International Daughters' Day Celebration

International Daughters Day is celebrated on the 4th Sunday of September, which fell on 28th of September this year. Child Help Foundation (CHF) commemorated the day with mothers and adolescent girls of Shiroshi Village, Jawhar, Palghar, aiming to highlight the importance of valuing daughters and supporting their growth.

During the program, Ms. Jyoti emphasized the need to prevent early marriages, a common practice in tribal areas, and instead encourage girls to continue their education.

Mr. Annarao Waghmare shared insights humorously, using real-life stories from tribal communities to highlight the challenges girls face.

The event was conducted in collaboration with Mazi Saheli, who assisted with community mobilization. The program concluded with the felicitation of women leaders from the village and a pledge from mothers to support the education of their daughters. Around 400 women and girls participated, making it a meaningful and impactful celebration.

CHF has consistently partnered with hospitals and community initiatives to ensure life-saving cardiac care reaches children from marginalized and rural communities.

In Mumbai, CHF commemorated the day with a special event at Balaji Heart Hospital, Byculla, dedicated to children admitted in the pediatric cardiac ward, primarily from tribal and rural regions of eastern Maharashtra. The hospital regularly conducts medical camps in these regions to screen children for congenital heart disease. Those identified are referred to Balaji Heart Hospital for surgeries, which are performed free of cost, supported through government schemes and contributions from NGOs like CHF.

The event aimed to uplift the spirits of these young patients through engaging activities. Stationery kits were distributed as gifts, and a short story on the Joy of Giving was narrated to inspire and encourage the children. The celebrations included singing, dancing, and story recitation, making the children feel joyful and motivated. Hospital staff expressed deep appreciation for the initiative and recommended organizing such events regularly to support the emotional well-being of pediatric patients.

CHF was also honoured on World Heart Day at Aster MIMS Hospital, Calicut, in recognition of its ongoing contributions to community health and pediatric cardiac care. The felicitation ceremony was graced by Mr. Lukman Ponmadath, Chief Operating Officer (COO) of Aster MIMS, and Mast. Mohammed Ziyan made the occasion

memorable and inspiring for the CHF team. This recognition reinforces CHF's commitment to serving communities and creating meaningful impact in the field of health and well-being.

World Heart Day celebrations by CHF not only celebrated the bravery of young patients but also highlighted the importance of accessible cardiac care for children from underserved regions. Please Help This Father Save His Newborn

"I can barely earn enough to put food on the table, but now I'm asked to find lakhs for my baby's surgery. I feel so helpless as a father... Please help me save my baby."

-Sarvar (Father)

On 17th August, Tarannum and Sarvar from Bijnor, Uttar Pradesh, welcomed their baby into the world. But what should have been a moment of pure joy quickly turned into heartbreak when the newborn was diagnosed with Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate.

Babies born with this condition face difficulties right from the start. Simple things like feeding, breathing, and swallowing become painful struggles for them. As they grow older, they are also at risk of frequent ear infections, hearing problems, and speech difficulties if not treated on time.

According to the Doctors at Panacea Hospital, Uttarakhand (3.9 km from Dehradun Railway Station), the baby urgently needs Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate surgery to survive. The treatment will cost around Rs. 4,00,000/-(Rupees Four Lakh Only). Sarvar, the father of the baby, works as a daily wage labourer and is the only earning member of a family of six. With his modest income barely covering rent and basic meals, arranging such a large sum feels impossible.

The family has no other support to rely on. This newborn has just begun her journey in life and deserves the chance to eat, breathe, smile, and grow like every other child. With your kindness, we can ease her pain, support her family in this desperate hour, and give her the healthy, happy future that every baby is born deserving of.

School Health Programme

Vikramgad Block, Palghar District, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation (CHF) conducted field visits across 14 schools, ensuring comprehensive health coverage for students. All the students were screened, and their health cards were duly completed. During these visits, doctors treated 1,634 cases of illness, providing the required medication and care. The most common ailments observed included fever, cough and cold, diarrhoea, vomiting, scabies, fungal infections, and lymph node swelling. Eight students were referred to external health institutions, such as rural hospitals, for specialised treatment following primary care.

In addition to medical interventions, the counsellors conducted awareness sessions on adolescent mental health. These sessions focused on key areas, including the value of relationships, understanding mental disorders, and goal setting, empowering students to build emotional resilience and self-awareness.

As part of the student capacity-building initiative, awareness sessions were held to sensitise students to critical health and social topics. The sessions covered good and bad touch, hygiene practices, peer pressure, HIV/AIDS, POSH and POCSO, early marriage and childbearing, anaemia and nutrition, healthy eating habits, and sexual and reproductive health—equipping students with essential knowledge to lead healthy and informed lives.













Oxygen Concentrator Donation

Centre Of Excellence Project

Mumbai Suburban, Maharashtra

The Centre of Excellence (CoE) Project is an educational initiative aimed at enhancing the quality of learning in municipal schools through supportive education and digital learning. The program currently reaches students from standards 1st to 7th across selected MBMC schools, with a strong focus on foundational learning, digital literacy, inclusivity, and life skills. Supportive education classes and computer sessions are being conducted regularly, including during holidays, to ensure continuity and reinforcement of learning.





