## International Women's Day Celebrated Throughout India!

Child Help Foundation (CHF), a pan-India non-profit organization committed to uplifting underprivileged communities, commemorated International Women's Day 2025 with a series of meaningful initiatives across Maharashtra and Kerala. Each activity was thoughtfully curated to honor the spirit of womanhood and promote awareness around gender equality, mental well-being, and holistic community development.

In Kamlesh Nagar, Mumbai Suburban, a vibrant community celebration was organized for around 100 women and girls, many of whom are domestic helpers. This was followed by an enlightening talk by Ms. Sujata on gender equality, where she encouraged women to know their rights and seek equal opportunities. ### Leukemia Is Stealing Little Arnav's Life, Please Save Him

Nine-year-old Arnav Kumar from Alappuzha, Kerala, should be spending his days playing, learning, and dreaming about his future. But instead, he has been battling for his life since the tender age of three and a half. Diagnosed with B-cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (B-ALL), Arnav's childhood has been filled

with hospital visits, painful chemotherapy sessions, and unimaginable struggles.

Now, doctors at Kerala's Believers Church Medical College Hospital (1 km from Thiruvalla Railway Station) have given his family a ray of hope. An Allogenic Stem Cell Transplant could save his life. But the cost of the procedure is

Rs. 40 00,000/- (Rupees Forty Lakh Only), an amount far beyond the reach of his father.

Sanoj Kumar is an electrician by profession who works tirelessly to provide for his family. Despite pouring his life savings into Arnav's treatment, Sanoj is still far from raising the required amount. Relatives have stepped in to help, but it's not enough. Time is running out, and Arnav needs your help.

# Women in Rural Areas: Challenges & Success Stories

Women in rural areas across the world face unique challenges that often go unnoticed. Despite significant progress in gender equality, rural women continue to struggle with issues such as limited access to education, healthcare, economic opportunities, and social mobility. However, many women have defied these obstacles and emerged as beacons of hope, transforming not only their lives but also their communities.

## Challenges Faced by Women in Rural Areas

### 1. Limited Access to Education

Education remains a distant dream for many rural girls due to socioeconomic barriers, gender discrimination, and inadequate schooling facilities. Families often prioritise boys' education over girls', leading to high dropout rates among young girls.

### 2. Healthcare Disparities

Rural women often lack access to basic healthcare services, including maternal and reproductive health services. Poor infrastructure, long travel distances to medical facilities, and a shortage of healthcare professionals exacerbate this issue, resulting in high maternal and infant mortality rates.

### 3. Economic Dependence

Many rural women are confined to unpaid domestic labour or agricultural work without financial independence. Limited access to credit, land ownership restrictions, and gender pay gaps hinder their ability to break free from poverty.

### 4. Social and Cultural Constraints

Deep-rooted patriarchal norms continue to suppress women's rights and voices in many rural communities. Issues such as early marriage, domestic violence, and restricted mobility further hinder their progress.

## Success Stories: Inspiring Rural Women

Despite these challenges, countless rural women have demonstrated remarkable resilience and determination, proving that change is possible.

### 1. Kalpana Saroj – From Poverty to Entrepreneurship

Kalpana Saroj, often referred to as the “original slumdog millionaire,” was born into a Dalit family in rural Maharashtra, India. Facing early marriage, domestic abuse, and extreme poverty, she took control of her life and became a successful entrepreneur. Today, she leads a multi-million-pound business, inspiring thousands of rural women to pursue financial independence.

### 2. Rebecca Lolosoli – Championing Women's Rights in Kenya

Rebecca Lolosoli, a Kenyan women's rights activist, established the Umoja Uaso Women's Village, a sanctuary for women escaping gender-based violence. This self-sustaining village empowers women through handicrafts

# GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING (SDG-3)

## School Health Program

Vikramgad, Palghar District, Maharashtra

The School Health Program focuses on a range of physical and mental health activities, including student health screenings, illness treatment, and capacity building for students and teachers through awareness sessions and counselling activities. The program is implemented in fourteen schools in the Vikramgad block of Palghar district of Maharashtra, benefiting over ten thousand underprivileged tribal students. Additionally, special days and events are celebrated in these schools to engage students and teachers in raising awareness on relevant topics such as World Mental Health Day and other topics such as anxiety, fear of exams, and sexual and reproductive health.

In March, the following activities were implemented:

Child Help Foundation conducted 30 health camps across 14 schools, screening 1,200 students and updating their health records. During these camps, doctors treated 930 illness cases and provided necessary medications.

In addition, 38 awareness sessions were organized for 1,115 students, covering essential topics such as personal hygiene, sexual and reproductive health, peer

pressure, POSH & POCSO, anaemia, nutrition, menstrual health, and hygiene.

