Yoga for Every Body: Fostering Wellness, Inclusion, and National Unity

Child Help Foundation (CHF), a pan-India non-profit dedicated to uplifting underprivileged communities, celebrated International Yoga Day 2025 with a strong emphasis on accessibility, youth empowerment, and national participation. Guided by the belief that yoga is for every body and every ability, CHF organized a series of impactful yoga initiatives that brought together children, youth, and communities across diverse geographies—from the classrooms of Mumbai Suburban to the grand coastline of Vizag.

On 21st June 2025, student interns from Mumbai University, Christ University, UPES, and Lovely Professional University conducted lively and inclusive yoga sessions at Toddlers International School, Mumbai, Maharashtra. Engaging 28 students from Grades 1 to 6, the sessions introduced foundational yoga postures and mindful breathing techniques, helping children develop physical strength, emotional balance, and mental focus. This early introduction to yoga served as a gentle step toward building self-discipline, inner calm, and holistic well-being in young learners.

CHF's Vizag branch, in partnership with HVR Youth, proudly participated in the Record-Breaking International Yoga Day 2025 celebration held along a 28 km coastal stretch in Vizag, Andhra Pradesh. With over 3,000 participants, including dignitaries like Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, CM Shri N. Chandrababu Naidu, and Dy. CM Shri Pawan Kalyan, the event was a historic testament to yoga's power to unite the nation.

CHF's 50+ staff and volunteers actively managed 15 segments of the event, ensuring

smooth logistics, assisting participants, and upholding safety protocols. Their contribution was appreciated by state and central officials, reinforcing CHF's role as a key grassroots partner in national wellness campaigns.

"This year's theme, 'Yoga for Every Body,' reflects our belief that wellness is a right, not a privilege," said Mr. Shaji Varghese, CEO of Child Help Foundation. Vijay Thakare, 11 Year Relapsed Blood Cancer

Holding on to Hope: Vijay's Fight Against Cancer

"Every night, I lie awake listening to my son's breathing, wondering if tomorrow will come for him. I've never felt so helpless in my life. I would give anything..just to see him healthy again. But I cannot do this alone. Please, help me save my son's life."

Eleven-year-old Vijay Thakare from Nashik, Maharashtra, is a spirited child whose life took a drastic turn when a seemingly harmless fever turned into every parent's worst nightmare. After weeks of uncertainty, blood tests revealed the unthinkable: Vijay was battling **Relapsed Blood Cancer**.

Doctors at Namco Hospital, Nashik (14.1 km from Nashik Railway Station, Maharashtra), have recommended an urgent Bone Marrow Transplant along with essential supportive care. The total estimated cost of this life-saving treatment is Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakh Only).

Vijay's father, Raju, a daily wage labourer, is the sole breadwinner for the family. With his limited income and existing debts, affording this critical treatment is beyond his means.

Despite his illness, Vijay remains full of life, with dreams just like any child his age. Your support can give him the chance to live those dreams. Let's come together and help Vijay fight cancer once again.

and diabetes screenings were conducted through blood tests to enable early detection and timely referral. The camp aimed to improve access to essential healthcare for underserved rural communities while promoting awareness around preventive health.

Maternal and Child Health Initiatives

Palghar District, Maharashtra

On 11th June 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with DiagnoSearch, organized a one-day Community Health Camp at Vinval Village, Jawhar, Palghar, under the Maternal and Child Health Initiative. The camp aimed to provide basic health services, with a focus on women and children. A total of 288 beneficiaries received health checkups, consultations, and free medicines and supplements. Screenings were conducted for anaemia, diabetes, and other common conditions, with 11 critical cases referred to nearby hospitals. Health education sessions raised awareness on hygiene, nutrition, and preventive care. Despite a high turnout and logistical challenges, the camp made a significant impact in improving healthcare access in this underserved community.

The health camp benefited a total of 288 individuals, including 104 children, with a majority of 226 female beneficiaries and 62

males. Screening and diagnostic tests were conducted for 57 participants, and 11 were referred to nearby hospitals for further treatment. Common health issues reported included respiratory and general complaints such as fever, cough, vomiting, and joint pain (133 cases), followed by abdominal and menstrual pain, lower limb pain, and loose motion (79 cases). Other observed conditions included back and body pain (16), skin infections (10), fungal infections (9), epigastric discomfort (15), and minor issues like dental (6), ENT and eye problems (5), and GERD-related complaints (5). A few cases also reported blurry vision (1), irregular menstrual cycles (2), and lymph node swelling (1). Out of those screened, 46 individuals were found to be within normal health parameters, while 11 were diagnosed with conditions like anaemia, typhoid, platelet abnormalities, or abnormal blood sugar levels.

These centres offer safe and comfortable environments for nursing mothers, enabling them to move freely without the worry of breastfeeding in public. So far, 2,29,010 mothers have benefited from these supportive spaces, which prioritise dignity, ease, and care for both women and their babies.



Nutrition Kit Distribution for TB Patients

Vikhroli, Mumbai, Maharashtra

On 28th June 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with Filaantro, the National Tuberculosis Elimination Program, and the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), organized a nutrition kit distribution drive under the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukt Bharat Yojna (PMTBMB) at Vikhroli, Mumbai. Led by Mr. Mahindra Patil, PMM Coordinator, the initiative supported 20 TB-

affected patients with essential nutrition kits containing rice, wheat flour, groundnuts, cooking oil, and other immunity-boosting staples. Following successful monthly distributions in Mulund and other parts of Mumbai's suburban region, CHF has now extended its reach to Vikhroli, further reinforcing its commitment to building a TB-free India.

