhande conducted an evaluation and monitoring session on the implementation of the newly introduced Five Life Skills. The purpose was to assess the effectiveness of the training being delivered and to guide trainers in enhancing their facilitation techniques.

Each trainer was allotted 40 minutes to present their module using demonstrations and interactive activities designed to engage students and promote practical understanding. While the sessions reflected strong effort and creativity, the evaluation highlighted the need for greater clarity in presentation and more in-depth activities to strengthen learning outcomes.

Constructive feedback was shared on both the revised training material and delivery approach, with trainers encouraged to apply these insights in future sessions. The visit covered a group of active life skills participants, ending on a positive note as trainers expressed motivation to refine their methods and further support the personal development of their students.

## **POSH Awareness Sessions**

Child Help Foundation (CHF) continues to lead the way in promoting safe, respectful, and inclusive spaces through impactful awareness sessions on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) Act and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. In May 2025, CHF organized several dynamic training programs across India, engaging a wide range of participants.

#### **POSH Awareness Sessions**

- Taj Lands End, Bandra, Maharashtra:
   On, 4th July 2025, Child Help Foundation conducted a POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) awareness training at Taj Lands End, Bandra, Mumbai, with 45 participants. The session, led by trainer Ms. Chris, focused on the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.
- The training aimed to create awareness, foster a safe and inclusive workplace, strengthen internal complaint mechanisms, and promote a culture of dignity, equity, and zero tolerance towards harassment.
- Participants gained valuable insights into legal protections and their roles in ensuring a respectful and harassmentfree environment. "Such trainings are vital to sensitizing teams and embedding respect and accountability in organizational culture," noted CHF.
- Miracle Software Systems, Vizag, Andhra Pradesh On 11th July 2025, Child Help Foundation, in collaboration with CSR partner Miracle Software Systems, conducted POSH awareness programs at M-Heights, Hill 1 and Hill 2, in Vizag. The sessions were graced by chief guests Ms. Pooja and Ms. Preethi at Hill 1, and Ms.

Roshni and Ms. Anjali at Hill 2. These initiatives highlighted how meaningful community-driven programs can enhance employee satisfaction, loyalty, and engagement. By setting clear objectives, delivering tailored and engaging content at regular intervals, and incorporating structured feedback loops, the POSH awareness sessions aimed to go beyond compliance, fostering a truly respectful and inclusive workplace culture.

- Taj Lands, Mumbai, Maharashtra-The POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) training is designed to educate employees, employers, managers, and Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) members about their roles and responsibilities under the law. Its primary purpose is to ensure legal compliance while fostering safe, respectful, and inclusive work environments across Indian workplaces. The session was highly interactive, with participants actively engaging and raising questions about the inquiry process, the HR's role, and the responsibilities of the external member. These discussions, particularly towards the end, ignited enthusiasm and reinforced the importance of conducting such training sessions regularly to build awareness and accountability.
- Saraswati Vidya School, Takri, Rewari, Haryana: Child Help Foundation conducted a POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) awareness session at Saraswati Vidya School, Takri, Rewari, Haryana, led by trainer Neha. The session was attended by 24 teachers, including both male and female staff, along with students.



## **POSH & POCSO Sessions - Pan India**

It aimed to educate participants on the legal framework of the POSH Act, define inappropriate behaviors, and promote a culture of zero tolerance towards sexual harassment in educational institutions. The discussion also emphasized the importance of fostering a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment.

- The session was highly interactive, with attendees asking questions and sharing their perspectives. Teachers appreciated the clarity of the explanations, and the school principal, Mr. Pardeep Rao, a Merchant Navy officer expressed gratitude for CHF's valuable guidance and commitment to social responsibility.
- Child Help Foundation conducted a POSH training session for GEPL Capital Pvt Ltd's Pan India team in Mumbai, led by Mary Vanmali, with around 90 participants joining online and offline. The session emphasized fostering a healthy, safe, and inclusive work environment, highlighting well-being, safety protocols, and open communication.
- The session is designed to foster collaboration, knowledge sharing, and strategic alignment among Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) members through an interactive workshop. It focuses on deepening the understanding of IC roles, strengthening the implementation of POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment) guidelines, and building a unified approach to creating a safe, inclusive, and respectful workplace environment.
- ICC quarterly meeting was held today at Nirali A M Naik Charitable HealthCare

Facility, Mumbai, Maharashtra On 8th July 2025, the ICC quarterly meeting was held at Nirali A. M. Naik Charitable Healthcare Facility in Andheri West, Maharashtra, benefiting five participants. Coordinated by Mary Vanmali, the session was conducted in line with the POSH Act to finalise the organisation's POSH policy, safeguard the workplace from sexual offences, and promote gender equality. The training aimed to sensitise employees, strengthen internal complaint mechanisms, and foster a workplace culture rooted in dignity and inclusion.

- Touch Bad Touch session–Kolkata, West Bengal On 28th July 2025, student interns from UPES College, Dehradun, interning with Child Help Foundation across Mumbai, Pune, and Kolkata, conducted a session in Kolkata to assess children's baseline knowledge of personal safety, boundaries, and the concept of good touch versus bad touch. The findings revealed that approximately one-third to nearly half of the children lacked sufficient understanding of safe versus unsafe touch.
- Awareness Session with school children in Badshahpur, Haryana interiors The session focused on teaching children about good touch and bad touch, overall well-being, and general hygiene. Such sessions aim to sensitize children to stay aware, focused, and mindful of their own well-being. By helping them understand the difference between acceptable (good) and unacceptable (bad) touch, the program builds awareness and equips them to recognize and respond to potentially harmful situations.



## **POSH & POCSO Sessions - Pan India**

Discussions on handwashing, personal cleanliness, and healthy routines further reinforced the importance of disease prevention—particularly vital in rural areas during the monsoon and other high-risk seasons. This broader approach not only promotes personal safety but also nurtures habits that support long-term physical and mental health.


