Child Help Foundation (CHF) is a pan - India non-profit organization, registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act 1950, which started in the year 2010. Committed to the fulfilment of Child Rights as promised by the Indian Constitution and United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), CHF's principal purpose is to empower the disadvantaged holistically with some of our initiatives like Emergency Medical Support, Education, Clean Water, and Sanitation, Gender Equality, Zero Hunger and Humanitarian Relief.

CHF also works largely in bringing about a balance in society by taking care of stray animals under our Life on Land initiative and Beach Clean Up activities under our Life Below Water initiative.

Today, CHF is nationally recognized for its efforts to uplift the underprivileged in society. Our response is multi-sectoral based on reliable expertise and extensive groundwork. We have implemented multiple grassroots-level initiatives all over the country in 21 states.

Amongst many others, CHF has won various awards in 2019–20: The ET NOW – Rise with India Award for the Best NGO in Healthcare, Best NGO in Education for Girl Child, Best NGO for Cancer Prevention, Award for Dedication and Commitment from Tata Memorial Hospital, and the Dadasaheb Phalke International Film Festival Award for Benevolent Efforts in Social Welfare. In August 2021, CHF received three awards at the 7th Edition of National Awards. These awards were received for Best Covid –19 NGO for Community, Best Healthcare NGO of the Year, and Best NGO for Education for Girl Child.

We have offices in 12 cities including Mumbai, Thane, Pune, Delhi, Kolkata, Bhubaneswar, Hyderabad, Kochi, Bengaluru, Chennai, Gurugram, and Dimapur. We also have an international presence in the United States of America.

VISION: Reaching out to marginalized children in need, empowering them, bringing smiles, and making them future-ready.

MISSION: Our Mission is to inspire and empower people into the culture of giving and bringing about a positive change in the lives of children and society.



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Child help Foundation helps fund the treatments of children suffering from life-threatening, non-communicable diseases like Congenital Heart Diseases, Cancer, Organ Transplants, and Preterm Babies, amongst many others. We ensure that these children get the required treatment as soon as possible, and their families get the support they need throughout the treatment.



Ritanya De Sarkar

Ritanya De Sarkar is a 7-year-old girl from Kolkata. Her father, Mr. Sayanta De Sarkar used to work as a caterer with a meager income. Her mother, Mrs. Paramita De Sarkar is a homemaker. Ritanya has a younger brother, Reyaansh, who is 4yrs old. The family is currently living in a rented room in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, near Ritanya's hospital. The rent is Rs. 4,000/- per month.

Ritanya started showing symptoms in September 2021, wherein she would be having frequent fevers, headaches, muscle aches and stomach pain. The family took her to the nearest local doctor, who suspected an appendix and did a CT scan. However, he failed to diagnose Ritanya's case and suggested the family visit the Tata Memorial Hospital, Kolkata. After several blood tests, Ritanya was diagnosed with Blood Cancer.

The doctors at the Tata Memorial Hospital recommended she go to Chennai's Christian Medical College (CMC) for further treatment. At CMC, Ritanya's treatment began with chemotherapy which will go on for six months. The doctors have advised a Haploidentical stem cell transplant. The cost of this treatment is estimated to be Rs. 25,00,000/-, and the family is seeking CHF's help.







Swaraj Rathod

Swaraj Rathod is a four-month-old baby boy from Osmanabad, Maharashtra. His father, Mr.Avinash Rathod is a daily wage laborer and earns a very minimum amount for the work he does. Some days he brings Rs. 200/- and other days he cannot earn a single penny as he is not able to fetch any of the jobs of his skill in the market. His mother, Mrs. Smita Rathod is a homemaker.

A week after Swaraj's birth, his parents got worried because their baby was continuously crying. The doctors asked them to get some tests done and found a hole in his heart. He was diagnosed with VSD with Sub Infundibular Pulmonary Stenosis. They recommended the Rathod family take their baby to the Balaji Heart Hospital, Mumbai.