Stepping out of their comfort zones, the interns showed commendable initiative by voluntarily raising Rs. 28,536/- and collecting stationery and clothes for children in need. They have also expressed interest in staying engaged with the Foundation's work through ongoing support and awareness efforts.





Centre Of Excellence Project (COE)

Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

COE (Centre of Excellence) teachers resumed their duties in MBMC schools on June 15, 2025. Currently, they are focusing on reviewing student progress, as attendance has been relatively low. During a recent visit by Ms. Shilpa Lokhande, it was observed that the computers in the schools were nonfunctional. As a result, the teachers have been conducting theoretical lessons in place of practical computer sessions. A formal request has been submitted to MBMC officials to address the issue and provide the required computer systems to ensure effective learning.







Mini Science Centre

Palghar, Maharashtra

By June 30th, 2025, 22 school visits were conducted across 14 schools, where 430 students were screened and their health cards updated. Doctors treated 409 cases, mainly related to seasonal illnesses like fever, cough, diarrhoea, and abdominal pain. Three students were referred to higher healthcare centres for advanced treatment.

On June 10th, a Training of Trainers (TOT) session was held on Advanced Paediatric Health, Emergency Management, and the treatment of tuberculosis and leprosy, led by a paediatrician and a medical officer. Another TOT on June 14th focused on Life Skills Education and Facilitation Skills, using interactive methods like role play and group work.

In addition, 2,643 students attended 40 mental health awareness sessions covering relationships, mental disorders, and goal setting. As part of a capacity-building drive, 3,174 students were engaged in 46 sessions on topics like good and bad touch, hygiene, peer pressure, anaemia, nutrition, and reproductive health.



Mini Science Centre

The Mini Science Centre project, supported by National Fertilizers Limited, is currently being implemented at M.S. Maur and M.S. Koyaribigha Schools in Barbigha, Bihar. Due to the government-declared summer vacation, schools remained closed from June 1st to 20th and reopened on June 23rd. With new admissions still underway, the MSC Coordinator has commenced engaging Science and Mathematics classes using the interactive models provided under the Mini Science Centre, ensuring a hands-on and effective learning experience for students.







Computer Labs

Bihar

The Computer Lab project, supported by National Fertilizers Limited, has been successfully implemented at Tailik School Utkramit Uchch Vidyalay, Lodhipur, and Madhya Vidyalay, Samas, in the Barbigha block of Sheikhpura, Bihar. Each lab is equipped with 21 computers, fully furnished and well-maintained to provide a conducive learning environment. Three dedicated teachers have been appointed to manage and conduct sessions in each lab. Following the summer vacation from June 1st to 20th, schools reopened on June 23rd, and computer classes have since resumed, with teachers actively engaging students in digital learning.















Digital Skills Program

Vikramgad, Maharashtra

Field Visit to Kawale Ashram School and Onde Z.P. School – Digital Skills Program Review

A field visit was conducted to assess the implementation of the Digital Skills Program at Kawale Ashram School and Onde Z.P. School. At Kawale Ashram School, a meeting with Principal Mr. Sonavane highlighted his overall satisfaction with the ongoing Health and Digital Skills Programs. He acknowledged the importance of these initiatives in supporting student development and future readiness. At Onde Z.P. School, interactions with the principal, teachers, and program trainer revealed positive feedback, particularly emphasizing the program's impact on underprivileged children in rural areas. Both visits reaffirmed the program's effectiveness in equipping students with essential digital skills and enhancing access to technology-based learning.





Digital Skills Program – Team Meeting & Transition



Over the past few weeks, Mr. Annarao has conducted sessions at multiple institutions, including Jawhar RH (sessions 2 and 3), Shree Datt Nursing College, Gagangiri Nursing College, Kanchad community, Manor PHC, ITI College Vangaon, Dabhosa community, Ideal College of Ayurveda, various Kishor Musle Skill Training Centers, Gorhe Shivaji Maharaj School, Saraswati School Kanchad, Manor Anganwadi, Lal Bahadur Shastri School, and additional community and health centers like Khuapari, Hamarapur High School, Tuse Health Centre,

Invisible Girl Project Haryana

Child Help Foundation (CHF) team comprising Mr. Ajit, Ms. Nitanshi Yadav, and Ms. Anu Bharti conducted extensive outreach and awareness sessions across schools and institutions in Rewari and Mahendergarh districts of Haryana. Mr. Ajit led 46 sessions, while Ms. Nitanshi Yadav facilitated 14 sessions in Rewari and Ms. Anu Bharti conducted 13 sessions in Mahendergarh. To address these issues, the team is now focusing on better coordination with schools for timely approvals, strategic outreach planning, and exploring innovative and engaging formats to maintain student interest and involvement.













POSH & POCSO Sessions - Pan India

Child Help Foundation (CHF) continues to lead the way in promoting safe, respectful, and inclusive spaces through impactful awareness sessions on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) Act and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. CHF organized several dynamic training programs across India, engaging a wide range of participants.

POSH Awareness Sessions




