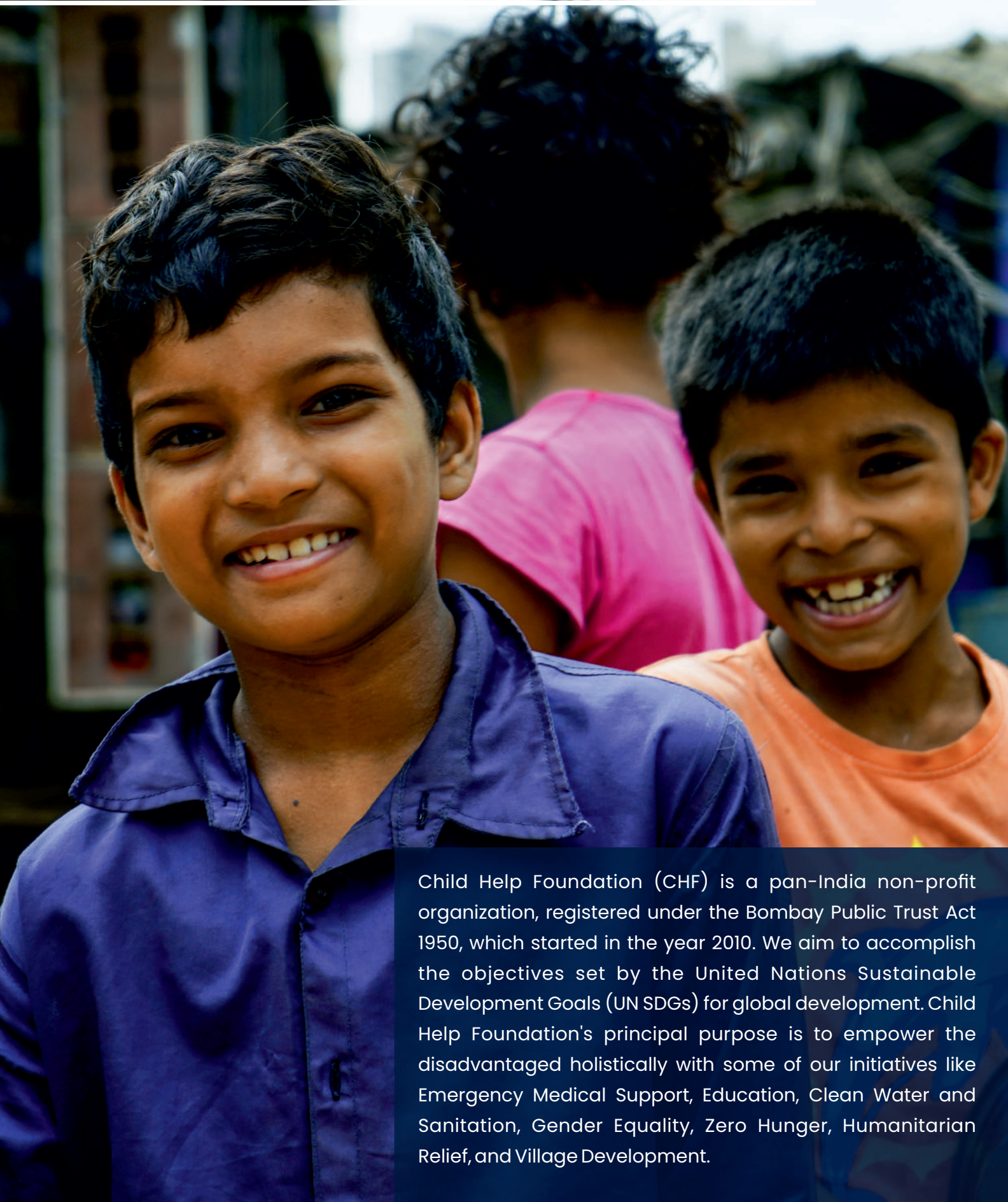
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About Us

CHILD HELP FOUNDATION LAUDED WITH THE 'BEST NGO AWARD'

Child Help Foundation (CHF) strongly believes that a clean and healthy environment will help the future generation to have a robust life. Since its inception, the organization has strived for a greener world, by conducting regular beach clean-ups, awareness programmes, and celebrations of 'No Plastic Day'. With its beach clean ups activities, Child Help Foundation has saved 2,08,77,780 marine lives.

