The event was graced by the esteemed presence of Dr. Poonam Sharma, Independent Director of National Fertilizers Limited, who served as the Chief Guest.

The newly inaugurated Computer Lab is a testament to the NFL's commitment to offering hands-on digital learning experiences to girls between 9th and 12th standard. With the rapid advancement of technology, access to digital education is paramount in shaping the future of young minds, especially those from marginalized backgrounds.

The journey towards establishing the Computer Lab began in December with meticulous planning and preparation. The room underwent extensive cleaning and painting to create an optimal learning environment. By the first week of January, the furniture and computer systems were installed, marking the successful completion of the setup process.

The project aims to bridge the digital divide by providing girls with the necessary tools and resources to excel in an increasingly digitized world. Alongside the inauguration of the Computer Lab, a dedicated Computer Teacher was appointed in January 2024 to facilitate effective learning experiences for the students.

Expressing his enthusiasm for the project, Mr Shaji Varghese said, "We are thrilled to inaugurate the Computer Lab at Tailika Balika Vidyalaya, a significant milestone in our ongoing efforts to empower young girls through education. With access to modern technology and dedicated guidance from the Computer Teacher, we aim to equip the girls with the digital skills necessary to succeed in the 21st century."

Scarred Livers Places Pawani in Peril, Please Save the Young Soul

"We were so happy with the birth of our first child. Wishes came pouring from every corner of our family and everyone extended their blessings. But within a month, the joy that came with the arrival of the child perished in an instant. Misery and gloom clouded over our house, but the biggest fear was not knowing what would happen next to our child." Vineet Jain ; (Father)

It was a moment of joy when Vineet and Neha brought their newborn baby, Pawani, to their house in Ashok Nagar, Madhya Pradesh. But when the parents noticed little to no growth in the baby even after a month, they suspected something was wrong.

It was confirmed that little Pawani is suffering from Biliary Atresia with Failed Kasai Protoenterostomy (End-Stage Liver Disease). She constantly sweats and her growth is little to none. According to the doctors at Maharashtra's Nanavati Max Super Speciality Hospital (4.9 km from Bandra Railway Station), Pawani can only be saved through a liver transplantation.

Pawani's mother, Neha, has agreed to be a donor, only the funds are remaining. But the cost of the treatment is coming at Rs. 16, 50,000/- (Rupees Sixteen Lakh Fifty Thousand Only).

Vineet lives with a joint family. The family depends on the income earned from a betel leaf shop. But the shop doesn't generate enough revenue to pay the medical bills. Vineet has taken some help from his friends, but it hasn't been enough.

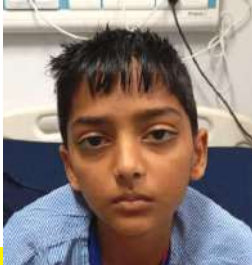

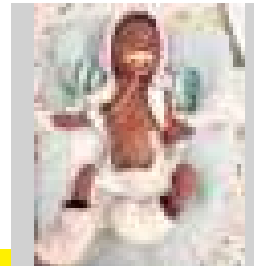

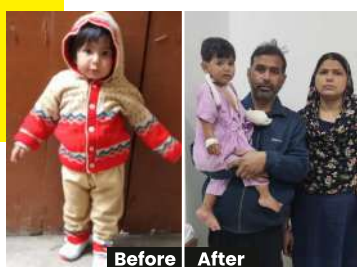
Hasmita

The Importance of Play Therapy For Children *Newsletter*

In childhood, where imagination reigns supreme and emotions run wild, the significance of play cannot be overstated. Play therapy, a specialized form of therapy tailored to children's unique needs serves as a powerful tool in nurturing their mental health and emotional well-being. In this blog, we delve into the importance of play therapy and its impact on children's mental health.

Understanding Play Therapy

Play therapy operates on the fundamental principle that play is the natural language of children. Through play, children express their thoughts, feelings, and experiences in a nonverbal manner, often revealing insights that they might struggle to articulate verbally. Play therapy provides a safe and supportive environment where children can explore, process, and make sense of their inner world. In general, there are two main types of techniques used by therapists:

Directive Play Therapy: In directive play therapy, the therapist actively engages with the child, guiding them through structured play activities to facilitate self-expression. This involves offering clear instructions and closely monitoring the child's participation throughout the process.

Non-directive Play Therapy: In non-directive play therapy, the therapist creates a more open and unstructured setting. Here, the child is encouraged to freely explore various play activities, allowing them to express themselves with minimal intervention from the therapist.

Techniques Used in Play Therapy

Play therapy encompasses a variety of techniques tailored to meet the unique needs of each child. The choice of technique in a therapy session is largely dictated by the child's preferences and therapeutic requirements.

Typically spanning 30 to 45 minutes, a play therapy session begins with the therapist establishing a secure and welcoming environment for the child to engage in play. Throughout the session, the therapist observes the child's interactions with the provided toys, gauging their expressions and behaviours.