Swaraj needs to undergo Intracardiac Repair of VSD with Sub Infundibular Pulmonary Stenosis as a part of his treatment. The estimated cost of this is Rs. 3,30,000/-.

Baby of Payal

The baby of Mrs. Payal Chavan is a nine-day-old preterm baby boy from Jategaon, Maharashtra. His father's name is Mr. Rajendra Chavan. The baby's grandparents and uncle live with them. The entire family works as daily laborers in sugarcane farms. Collectively they earn only Rs. 15,000/-permonth.

During the sixth month of pregnancy, Mrs. Payal started suffering from severe pains. When taken to the doctor, an emergency C-section was performed and the baby was born with symptoms of prematurity – low Birth weight, respiratory distress syndrome, Hyaline membrane disease, Apnea of Prematurity. The doctors at Yashoda Children's Hospital, Beed, suggested that the baby needs to be kept under NICU treatment for a few months. The estimated cost of which is Rs.1,42,000/–.







Mohd. Vahil

Mohd. Vahil is an 8-year-old boy from Ernakulam, Kerala. His mother, Jaseela is a housewife. Vahil's father left them when he was very young and is living separately. The expenses of the family are looked after by Vahil's Stepfather. He is their only son.

During the time of birth, Vahil had suffered from breathing issues and was treated for the same. At the age of 2years, Vahil suffered from a high fever. While treating his fever, doctors observed that he had weak kidneys. Since then he has been treated for his kidneys. Vahil has already undergone surgery but he has still not recovered. He experiences occasional dribbling of urine.

He is currently being treated at Lakeshore Hospital, Kochi for Hydroureteronephrosis. The estimated cost of his surgery is Rs. 4,00,000/-.

Saras Khare

Saras Khare, a five-year-old who lives in Konch, Uttar Pradesh, is suffering from Complex Congenital Heart Disease. His father, Mr. Narendra Kumar is a farmer and earns Rs 5,000/- per month. Saras's mother, Mrs.Barsha Devi is a homemaker and his elder brother Pranjal is 8.

When Saras was one, his family noticed that his body developed bluish discoloration. He could not eat well as he vomited most of the food consumed. Worried, his parents took him to a local doctor, where he was suggested to go to Birla Hospital, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh for treatment.

After a few check-ups, it was discovered that Saras's heart is on the right side instead of the left and has nerve blockages. His family took him to Paras Hospital, Gurugram, Haryana for better treatment.

The doctors advised that Paras needs to undergo open-heart surgery. The estimated cost of the surgery is Rs. 4,50,000/-.







Vihansh Butti

Vihansh Butti is just four-years-old, but since January 2022, this little boy is tormented by severe disorders. He started suffering from high fevers, loose stools, and dark-coloured decreased urine output. Worried, his parents, Mr.Rajashekar Butti and Mrs. Sapna Kumari took him to Star Hospital, Telangana.

The doctors there discovered that Vihansh residing in Telangana is suffering from Kidney Failure and AIHA (a rare type of anemia). He was admitted and treated at the same hospital initially, but due to worsening symptoms, he was shifted to Rainbow Children's Hospital, Hyderabad.

To add to his despair, after being on ventilator support for one week, Vihansh suffered a cardiac arrest due to which his brain is partially damaged. Kidney Failure and Brain damage have wrecked his life. The doctors have suggested Dialysis and continued ventilator support for his survival.

The estimated cost for his treatment is Rs. 8,00,000/- (Rupees Eight Lakhs Only). His parents cannot afford this huge amount as Mr. Rajashekar Butti lost his job due to lockdown. This treatment is the only chance for Vihansh to survive.

Giridhar V.

Giridhar V. is an 11-year-old boy from Bengaluru, Karnataka. His father, Mr. S. Vijaykumar, works as a laborer who gets paid on a contractual basis. His mother, Mrs. Geetha K.N., is a homemaker. Giridhar's younger brother Chandan is 6-years-old. The family of four lives in their little house.

