Amit Chakali, 2 Years Complex Heart Disease

Amit's Heart Needs a Miracle

"I just want my little boy to live a healthy life. No parent should see their child suffer like this. We are doing everything we can, but we need help to give Amit the chance he deserves."

Amit Chakali is a bright, cheerful two-yearold boy from Medak, Andhra Pradesh. Sadly, when he was just one year old, doctors diagnosed him with a hole in his heart. Medical experts at Care Hospitals, Hyderabad (2 km from Khairatabad Railway Station), have advised that Amit urgently needs a VSD device closure. The estimated cost of this life-saving treatment is Rs 2,50,000 (Two Lakh Fifty Thousand Only).

Amit's father, Shivappa, works as a daily labourer on a farm and is the sole breadwinner for a family of five. With a limited income and mounting debts, he simply cannot afford this critical procedure. His mother, Surekha, is a devoted homemaker, caring for the family while shouldering the emotional burden of Amit's condition.

Despite borrowing from neighbours and relatives, the family is still far from meeting the treatment cost. Your support can bring hope, healing, and a chance at life to little Amit and his struggling family.



World Mental Health Day 2025: Prioritising Mental Health in Catastrophes and Emergencies



Every year on October 10, the world comes together to observe World Mental Health Day, a day dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of mental well-being and advocating for better mental health support. World Mental Health Day Sensitisation Workshop Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

To mark World Mental Health Day on 10th October 2025, Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted a Mental Health Sensitisation Workshop for women beneficiaries of Udaan House, a rehabilitation centre run by Mumbai Smiles NGO, in Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra. Held on 14th October 2025, the session focused on emotional well-being, stress management, and mindfulness, engaging eight participants in interactive discussions and practical coping exercises to promote mental resilience.









Nutrition Kit Distribution Drive Mumbai , Maharashtra



On 29th October, Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with Filaantro, the National Tuberculosis Elimination Program (NTEP), and the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), organised a nutrition kit distribution drive at Vikhroli, Mumbai, Maharashtra, under the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukt Bharat Yojana.

The event, conducted along with Mr Mahindra Patil, PMM Co-ordinator, Mulund, was part of CHF's ongoing efforts to support TB-affected patients. Patients received nutrition kits containing essential food items such as rice, wheat flour, groundnuts, and cooking oil to help improve their nutritional intake, boost immunity, and aid in recovery during treatment.

Training Programme on Effective CommunicationPalghar, Maharashtra

On 16th October, Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted a training programme on Effective Communication for a group of children. Participants from Shanti Seva Mandal Tribal Boys' Boarding and Jyoti Niwas Tribal Girls' Boarding at Manor attended the session. The training highlighted that true communication occurs when we listen to understand rather than merely to respond. It also focused on developing essential communication skills to help children express themselves confidently and build stronger interpersonal connections.







Cyber Security and Awareness DriveDelhi



On 25th October, Child Help Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with Deshbandhu College, NCWEB (University of Delhi) and the Cyber Cell, South East District, Delhi Police, organised a Cyber Security and Awareness Drive attended by students and faculty members.

The event featured sessions on Cyber Crime Awareness by CHF and Career Counselling by Government Wala (Physics Wala), empowering students with knowledge on digital safety, career opportunities, and higher education. The programme concluded with vibrant music, dance, and fashion show performances by NCWEB's cultural societies.











Centre Of Excellence Project



Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Centre of Excellence (CoE) Project is an educational initiative aimed at enhancing the quality of learning in municipal schools through supportive education and digital learning. The programme currently reaches students from standards 1st to 7th across selected MBMC schools, with a strong focus on foundational learning, digital literacy, inclusivity, and life skills. Supportive education classes and computer sessions are being conducted regularly, including during holidays, to ensure continuity and reinforcement of learning.





Stem Lab or Mini Science Centre Palghar, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Stem Lab or Mini Science Centre (MSC) Project is being implemented at 10 Ashram Schools in Palghar district, Maharashtra, with the support of Samata Equal Footing. Three dedicated teacher-cum-coordinators have been appointed for the project; they regularly visit these schools and conduct interactive science classes using the models provided in the MSC labs.

The Child Help Foundation team visited various schools to identify suitable sites for setting up two new MSC Labs. After thorough evaluation, Government Ashram School, Kawale (Vikramgad), and Government Ashram School, Guhir (Wada), were selected for the installations. Simultaneously, learning assessments were carried out in the remaining schools to evaluate students' academic progress.





Stem Lab or Mini Science Centre Bihar



Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Stem Lab or Mini Science Centre (MSC) Project is being implemented at M.S. Maur and M.S. Koyaribigha School in the Barbigha block of Sheikhpura, Bihar, with the support of National Fertilisers Limited. With the beginning of the new academic year, several new students have enrolled in both schools. CHF's science teachers continued to conduct engaging science and mathematics sessions, encouraging curiosity and handson learning among students. The Mini Science Labs have become a favourite space for children, who eagerly look forward to participating in the interactive experiments and demonstrations.



Computer Labs Bihar

Child Help Foundation (CHF), with the generous support of National Fertilisers Limited (NFL), has successfully implemented the Computer Lab Project at Tailik School Utkramit Uchch Vidyalay, Lodhipur, and Madhya Vidyalay Samas in the Barbigha block of Sheikhpura, Bihar.

Each lab is equipped with 21 computers, offering students valuable hands-on digital learning experiences. With well-furnished spaces, proper maintenance, and three dedicated teachers, these labs are paving the way for a tech-savvy, future-ready generation.

Child Help Foundation (CHF) successfully conducted computer education classes, covering topics like Paint, Microsoft Word and Excel. A total of 4,327 student attendances were recorded during the month.