To support mental well-being, 18 mental health sessions were held, benefitting 1,677 students. The sessions focused on learning disorders, mental wellness, goal setting, personality development, problem-solving, and building self-esteem.

## Mini Science Centre

### Palghar, Maharashtra

The Mini Science Centre (MSC) project, supported by Samata Equal Footing, is actively being implemented across 10 Ashram Schools in District Palghar, Maharashtra. Three dedicated teacher-cum-coordinators have been appointed to the project. They regularly visit the schools and conduct engaging science and mathematics sessions using the hands-on models provided in the MSC labs.

Despite the academic calendar being focused on final examinations this month, the coordinators were able to conduct a few interactive sessions. Notably, the Principal of Sakhare School allotted an additional room for the MSC. The team efficiently relocated all the educational models to the new space and installed display boards, enhancing the learning environment.



## Mini Science Centre Bihar

The Mini Science Centre (MSC) project is currently being implemented at M.S. Maur and M.S. Koyaribigha Schools in Barbigaha, Bihar, with generous support from National Fertilizers Limited. The MSC coordinator continues to deliver Science and Mathematics lessons using interactive models provided under the project, making learning more engaging and hands-on for the students.

Despite the cold weather affecting student attendance this month, the coordinator conducted effective sessions, including model-based teaching, revision exercises, and student assessments.

As of this month, the project has positively impacted 1,122 student beneficiaries.



## Computer Labs Bihar

The Computer Lab Project is being successfully implemented at Tailik School Utkramit Uchch Vidhyalay, Lodhipur and Madhya Vidhyalay, Samas, located in Barbigaha block, Sheikhpura district, Bihar. Each lab is equipped with 21 computers, and both are well-furnished and properly maintained, ensuring an optimal environment for digital learning.

To ensure effective instruction, three dedicated computer teachers have been appointed. These educators have continued conducting regular sessions, providing students with practical knowledge and skills in computer literacy.

This transformative initiative is supported by National Fertilizers Limited as of this month.

## Gender Equality (SDG-5)

### Life Skills Project (ARSH Initiatives)

In March 2025, a total of 16 micro-conclaves were conducted across various locations in Maharashtra, including Vinval, Dehere, Dabhosa, Nandgaon, Zaap, Sakur, Ozar, Palsunde, Gonde, Ghanwal, Kurnze, Karhe, Kawale, Sakhare, Aina, Paali, and Aamgoan Ashram School and surrounding communities. These conclaves were organized by Kishoris (adolescent girls) with support from Child Help Foundation as part of the Life Skills Project. The conclaves featured a vibrant mix of cultural and educational activities such as Tarpa dance performances, speeches, skits, question-and-answer sessions, and various life skill-based activities designed to empower and educate.

The events were well-attended by community stakeholders including the Sarpanch, ASHA workers, ICDS workers, villagers, teachers, headmasters, and other local leaders. During the sessions, students shared personal experiences and reflections on how life skills training had positively influenced their growth, confidence, and decision-making abilities. Principals and teachers from Ashram Schools provided encouraging feedback, acknowledging the impact and success of the conclaves in creating awareness and fostering life skills among adolescents.

On March 25th, 2025, a CSR Conclave was held at the Kohinoor Park Hotel in Dadar. The event was attended by three Kishoris from Sakhare Ashram School along with their parents, the village Sarpanch, and project trainers. The Kishoris represented Child Help Foundation in the experience-sharing segment and participated in an engaging question-and-answer session. Mr. Jiji John, Executive Director of Child Help Foundation, was a panelist in the Rural Section Experience Presentation and also took part in the Q&A discussion.

During the CSR Conclave, the Kishoris from the Life Skills Project were honored with medals in recognition of their active participation and achievements. Additionally, Child Help Foundation was awarded a prestigious Award of





## Life Skills Project (ARSH Initiatives)–METROPOLIS

Appreciation by the Metropolis Foundation for its impactful work under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative focused on the Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health (ARSH) Project.

Looking ahead, the team has already laid out plans for March 2025. As part of the ongoing efforts under the ARSH-based Life Skills Project, the team has successfully reached and, in some areas, exceeded its set targets for the outreach and engagement of adolescents. By March 2025, a total of 10,029 adolescents have been reached through ARSH-based life skills sessions, surpassing the original target of 10,000.

A total of 450 Kishori Manch groups have been formed across various communities, meeting the target exactly. In terms of capacity building, 156 key influencers have been oriented on the project, exceeding the initial goal of 150.

The enthusiasm and involvement of the Kishori Manch groups have been particularly commendable. These groups have developed 215 action plans for the future, significantly exceeding the target of 140. Out of these, 185 action plans have already been implemented.