Giridhar is fighting the battles life has been throwing at him since the tender age of six. He was suffering from painful symptoms which unfortunately went neglected by his parents as common injuries. Later, when he turned 10, his parents realized that something was seriously wrong with their elder son's health.

Giridhar was diagnosed with Cervico Dorsal Scoliosis which is an unusual but potentially severe disfiguring cause of the spinal deformity.

Understanding the severity, his parents took him to the Department of Spine Surgery at Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital, Bengaluru, Karnataka. Here, the doctors told Giridhar's parents that urgent surgery is required to save him. If this surgery is not performed soon, it could lead to a cardiac complication, resulting in his death. The estimated cost of the surgery is Rs. 4,50,000/-.









Twins of Leela

Twins of Lila Devi are 7-days-old premature baby boys from Pali, Rajasthan. In the eighth month of pregnancy mother, Lila Devi started suffering from blood pressure fluctuations. When taken to a local doctor, she was told to go to Rohit Hospital, Jaipur, which is 500 kilometers away from their home. The doctors at the hospital suggested an urgent C-section delivery as a prolonged pregnancy was dangerous to both the mother and the babies.

The twins were born with extreme symptoms of prematurity- low birth weight, respiratory failure, and neonatal jaundice (NNJ- a condition in newborns). Because of their fragile condition, they were taken to the Neo Clinic, Jaipur. The babies are on ventilator support and need continued NICU support for a few weeks. The estimated cost for which is Rs. 6,00,000/- (Rupees six lakhs only).

The father of the babies, Mr. Rupachand, and mother work as daily wage laborers and collectively earn a mere income of Rs. 7,000/- per month. Out of this very little amount, Rs. 2,000/- are spent for their monthly house rent. With negligible savings and no relatives to help, the family has asked CHF for financial assistance.

Andriya Sanil

Andriya Sanil is a 9-month-old baby girl from Ernakulam, Kerala. Her father Mr. Sanil Varghese works as a daily wage laborer with an annual income of Rs. 30,000/- only. He is the only breadwinner in the family of seven. The baby's mother Mrs. Joby Paul is a homemaker. The couple has an elder son, Albert (2.5 yrs), and a set of triplets- Alchya, Anliya, and Andriya.

When Andriya was 3-months-old, her parents noticed that her head was growing abnormally. It grew in an elongated shape. Worried, the parents took her to Kottayam Medical college hospital, Gandhi Nagar, Kerala. After several tests, it was found that Andriya is suffering from Multi Sutural Craniosynostosis. This congenital condition causes the head of the infant to stop growing in some areas as it would grow healthily and expand abnormally in other areas.

Andriya's parents took her to Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences and Research Center, Kochi, Kerala, for better treatment. The doctors at the hospital advised that Andriya should undergo Craniofacial surgery (correction for craniosynostosis). The estimated cost of the surgery is Rs. 2,05,000/-.







Dimpal Kumari

Dimpal Kumari, a 4-year-old, is the elder daughter of Mr. Mangal Thakur and Mrs. Rani Kumari. The family consists of five members, including Dimpal's grandmother and her younger brother Rishabh, who is 2. They live in Muzaffarpur, Bihar. Dimpal's father is the only breadwinner and earns only Rs. 7,000/- per month.

When Dimpal was around 3.5-years-old, she constantly suffered from respiratory issues, wherein she was unable to breathe properly, wheezed, and coughed while breathing. Her parents were worried about this and took her to a local doctor. The doctor indicated that Dimpal could be having a heart problem. Later, she was taken to the Mahavir Heart Hospital, Patna.

Several medical test reports diagnosed Dimpal with Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ACHD), Trivial Aortic regurgitation (AR), and Dilated left atrium and left ventricle. The doctors suggested she undergo a PDA Device Closure. The estimated cost of this procedure is Rs. 1,20,000/-.

Omakar Mohite

10-year-old, Omakar Mohite lives in Osmanabad, Maharashtra. His father Mr. Ram Mohite, and mother, Mrs. Vaishali Mohite work as daily wage laborers, and they both earn a minimum income of Rs. 500/- collectively per day. The family consists of seven members- Omakar, his parents, three sisters, and his grandmother.

