Child Help Foundation (CHF) is a pan - India non-profit organization, registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act 1950, which started in the year 2010. Committed to the fulfilment of Child Rights as promised by the Indian Constitution and United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), CHF's principal purpose is to empower the disadvantaged holistically with some of our initiatives like Emergency Medical Support, Education, Clean Water, and Sanitation, Gender Equality, Zero Hunger and Humanitarian Relief.

CHF also works largely in bringing about a balance in society by taking care of stray animals under our Life on Land initiative and Beach Clean Up activities under our Life Below Water initiative.

Today, CHF is nationally recognized for its efforts to uplift the underprivileged in society. Our response is multi-sectoral based on reliable expertise and extensive groundwork. We have implemented multiple grassroots-level initiatives all over the country in 21 states.

Amongst many others, CHF has won various awards in 2019-20: The ET NOW - Rise with India Award for the Best NGO in Healthcare, Best NGO in Education for Girl Child, Best NGO for Cancer Prevention, Award for Dedication and Commitment from Tata Memorial Hospital, and the Dadasaheb Phalke International Film Festival Award for Benevolent Efforts in Social Welfare. In August 2021, CHF received three awards at the 7th Edition of National Awards. These awards were received for Best Covid -19 NGO for Community, Best Healthcare NGO of the Year, and Best NGO for Education for Girl Child.

We have offices in 12 cities including Mumbai, Thane, Pune, Delhi, Kolkata, Bhubaneswar, Hyderabad, Kochi, Bengaluru, Chennai, Gurugram, and Dimapur. We also have an international presence in the United States of America.

MISSION: Our Mission is to inspire and empower people into the culture of giving and bringing about a positive change in the lives of children and society.

VISION: Reaching out to marginalized children in need, empowering them, bringing smiles, and making them future-ready.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SUPPORT

Child help Foundation helps fund the treatments of children suffering from life-threatening, non-communicable diseases like Congenital Heart Diseases, Cancer, Organ Transplants, and Preterm Babies, amongst many others. We ensure that these children get the required treatment as soon as possible, and their families get the support they need throughout the treatment.

Baby of Subi

Baby of Subi is a 44-days-old baby girl, born prematurely, in the 7th month of pregnancy. The baby's father, Praveen Kumar is a daily wage laborer, and her mother, Subi is a housewife. Praveen is the only earning member in the family.

The baby is currently admitted to the Amrita Hospital, Kochi, where the doctors have suggested the baby be kept in the NICU for more than four weeks under ventilator care. The estimated cost of the baby's treatment is Rs.9,56,500.

Being the only earning person in the family, her father is unable to bear the expenses of his baby's treatment and has asked CHF for assistance.



EMERGENCY MEDICAL SUPPORT



Vaishnavi Khairnar

Vaishnavi is an 11-year-old girl of Mr. Dipak Khairnar (father) and Mrs. Manisha Khairnar (mother). Vaishnavi is the youngest and has an elder sister named Aishwariya (13). Her father is a farmer with a minimal income and her mother is a housewife.

Vaishnavi is suffering from brittle bone disease. She has undergone three surgeries of rod empanelment in various parts of her body. Her parents are worried about her illness. Her treatment is going in Ashoka Medicover Hospital, Nasik. She has to undergo a 4th surgery for the fracture in her leg. The estimated cost of her treatment and surgery is Rs. 2,50,000.

Vaishnavi's father, being the only earning person in the family, is not able to bear the expenses of his daughter's treatment. The family approached the CHF team in need of financial help.



Anvi Mali

Anvi is a 5-month-old girl from Sangli, Maharashtra. Her father, Mr. Sambhaji Mali works as a laborer, and her mother, Mrs. Shubhangi is a housewife. The family consists of 5 members.

Anvi was born with Hirschsprung Disease. Due to this defect, her large intestines were affected causing her problem in passing the stool. The cause of this condition is a result of missing nerve cells in the muscles of the baby's colon. Anvi has to undergo regular follow-ups and treatment for bowel washouts.

She has been suggested two surgeries; Soave-Boley modification that would cost Rs. 1,50,000, followed by Proximal diversion closure which would cost Rs. 1,00,000. The total estimated cost of her surgery is Rs. 2,50,000.

Anvi's father, being the only earning person in the family, is not able to bear the expenses of his daughter's treatment.



Shravani Pawar

Shravani Pawar is a 3-year-old girl from Kolhapur, Maharashtra. Her father, Mr. Sandeep Pawar is a construction laborer and her mother, Mrs. Swati Pawar is a housewife. She is the younger daughter and has an elder sister Shraddha Pawar (5). The family consists of 4 members.

A few months back, Shravani's parents noticed a bulging of her stomach. Concerned about her well-being, the baby's parents took her to a nearby hospital. She had to undergo numerous tests to identify the cause of her condition. Little Shravani was diagnosed with Wilms Tumor - a type of childhood cancer that starts in the kidneys. The diagnosis shattered her parents. On June 28, 2021, Shravani underwent surgery for the removal of her left kidney.

She was then suggested to undergo 18 cycles of chemotherapy of which she has completed 7 chemotherapy cycles. Her treatment is going on in Kolhapur Cancer center. The estimated cost of her treatment is Rs. 5,00,000. Her family is in dire need of monetary assistance and has sought help from CHF.