Under the referral services component of the project, 62 referrals have been made so far against a target of 100.

Efforts to integrate girls with government schemes are also underway, with 41 girls successfully linked to various schemes out of a target of 100.

Lastly, the project has successfully identified and recognized 150 Girl Champions, achieving the target in full.



## Invisible Girl Project

### Maharashtra

Following the training, Mr. Annarao, Ms. Sujata, and Mr. Samarth initiated outreach efforts across Maharashtra, targeting educational institutes, schools, and communities to spread awareness and conduct interactive sessions. These initiatives aimed to engage a wide range of beneficiaries and continue the momentum built during the training phase.

While approaching schools and colleges, the team faced a common challenge; many institutions were in the midst of examinations and advised the team to return in June. However, the team remained proactive and conducted sessions wherever possible. Mr. Annarao successfully conducted sessions at ITI College and Vangaon College in Dahanu. Ms. Sujata carried out awareness sessions at Mira Bhaindar Municipal Corporation School No. 14 and School No. 20. Mr. Samarth conducted sessions at a social work college, Dnyanyash Coaching Classes, and Vektesh Vidyalaya in Beed.

A significant portion of the outreach work was carried out within communities. In total, 13 sessions were conducted in various community spaces and Anganwadi Kendras. Mr. Annarao led 6 of these sessions in the Palghar region, while Ms. Sujata conducted 7 sessions in the Mira Bhayandar area. Additionally, two special sessions were

conducted in collaboration with the NGO Magic Bus, further expanding the reach of the initiative.

In terms of session count, the team conducted a total of 23 sessions across Maharashtra. Mr. Annarao led 9 sessions in Palghar, Ms. Sujata carried out 11 sessions, and Mr. Samarth facilitated 3 sessions in Beed. These efforts collectively reached a total of 1,566 beneficiaries, with 936 from Palghar, 338 from Mira Bhayandar, and 292 from Beed.

Looking ahead, the team has already laid out plans for the month of April. Outreach sessions are scheduled to take place in schools, communities, NGOs (staff), PHC centers, and among groups of ASHA workers. These upcoming activities aim to strengthen the program's presence and continue fostering community awareness and engagement throughout the state.





## Invisible Girl Project

### Haryana

On the 6th and 7th of March, a two-day training session was conducted by Ms. Priya Juliet and Mr. Sunil Pandey for the outreach team. The training was attended by Mr. Ajit, Ms. Anubharati, Ms. Anita, and Mr. Bhupinder Singh. This session helped prepare the team for their upcoming field engagements and strengthened their approach for community and institutional outreach.

Following the training, Mr. Ajit, Ms. Anita, and Ms. Anubharati initiated outreach efforts across Haryana, focusing on educational institutes, schools, and communities. However, since most schools were on a short vacation after exams and are scheduled to reopen in April, permissions for sessions were granted for the following month.

In the interim, the team focused on conducting sessions within communities. A total of six sessions were held at Anganwadi Kendras in Rewari. Additionally, five sessions were conducted with university and college students, offering valuable engagement with youth. One session took place at I.T.I. Kosli, and two sessions were held at private schools in Mahendergarh, making the most of the available opportunities despite the school break.

In total, 14 sessions were conducted across Haryana. Mr. Ajit led seven sessions in Rewari and one session in Kanina, Mahendergarh. Ms. Anubharati conducted two sessions in Mahendergarh, and Ms. Anita led four sessions in Kosli, Rewari. One session was also conducted by Krishna Mm, contributing to the team's outreach efforts.

These efforts reached a total of 686 beneficiaries, with 568 individuals from Rewari and 118 from Mahendergarh. Looking ahead, the team has planned further outreach programs in schools starting in April, aiming to continue expanding their reach and impact in the region.

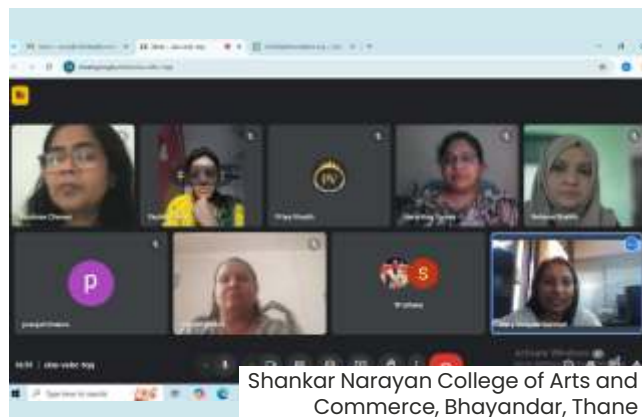