Two years ago, when Omakar was coming back from school, his sister noticed that his eyes were swollen and red, and his tongue and nails were discolored. The family rushed him to a nearby hospital. After a few check-ups, Omakar was diagnosed with Tricuspid atresia with severe pulmonary stenosis perimembranous VSD with large ASD. In simpler terms, a portion of his heart is undeveloped, resulting in respiratory issues.

Omakar's parents shifted him to Balaji Heart Hospital and Diagnostic Centre, Solapur, for better treatment. The doctors suggested that Omakar needs to undergo Bidirectional Glenn (BDG) Shunt, a surgery to improve blood oxygenation for patients with a congenital cardiac defect. The estimated cost of the surgery is Rs. 3,30,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs Thirty Thousand Only). For a family who lives in a remote village, and earns very little to meet their basic requirements, the expense is enormous.

Piyush Kamat

Piyush Kamat is a 3-year-old boy from Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh. His father, Mr. Madan Kamat, a daily wage laborer, is the sole breadwinner in the family of four. His mother, Mrs. Sarita Kamat, is a homemaker. Piyush has an elder sister, Komal Kamat, who is 14 years old.

Baby Piyush was born during the winter season. His parents noticed that he was having difficulty breathing when they heard wheezing noises from his chest. Worried about their baby's health, they took him to the local doctor. The doctor also raised his concerns and asked them to consult a specialist. The family borrowed money from their neighbors and loved ones to bear Piyush's medical tests cost. The test results diagnosed him with Congenital Heart Disease and for further treatment, he is now being treated at Paras Hospitals, Gurgaon. The doctors have suggested him to undergo open-heart surgery.

The estimated cost of his treatment was Rs. 4, 50,000/-. His surgery was successfully done and he was discharged from the hospital on 7th February.

Kayrab Baghel

Kayrab Baghel, a 1-year-old boy lives in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh. His father Mr. Jeetender Baghel works at a medical store and earns a petite income of Rs 6,000/- per month. Kayrab's mother Mrs. Shivani Baghel is a homemaker. The family of three lives in a rented house with a monthly rent of Rs 3,000/-.

Within a few days of him being born, Kayrab's parents noticed that he keeps unwell and has high fevers quite often. Concerned, they took him to Mangal Nursing Home, Gwalior, where Kayrab was diagnosed with Cyanotic Congenital Heart Disease. Cyanotic heart disease refers to a group of many different heart defects that are present at birth. That is when his treatment began, which has cost them up to Rs. 50,000/-.

Kayrab's parents had no option but to borrow a huge sum from their friends and relatives. The treatment fell short and Kayrab's symptoms resurfaced. His heart defect has taken a toll on his limbs now. One of his legs is not able to function normally.

Kayrab's parents consulted doctors at Paras Hospital, Gurugram, and this time. Here, the doctors suggested that Kayrab needs to undergo Open Heart Surgery. The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 4,50,000/-. with the help of our donors, we supported Kaybrab's family and he was discharged from the hospital on 10th February.

Aneek Chowdhury

Aneek Chowdhury is a 13-year-old boy from Kolkata, West Bengal. He is the only son of Mr. Debabrata Chowdhury, a helper at a private office, and Mrs. Kajuri Chowdhury, a homemaker. Mr. Chowdhary is the only breadwinner in the family and he earns a monthly income of Rs. 8,500/-. His mother used to take tuitions on a part-time basis, which is currently discontinued due to COVID-19 and Aneek's treatment.

In 2019, Aneek was diagnosed with Ewing Sarcoma (Bone Cancer), for which he was treated with Chemotherapy. He also underwent Internal Right Hemipelvectomy, due to which his pelvis girdle was removed. He was later diagnosed with Cholelithiasis (Cancer in the Gallbladder). He has been admitted to Apollo Hospital, Kolkata, where the doctors have suggested he undergo Laparoscopic cholecystectomy (Removal of Gallbladder). The estimated cost of the surgery was Rs. 1,58,000/-.