As the child grows accustomed to the therapy space, the therapist gradually introduces more targeted play activities designed to address the specific challenges the child faces. Some widely utilized techniques in play therapy worldwide include:

On 9th February 2024, Child Help Foundation team went to Late Krantisingh Nana Patil Civil Hospital, Satara for the Inauguration program of Baby Feeding Centre. Mr Jugender Singh (Trustee-Child Help Foundation) and other volunteers of Child Help Foundation were present at the event.

There were several guests present for the program. Santosh Rokade (Superintendent, Public Construction Board), Dr Ravindranath Chawan (Dean- Chhatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj Government Medical College) along with other notable dignitaries.

Updates of Baby Feeding Centres

Child Help Foundation volunteers visited Baby Feeding Centres throughout February to inspect the quality of the centres. Centres at Kalyan Railway Station, Kurla Railway Station, Cama Hospital, Sir JJ Hospital, Urban Health Centre, Sir Atalbihari Vajpayee College and Pune Railway Station from Maharashtra were found to be well-maintained. Child Help Foundation also got appreciation letters from Palghar and Boisar Railway Station for installing Baby Feeding Centres. Additionally, three centres in Kerala namely General Hospital, Lakeshore Hospital and Chottanikkara Temple were also found to be well-maintained. Other centres like Andhra Pradesh's Vizag Railway Station, Karnataka's CV Raman Hospital, Bihar's Katihar Railway Station, Tamil Nadu's Institute for Child Health & Hospital for Children and Institute of Obstetrics and Gynecology were found to be well-utilized. However, Maharashtra's Kashimira Police Station had to transfer a lady police officer in charge of the Baby Feeding Centre which has impacted the usage of the said centre and the sofa at the centre at West Bengal's New Jalpaiguri Railway Station was found to be in miserable condition.

All the BFCs are functioning well. The utilization is good and looked after well by the hospital staff, the railway staff, and other caretakers.

Mini Science Centre Project Palghar, Maharashtra

At present, the Mini Science Centre Project is functioning in 4 schools in the Palghar District of Maharashtra. The project is supported by Samata Equal Footing. Mini Science Centre Lab is set up consisting of 84 models in each of these schools. The project staff and the school teachers are using these models for teaching the subjects of Science and Mathematics. The project is functioning in four schools- Sakhare, Pali, Murbad and Vangani Ashram Schools. Besides that, Child Help Foundation has started new 6 Mini Science Centres in Palghar at Talwada, Maan, Vinval, Kunje, Karhe and Dadade Ashram Schools.

The meeting was also conducted with the school headmaster – Mr Ramu Choudhary to take his feedback.

After that, Mr. Santosh was taken to the Silvassa in Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman Diu to visit some schools that were identified to install the computer labs. A total of three schools were visited, one from Silvassa and another two from Dadra. Apart from discussing the proposed project with the school authorities, the locations were reviewed where the school wanted to install the computer centre.

Mini Science Centre Project

The Mini Science Centre project is being implemented at M S Maur and M S Koyaribigha School, Barbigha, Bihar. The project is supported by National Fertilizers Limited, whereby lessons in Science and Mathematics were regularly conducted with the help of the models provided under the Mini Science Centre. The new teacher conducted lessons in Science and Math with the help of the models. She taught 18 models during the month. The students enjoyed the classes under MSC and prepared the models themselves.

As suggested by Mr Patil, the lab will be installed in a newly constructed building where the Marathi medium school will be relocated during the upcoming academic year.

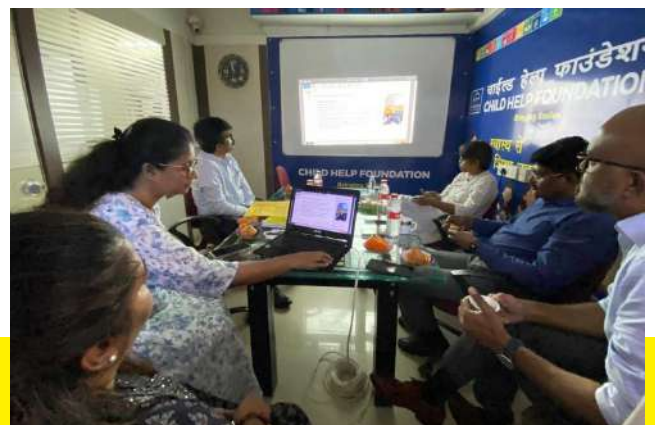

The ARSH project aims to address the critical issues of sexual and reproductive health among adolescent girls, specifically focusing on the challenges of child marriage and the lack of proper education on menstrual hygiene. By providing comprehensive SRH education, raising awareness about menstrual hygiene, and advocating for an end to child marriage, the project aims to empower adolescent girls with the knowledge and resources necessary to make informed decisions, protect their rights, and lead healthy lives.

ARSH Project Head Shilpa Lokhande visited 15 schools till February 2024 for monitoring and evaluation purposes. Also, awareness sessions on POCSO, Child Rights, MHM, and Male Female Attraction were conducted by Resource Persons Prof. Shweta Patil and Mr. Suraj Saple in various schools. To date, sessions have been conducted in Ozar, Nyahale, Zaap, Sakhare and Aina Ashram Schools in Maharashtra.