The sessions went beyond theory, including practical exercises such as data entry, creating academic spreadsheets, and an introduction to system software, application software, and computer hardware. These classes gave students a well-rounded, hands-on digital learning experience, equipping them with skills for a technology-driven future.





Digital Skills Program

Vikramgad, Palghar, Maharashtra



Child Help Foundation (CHF) successfully conducted computer education sessions across 15 schools, covering an extensive curriculum: parts of a computer, types of monitors, keyboard components, mouse, internet usage, ICT basics, Notepad, WordPad, MS Word, Excel, HTML, and interactive educational tools like GCompris, Tux Typing, and Character Map. Revisions and educational videos ensured concepts were reinforced effectively.

To track progress, quarterly examinations and quiz competitions were held in all 15 schools, encouraging active learning and healthy competition.

As part of teacher capacity-building, CHF organised five Training of Trainers (ToTs), with teachers participating. These sessions familiarised teachers with the student syllabus, yearly schedules, and project activities, equipping them to enhance students' digital skills effectively.

Beyond digital literacy, trainers integrated life skills modules, promoting self-awareness and personal development, ensuring students receive a holistic and empowering learning experience.

Through engaging discussions and interactive activities, students learnt the importance of empathy, healthy living, and supporting those affected by the disease. The initiative was well received by both the school management and students, who actively participated and appreciated the efforts of CHF.









Gender Equality and Empowering Women Programme Under SDG 5: Gender Equality



Prerna Manch – Empowering Adolescents through Adolescent Reproductive & Sexual Health (ARSH) and Life Skills (Year 3 Initiatives-Palghar District) – METROPOLIS

A three-day workshop on impact assessment was organised and conducted by Metropolis Foundation. During the training, Ms Shilpa Lokhande, a project team member, presented on key focus areas and methods for measuring evidence, providing valuable insights to the participants. The workshop was well-received, and the team received appreciation from the Metropolis Foundation at the conclusion of the training.







Invisible Girl Project

Maharashtra



Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Maharashtra outreach team conducted a series of awareness sessions across various schools and colleges, aiming to help students and teachers understand the social issues affecting their communities. During these sessions, participants openly discussed the challenges they observe around them, while trainers highlighted basic rights and guided them on small, practical steps to challenge harmful customs and unfair practices. The primary objective of this outreach was to engage students and teachers in meaningful conversations about social issues, human rights, and overall well-being, fostering awareness, responsibility, and motivation to bring about positive change.

Gender Equality sessions were conducted across the state, with Ms Krutika Koli leading in Mira Bhayandar, Mr Akesh Minde conducting sessions in Raigad, and Ms Annarao Waghamre facilitating sessions in Palghar. The sessions focused on promoting awareness about social issues, human rights, and gender equality among students and community members. Participants, including teachers, students, and community workers, appreciated CHF's efforts and shared encouraging feedback.



The Maharashtra team demonstrated strong initiative in setting clear goals, obtaining community approvals, and improving session delivery. Despite challenges caused by school holidays, festivals, and examinations, the team effectively rescheduled sessions to ensure smooth implementation. A highlight of the month was the impactful child marriage awareness session at Gaurapur Grampanchayat, which inspired students to rethink gender roles and commit to education and equality.





Invisible Girl Project

Haryana



Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Haryana outreach team conducted awareness and sensitisation sessions across various educational institutions. The sessions provided a platform for students and teachers to share the social issues they encounter in their communities. Participants were made aware of their rights and encouraged to take steps to eliminate harmful social practices. The outreach aimed to engage youth, students, and teachers in meaningful discussions around social issues, rights, and overall well-being.

A total of 25 sessions were conducted across the state. In Rewari, Ms Nitanshi Yadav led 7 sessions, and Mr Ajit conducted 2 sessions, and together one, while in Mahendergarh, Ms Anu Bharti conducted 7 sessions, Mr Ajit 4 sessions, and Ms Nitanshi Yadav 4 sessions, reaching 3,902 individuals. Educational institutions responded positively, with students and teachers appreciating CHF's initiatives and acknowledging the program's potential to create meaningful and lasting community impact.

The Haryana team demonstrated strong initiative and commitment through strategic planning, effective coordination with schools, adaptive outreach strategies, and focused execution to ensure impactful sessions. However, some sessions could not be conducted due to school holidays. While a few institutions postponed sessions to the following month, several schools have already approved outreach activities for November, ensuring continuity and reach of the program.











Good Touch Bad Touch Awareness Session Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

On 29th October, Child Help Foundation (CHF), along with student interns from LP Raval B.Ed College, conducted two awareness sessions at the Kashigaon community, Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra. Attended by 42 children, the sessions focused on 'Good Touch, Bad Touch' and 'Health and Hygiene', aiming to educate children on personal safety, healthy habits, and the importance of maintaining overall wellbeing.













POSH Awareness Sessions

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013—commonly known as the POSH Act—is a landmark initiative by the Government of India aimed at ensuring safe and dignified workplaces for women. Child Help Foundation (CHF) is fully compliant with the POSH Act across all offices, field locations, and virtual workspaces. The organisation's approach extends beyond legal compliance, fostering a culture rooted in dignity, respect, and zero tolerance towards sexual harassment.

The Internal Committee (IC) addresses every complaint with fairness and confidentiality. All new employees undergo mandatory POSH policy training, while existing staff members participate in regular sensitisation workshops. Through a "Train the Trainer" programme, CHF has developed a cadre of 25 certified POSH trainers across India. These trainers have conducted awareness sessions, reaching individuals, and have mentored and certified three external professionals or members to enhance outreach and long-term impact.