Aneek's family sought CHF's help in raising the funds for his treatment. His surgery was performed successfully and was discharged from the hospital on 14th February.

Baby of Darshana

The baby of Mrs. Darshana Patil and Mr. Mangesh Patil is a one-month and 21-days-old baby girl from Thane, Maharashtra. The baby's father is a fisherman, with a monthly income of only Rs. 5,000/-. Her mother is a homemaker. During the seventh month of her pregnancy, Mrs. Darshana started facing some complications and blood pressure issues, due to which the doctors suggested she get a C-Section instead of waiting till the ninth month.

Born preterm, the baby suffers from extremely low birth weight, RDS, Neonatal sepsis, and IntraCranial Bleeding. She was also suffering from Neonatal jaundice, which was cured by medication. The baby is admitted to Dr. Bedekar Hospital for Women and Children, Thane. The doctors here have advised the parents to keep their daughter in the NICU for a couple of months. The estimated cost of the baby's treatment was Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs only).

The baby's father Mr. Mangesh is very poor, and being the only earning member in the family of four, he couldn't afford his only baby's treatment. CHF helped the baby's parents by providing them with the required funds.

The baby is healthier and at home now. She was named Vaidehi.

Twins of Harbai

The twins of Mrs. Harbai and Mr. Ram Saini are 8-days-old boys from Dausa, Rajasthan, who were suffering from symptoms of prematurity, as they were born in the seventh month of pregnancy. Their father, Mr. Ram Saini works as a daily wage laborer on a contractual basis with little or no working opportunities. Their mother is a homemaker.

The parents were facing difficulty in conceiving and had to undergo an IVF treatment which cost a fortune. They were forced to sell their only source of income - the only piece of farming land that they owned. In the third round of IVF, Mrs. Harbai got pregnant with twins.

Unfortunately, their dreams were shattered as the two baby boys were born preterm. Currently, the babies are admitted to the Neo Clinic Hospital, Jaipur. They suffer from extremely low birth weight and respiratory syndrome, for which they need to undergo a NICU stay for a few months. The estimated cost of their treatment was Rs. 7,50,000/-.

The babies' lives depended on monetary assistance, and CHF helped them get through their tough times. The twins are now safe and healthy and were discharged from the hospital on 16th February.









1. Education Camp

Child Help Foundation conducted a Summer Camp at Vangani and Murbad Ashram Schools in Palghar, Maharashtra. The students at these schools belong to tribal, underprivileged communities. These camps are a great combination of fun and education for them. The one-week camp scheduled various activities where children can learn in a new creative way. In the camp, they got opportunities to present their ideas to help them for their overall development and growth. Various resource persons (Dr. Swati Desai, Dr. Jayshree, DR. Prabha Rastogi, and Ms. Mena Lokhande. Ms. Anjali Patel) were invited to create awareness on various subjects like Protection of Children from of Sexual Offences (POCSO), Science Interventions, and Tricks for Maths, Letter writing, Craft-best out of waste and drawing. CHF volunteers conducted fun sessions by organizing games and sports to create a sense of sportsmanship in the students.

The total number of students who benefited from this camp are 464 (305 from Murbad and 159 from Vangani).









2. Awareness Session

On 10th February, Child Help Foundation's volunteer Ms. Neha Singh visited the Mini Science Centre (MSC) at Government Secondary High School, Sakhare. During the visit, an awareness session on "Science Centre Intervention" was conducted by Dr. Jayshree Parikh. The main objective of the session was to create awareness among the students about science and science-related things. The session included a PowerPoint presentation through which Dr. Parikh taught the students about many renowned scientists from around India, the contribution of women scientists, and new inventions. 71 students benefited from this session.

3. Fellowship Camp

Haryana- In partnership with CHF, Self Reliant India (SRI) organized a single-day 'Fellow Capacity Building Workshop' on 21st February 2022 at Bal Bhawan, Rewari, Haryana. Fellows from the nearby districts of Jhajjar, Rewari, and Nuh participated together in this workshop. There were 7 teachers and 33 beneficiaries who attended the program.