On 20th May 2023, Mira Bhaindar Municipal Corporation organized a competition for Reuse, Reduce and Recycle (RRR) Activity. The activity began with an inauguration ceremony of RRR Centre in Mira-Bhaindar. The team of Child Help Foundation participated, which involved a donation activity of Old Clothes, Footwear, Toys, Books, Plastic Items, Utensils, Thermocol and Electronic Gadgets. Members of Child Help Foundation and employees of the commercial building, Sai Arpan, stepped forward and selflessly donated. These were then handed over to the MBMC Officials at the RRR Centre Mira Bhaindar and were given to the people in need.

Child Help Foundation volunteers even organized a Flashmob at Mira Road Railway Station to create awareness of RRR. The Flashmob was an enthralling visual display of singing and dancing, which succeeded in capturing the attention of the audience, as intended. An alluring and meaningful Powada; a traditional Marathi Ballad to

glorify or raise awareness of social issues, was performed at various locations like RRR Navghar Centre, Maxus Mall Bhaindar, and MBMC Head Office. The teachers of the Ashram Schools emphasized RRR Activity (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle) through their performance, enlightening the audience.

In the end, all the hard work by the organization proved to be fruitful, as they bagged four awards namely WINS (Women Icons Leading Swachhata): Best NGO, Best Performing NGO at RRR (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle), Best Performing Society and Token of Appreciation for Exemplary Contribution to Society.

Sanjana's Life is Shattering Her Dreams. Please Help Her!

Our active little Sanjana is spending her days in agony. My daughter is the smartest and bright child. She loves teaching and wants to be a teacher too. I want her to save her from the pain of suffering. Please Help Us!"-

Joshi V. and Ramya J. R. from Kozhikode, Kerala are waiting for their daughter to bounce back to life with full enthusiasm.

Sanjana a 10-year-old bright girl spends her days in the hospital and at home rather than learning in school. Joshi V. her father works as a driver but he has no fixed income putting up the miseries high.

Three months back, an irregular fever made her parents take her to the hospital. Upon consulting, the doctors of Aster MIMS Hospital, Kozhikode, Kerala, detected her with Fanconi Anaemia and requires a Sibling donor transplant. The estimated cost of the treatment is Rs.28,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakh Only)

The amount was a huge shock for the family, though their elder daughter readily decided to be the donor. With no fixed income, Joshi is tied up with financial constraints. Please spare as much donation as possible for Sanjana so that she can fulfill her dream to become a teacher.

Siya

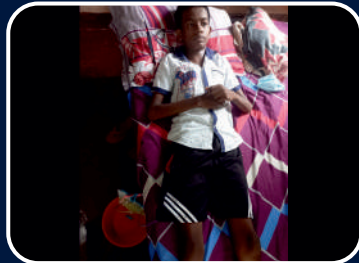

The joy that came with the news of the arrival of twins didn't last long. The preterm twins had to stay in NICU with the ventilator. The cost for the treatment was Rs.12,50,000/- (Rupees Twelve Lakh Fifty thousand Only). Though he managed to expense the treatment cost with the help of his neighbours, it wasn't enough. Thanks to Child Help Foundation and the donors who came in aid to help the twins of Nawaz. Now they are on the path of recovery.

Breaking the Chains of Addiction: International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking

Drug abuse is still one of the major hazards to society's well-being. One of the main problems that the world is dealing with needs to be entirely eradicated from society. Gokal, Mr. Rupesh Jadhav – Program Manager along with his two field workers were invited for the meeting. They were oriented on their projects which are run by them locally. The orientation on proposed activities which are planned under School Health Management Project was given by Mr Ravsaheb. The mock sessions were conducted by the team members on the same day on topics such as counselling, and HIV-AIDS to enhance their facilitation skills.

• Meeting with LTPCT & TOT on the subjects of Sexual and Reproductive Health, Early Marriage and Child Bearing, STI and HIV

On 8th June 2023, The TOT (training of trainers) was organized for the participants of the project volunteers on the subject of Sexual Reproductive Health, Early Marriage and Child Bearing and STI-HIV. The training was conducted by Dr Nimbalkar who works as a block health officer at Vikramgad, Maharashtra. He explained the subject using various training tools such as pictures and sharing personal experiences and stories. The discussion took place for a span of two hours. The LTPCT representatives Ms Supriya Kamble and Blossom Rodrigues visited the office. The team oriented them about project activities that were done to date and planned for future activities.