Mini Science Centre

Palghar, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Mini Science Centre (MSC) Project is being implemented at 10 Ashram Schools in Palghar district, Maharashtra, with the support of Samata Equal Footing. Three dedicated teacher-cum-coordinators have been appointed for the project; they regularly visit these schools and conduct interactive science classes using the models provided in the MSC labs.

The Child Help Foundation team visited various schools to identify suitable sites for setting up two new MSC Labs. After thorough evaluation, Government Ashram School, Kawale (Vikramgadh), and Government Ashram School, Guhir (Wada), were selected for the installations. Simultaneously, learning assessments were carried out in the remaining schools to evaluate students' academic progress.









Mini Science Centre

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Mini Science Centre (MSC) Project is being implemented at M.S. Maur and M.S. Koyaribigha School in the Barbigha block of Sheikhpura, Bihar, with the support of National Fertilizers Limited. With the beginning of the new academic year, several new students have enrolled in both schools. Child Help Foundation's science teachers continued to conduct engaging science and mathematics sessions, encouraging curiosity and handson learning among students. The Mini Science Labs have become a favourite space for children, who eagerly look forward to participating in the interactive experiments and demonstrations.

These classes gave students a well-rounded, hands-on digital learning experience, equipping them with skills for a technology-driven future.







Digital Skills Program

Vikramgad, Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation (CHF) successfully conducted 952 computer education sessions across 15 schools, covering an extensive curriculum: parts of a computer, types of monitors, keyboard components, mouse, internet usage, ICT basics, Notepad, WordPad, MS Word, Excel, HTML, and interactive educational tools like GCompris, Tux Typing, and Character Map. Revisions and educational videos ensured concepts were reinforced effectively.

To track progress, quarterly examinations and quiz competitions were held in all 15 schools, encouraging active learning and healthy competition.

As part of teacher capacity-building, CHF organized five Training of Trainers (ToTs), with 49 teachers participating. These

sessions familiarized teachers with the student syllabus, yearly schedules, and project activities, equipping them to enhance students' digital skills effectively.

Beyond digital literacy, trainers integrated life skills modules, promoting self-awareness and personal development, ensuring students receive a holistic and empowering learning experience.



Digital Awareness and Online Safety Workshop

Invisible Girl Project Maharashtra

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Maharashtra outreach team conducted a series of awareness sessions across various schools and colleges, aiming to help students and teachers understand the social issues affecting their communities. During these sessions, participants openly discussed the challenges they observe around them, while trainers highlighted basic rights and guided them on small, practical steps to challenge harmful customs and unfair practices. The primary objective of this outreach was to engage students and teachers in meaningful conversations about social issues, human rights, and overall well-being, fostering awareness, responsibility, and motivation to bring about positive change.

A total of 32 sessions were conducted across the state, with Ms. Krutika Koli leading 8 sessions in Mira Bhayandar, Mr. Akesh Minde conducting 12 sessions in Raigad, and Ms. Annarao Waghamre facilitating 12 sessions in Palghar. Educational institutions responded positively, with both students and teachers appreciating CHF's efforts and recognizing the potential impact of these initiatives on their communities.

The Maharashtra team demonstrated strong planning and initiative, setting clear goals, securing approvals from schools and colleges, adapting to changing circumstances, and continuously improving

the delivery of sessions. However, the team faced challenges during the month, as many sessions were delayed due to school holidays, festivals, and ongoing examinations. Some schools postponed their sessions to the following month, while others had already scheduled them for later in September. Despite these setbacks, preparations are underway to ensure that the planned awareness programs continue smoothly and reach the intended beneficiaries.









Invisible Girl Project Haryana

Child Help Foundation's (CHF) Haryana outreach team conducted awareness and sensitization sessions across various educational institutions. The sessions provided a platform for students and teachers to share the social issues they encounter in their communities. Participants were made aware of their rights and encouraged to take steps to eliminate harmful social practices. The outreach aimed to engage youth, students, and teachers in meaningful discussions around social issues, rights, and overall well-being.

A total of 48 sessions were conducted across the state. In Rewari, Ms. Nitanshi Yadav led 15 sessions and Mr. Ajit conducted 6 sessions, while in Mahendergarh, Ms. Anu Bharti conducted 11 sessions, Mr. Ajit 13 sessions, and Ms. Nitanshi Yadav 3 sessions. Educational institutions responded positively, with students and teachers appreciating CHF's initiatives and acknowledging the program's potential to create meaningful and lasting community impact.

The Haryana team demonstrated strong initiative and commitment through strategic planning, effective coordination with schools, adaptive outreach strategies, and focused execution to ensure impactful



sessions. However, some sessions could not be conducted due to school holidays and delays caused by heavy rainfall in August, which affected scheduling. While a few institutions postponed sessions to the following month, several schools have already approved outreach activities for October, ensuring continuity and reach of the program.




POSH & POCSO Sessions - Pan India