4. Science Day

• Sakhare Ashram Shala - On the occasion of Science Day on 28th February, the students at the Sakhare Ashram Shala spent a lot of time in the Mini Science Center (MSC) constructed and run by CHF. The teachers at the school conducted sessions on the importance of organ donation and how organ transplantation works. A total of 25 students were present and they also participated in physics experiments. A street play on the importance of Science was organized for the students.









- Vangani Ashram Shala On 28th February, Child Help Foundation celebrated Science Day with 150 children at Vangani Ashram School, Palghar, Maharashtra. Students from tribal communities come to study here. The students witnessed and participated in many physics and biology-related experiments. They saw the "Refraction of Light through a Prism", as well as the 'Transverse section of an Algae' under a microscope. The teachers highlighted the importance of Science Day by telling the students about the contributions of the famous physicist and Nobel Prize Winner Sir CV Raman.
- Murbad Ashram Shala It is important for tribal communities who follow rudimentary practices to understand how science and technology work so that the students can develop themselves according to the need of the hour! On 28th February, 305 students at Murbad Ashram School became aware of the importance of science and how many famous scientists in the world invented and discovered theories and machines that help us run the world today. These students also participated in science experiments to get a practical insight on the same.







5. Odisha

Sana Bohu (Chhoti Bahu in Odia language), is an inspiration to all! When the majority of women in India leave their jobs and studies behind after marriage, Sana Bohu and her family are real change-makers. With the support and encouragement from her husband and family, she took the bold step to continue her studies! Currently, she is in class 10th of the Sahapur School, Odisha. With CHF volunteer's support, students at this school are getting the Quality education they deserve.



BABY FEEDING CENTER (BFC)





On 14th February, Child Help Foundation opened a new Baby Feeding Center (BFC) at General Hospital, in Ernakulam, Kerala. This would help lactating mothers to feel safe and comfortable while breastfeeding their babies which is very critical for a child's development.

To help individuals, all over the country, who have lost their jobs due to the pandemic, and have no means to support their families, Child Help Foundation has been working since the beginning of the pandemic to provide some relief to these individuals.

Unemployment has been on the rise and many families, with single breadwinners, are struggling to make ends meet. Our team has been working towards reaching out to as many families as possible. These families have expressed gratitude as CHF has been one of the first NGOs to support communities that are usually difficult to reach out to.

Our team has reached out to families living in Mumbai, Thane, Airoli Sector 19/20 (Maharashtra), Delhi, Odisha, Hyderabad (Andhra Pradesh), and Bengaluru (Karnataka). We have also reached out to families in Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan.


Mumbai

ZERO HUNGER









In the 2020 Global Hunger Index, India ranks 94th out of the 107 countries with adequate data to calculate 2020 GHI scores. With a score of 27.2, India has a level of hunger that has severe implications. According to this report, 14 percent of India's population is undernourished.

Child Help Foundation's Zero Hunger program ensures that no child goes to sleep with an empty stomach.

Our Roti Ghar initiative, in partnership with the Khushiyaan Foundation, feeds warm and nutritious meals to 1,800 underprivileged children daily. Many of these kids find it difficult to carry out daily activities like going to school because of health issues caused by undernutrition. In the last 3 and a half years of this program, 50 percent of these beneficiaries have seen an improvement in their health, and 70 percent of them have resumes going back to school.

CHF Volunteers conducted weekly Beach clean-up activities, thereby contributing to saving the environment. MBMC workers/staff also provided their support to the event. Many people from surrounding localities involve themselves as volunteers. During our beach clean-up activities, several college students had come forward to volunteer with us. Around 28,700 kgs of plastic waste was collected in the month of February.

Plog Run

On February 12th, 2022, Mira-Bhainder Municipal Corporation (MBMC) held a "Plog Run." A plog run is an important step toward achieving Swachh Bharat.