Baby of Manjula

The baby of Manjula is a baby boy who was born in the 8th month of pregnancy. Baby's father, Mr. Sagar works as a Driver and his mother, Manjula is a housewife. Sagar barely earns enough to support his family of four. Their baby had a low birth weight of 1.5 kgs and was suggested to be kept in the NICU for recovery. The cost of the baby's treatment was Rs. 6,96,500.

The family was not able to manage the expense of their child's further treatment as all their savings had already been drained for his treatment. The baby needed further treatment for which Sagar had requested Child help Foundation for help.

CHF was able to support the family in their hard times. The baby has now recovered and was discharged on 28th October 2021.

Aditi Waghmare


Aditi Waghmare is a 12-year-old girl from Solapur, Maharashtra. Her father, Mr. Pramod Waghmare works as a daily wage laborer, and her mother, Mrs. Reshma Waghmare is a housewife. Aditi is the eldest child and has 2 younger siblings.

Aditi was born with a congenital heart defect which was not noticed by her family until she was a few days old and would cry constantly. She was taken to the hospital where she was diagnosed with a heart defect. She was given medication by the doctor and was suggested to undergo surgery for her heart defect which would cost Rs. 3,72,000.

Aditi's father has been out of work due to the pandemic and was finding it very difficult to arrange finances for her surgery. He then contacted Child Help Foundation for support. CHF helped them raise funds for Aditi's treatment which went successfully. Aditi was discharged from the hospital on 29th October 2021. She is now gradually recovering.

Baby of Priya

Baby of Priya is a 3-month-old baby boy from Andhra Pradesh. His father, Mr. Bhanu Chenna is a farmer, and his mother, Mrs. Priya is a housewife. This baby is their only child.

He was born with a heart defect and also had very low weight. The little boy also suffered from respiratory issues. Worried about their baby's health, his parents took him to the doctor. Through multiple tests, his heart defect was diagnosed leaving his parents distressed. The child was suggested to undergo open-heart surgery and was shifted to the Rainbow Children's Heart Institute, Hyderabad. The estimated cost of his treatment was Rs.3,50,000.

Baby's father is the only breadwinner for the family and had urged CHF for support. Our team helped the family to raise funds for their baby's treatment. His surgery was performed successfully on 5th October 2021.

3. Palghar, Maharashtra

- On 21st October 2021, a training session was conducted in the Sakhare Ashram Shala for the coordinators of the Mini Science Center. Trainers from the Vikram Sarabhai Institute were invited for the same. There are 15 teachers and 675 school children benefitting from this project.
- On 22nd October 2021, the Mini Science Center was inaugurated in Sakhare Ashram Shala, Palghar. The center has been set up by Child Help Foundation with the support of the Samata Equal Footing Foundation. It consists of 79 science models, beneficial for the students of classes 5th to 10th. The inauguration ceremony was performed by Ms. Ayushi Singh (PO). After the inauguration ceremony, a live demonstration of the models was performed by the school teachers and students.

4. Nuh, Haryana

Child Help Foundation conducted a three days teachers' training workshop from 21st-23rd October for the aspiring teachers in the Nuh district of Haryana. 40 Aspiring teachers had participated in the training session

CHF volunteers distributed books to 240 children among six villages of the Nuh district in Haryana. These students attend "evening classes" to complete their education.



5. Dharmapur, Assam

CHF reached out to 80 children from the village of Dharmapur, Bongaigaon, Assam and distributed stationery kits. These children need regular support in education to motivate them towards completing their education and reducing school dropout rates.

PARTNERSHIP FOR GOALS



1. On 5th October, in partnership with **Motilal Oswal Foundation (MOF)**, CHF inaugurated the Centre for Excellence (CFE) Program at the Murbad Ashram Shala and the Vangani Ashram Shala in the Palghar district of Maharashtra. The event took place on 5th October and aims to benefit 1,200 students.

These tribal residential schools lack proper infrastructural facilities and with the CFE Program, we will provide them with proper resources to impart quality education to the students.

Child Help Foundation, with the support of **MOF**, donated a television set and a water purifier to the school. Three new teachers are appointed for English, Maths and Science subjects in Ashram Shalas in Murbad and Vangani.

The hospital was conducting a mega-vaccination drive, and we provided the medical staff with snacks to thank them for their relentless contribution to society.

HUMANITARIAN RELIEF



To help individuals, all over the country, who have lost their jobs due to the pandemic, and have no means to support their families, Child Help Foundation has been working since the beginning of the pandemic to provide some relief to these individuals.

Unemployment has been on the rise and many families, with single breadwinners, are struggling to make ends meet. Our team has been working towards reaching out to as many families as possible. These families have expressed gratitude as CHF has been one of the first NGOs to support communities that are usually difficult to reach out to.

Our team has reached out to families living in Mumbai, Thane, Airoli Sector 19/20 (Maharashtra), Delhi, Odisha, Hyderabad (Andhra Pradesh), and Bengaluru (Karnataka). We have also reached out to families in Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan.

In the month of October 2021, dry ration kits were provided to 31 beneficiaries. Apart from this, in collaboration with Roti Ghar, CHF provided cooked, nutritious meals to 1,800 individuals daily.

The CHF volunteers in Assam distributed food to more than 70 homeless beneficiaries in Guwahati. It was an overwhelming experience to see the happiness and smiles on their faces.