• Ration Kit Distribution with Transgender- 17th June 2023

On 17th June 2023, Ms. Chris Shenoy and Ms. Jyoti Kamble, CHF Project Team Members Welcomed Dr. Pierre Perez (MD of Servier) and 10+ Servier staff. The event was located in Mahim. The entire event was anchored by Ms. Jyoti Kamble with a welcome speech. Dr. Pierre Perez was honoured with flowers along with the representatives from the transgender community. Ration Kits were distributed to the Transgender Representatives followed by Medical Camp. Few of them were diagnosed with the disease, and prescriptions were given by the doctor for the treatment. The Servier staff appreciated the efforts of CHF and concluded the event. Overall, the event promoted inclusivity and ended on a positive note.



• Visit to Palghar Rural Hospital

On 19th June, Ms Jyoti Kamble, project team, member visited the Rural hospital in Palghar, Maharashtra to seek permission from the Civil Surgeon for the installation of the Baby Feeding Centre and also to finalize the place for its construction. A place was finalized which was beside the OPD area. Around 400 people visit the OPD every day and half of them are women, who can benefit out of this service.

• Visit to Baby Feeding Centre - Palghar & Boisar (Railway Station)

On 9th June 2023, Ms Sendra D'Souza, along with five volunteers inspected the Baby Feeding Centres at Palghar and Boisar Railway Station in Maharashtra. Both the baby feeding centres were found to be properly maintained, and regularly used by lactating mothers. They received positive feedback from the housekeeping department and station master.



• Visit Baby Feeding Centre-Kerala

On 15th June, Ms Jyoti Kamble along with a project team member visited the Baby Feeding Centre (BFC) at Urban Health Centre in Bandra, Maharashtra. During their visit, they met with the nurse in charge and the other OPD nurses. They also checked the book where they register the names of the beneficiaries. They learned that women coming to the hospital were actively using the BFC for feeding their babies and the BFC was well maintained.



Other BFCs are also functional, which are- CAMA Hospital, St Georges Hospital and Sir JJ Hospital. The utilization is good and looked after well by the hospital staff.

• Visit to GT Hospital

On 27th June, Ms Jyoti Kamble along with Mr Shashi Bhushan visited G. T. Hospital in Mumbai, Maharashtra. The purpose of the visit was to show the place for BFC construction to the representatives of the Alkem Foundation. They suggested changing the place outside the OPD entrance. Findings

- Comparing the school performance of the pre-covid (2018-2019) year, the school performance of the post-Covid year (2021-2022) with the school performance of the Academic Year 2022-2023, there is a significant difference. The percentage of the schools is remarkably far better after implementing the MOF project. Especially for the academic year 2022-2023 the school percentage of Vangani Ashram School is 100%
- Comparing the individual performance of students in the pre-Covid (2018-2019) year with the individual performance of the students for the Academic Year 2022-2023, there is a significant difference in the individual percentage after the implementation of MOF project, the percentage of students in for the academic year of 2022-2023 is significantly better.
- An improvement in subjects like English, Mathematics, and Science was observed
- Before the implementation of the MOF project, the individual performance of students was between 60% to 70%, but now after the implementation of the MOF project individual performance has increased to above 70%
- The individual performance of students in both Ashram schools for the academic year of 2022-2023 is significantly better after implementing the MOF project

Summer Vacation Supportive Classes

Centre for Excellence's project's teachers are regularly going to the various padas and villages to provide education to the village children. Currently, through summer vacation supportive classes, along with education teachers and volunteers are providing them with information related to various social and environmental issues. As per the feedback received from the students, they like to attend classes daily and are finding it very useful and helpful.

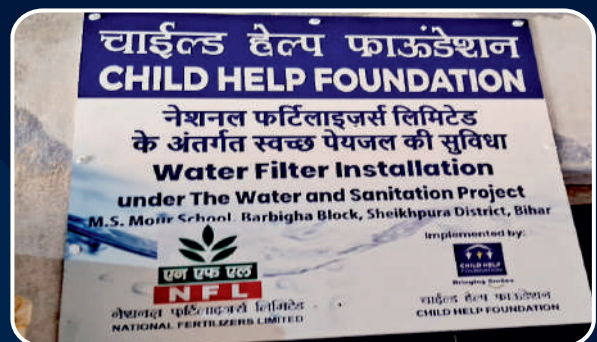
